Report Given

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 32 accidents on rural highways in Hale County during the month of November, according to Sergeant D. S. Lawson, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These wrecks accounted for one death, 16 persons injured, and an estimated property damage in the amount of \$13,715.00.

The rural traffic accident summary for this county from January through November shows a total of 201 accidents resulting in nine persons killed, 119 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$122,609.00.

The veteran patrol supervisor announced that every effort will be put forth including a rigid enforcement program, to try and stem the tide of traffic deaths

during the holiday season. We find ourselves confronted with the alarming fact that the past five year average indicates some 238 persons will be killed in traffic crashes in Texas this December. During the month of December for the past five years there has been 1191 traffic deaths. Of this number, 432 or 36% occurred during the holiday season. The sergeant stated, "It is almost certain that the death toll in traffic in Texas for 1963 will be the greatest on record, exceeding the all time record of 2611 in 1956."

The sergeant gave some tips for driving during the holiday season: 1. Know and obey all traffic laws, 2. Do not drive after drinking, and 3. Plan your trip so as to have rest periods about every 100 miles to combat fatigue. By complying with these tips, it will help you to arrive at your destination alive.

Commissioners Court Takes Notice Of Delinquent Taxes

The Hale County Commissioners Court handled only routine items in their regular meeting last week. Principal business transacted was the decision to close the courthouse Dec. 25-27 for the observance of Christmas. The courthouse will also be closed as usual on Saturday, Dec. 28.

The court delayed any action on the employment of Carter & Burgess, consulting engineers, in regard to clear zone right-of-way at Hale County Airport and also delayed action on proposed salary increases for county employees for 1964.

Both items, however, are expected to be brought up for discussion at the next session of the court. The commissioners will meet Dec. 20 at 8 a.m. at the courthouse instead of the regular fourth Monday of the month, Dec. 22. The date was changed because of its falling in Christmas week.

The commissioners approved the purchase of a new unit tax machine for the office of the tax assessor-collector. Only bid on the machine was from the Addressograph - Multigraph Corp. of Lubbock and was for a net \$9,862.05. The company requested that half of the amount be paid on Nov. 1, 1964 and half on Nov. 1, 1965, with no interest or carrying charges.

The court discussed at length with Bill Hollars, the tax assessor-collector, the matter of collection of delinquent taxes dating back to 1919. Hollars told the court that delinquent real estate taxes since that date amount to approximately \$40,000. He said bulk of the property consists of vacant lots in Abernathy, Hale Center and Petersburg.

Hollars suggested that tax attorneys be hired on a contingency basis to file suit for collection of the taxes. No action was taken.

The court approved the investment of some \$265,000 from various county funds in U. S. Treasury bonds. They also paid the monthly bills.

Pay Poll Tax Now

Hale County residents can pay their 1963 poll taxes now and avoid the rush, according to Bill Hollars, tax assessor-collector.

The taxes are being collected at four locations over the county—the Hale Courthouse in Plainview, Walters Mens Store in Hale Center, Maclon Agency in Abernathy and Kelly-Suits Agency in

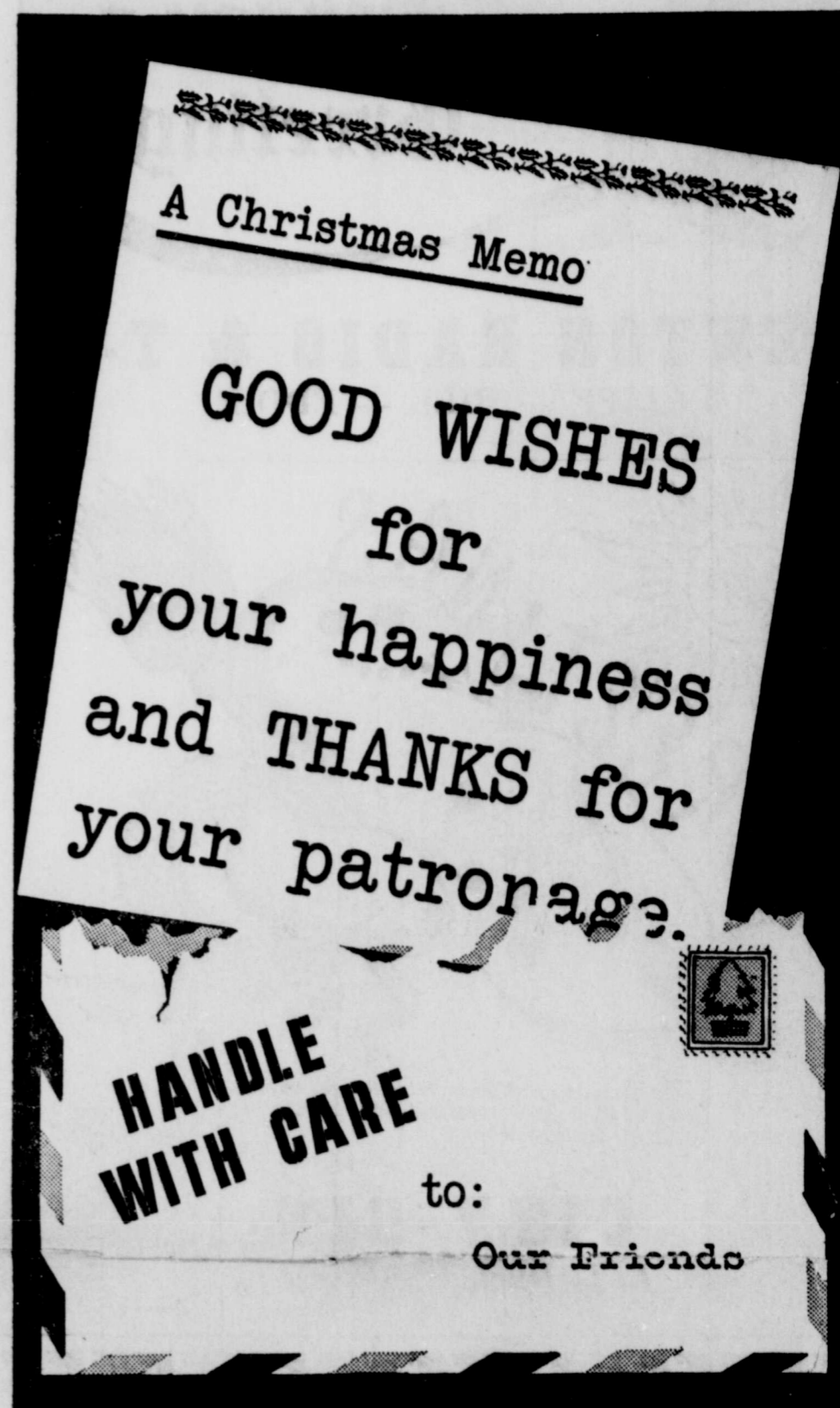
Petersburg. Hollars said he will also provide for additional collection sites during January. Holders of the 1963 receipts will be eligible to vote in 1964 elections.

Texas voters last month voted to retain the poll tax as a requirement for voting in local and state elections. However, an amendment to the Federal constitution, which now lacks ratification by only two states, would eliminate the payment of a poll tax as a requirement for voting in the election of officials on a

national level. Hollars said that in the event the amendment is ratified, persons who do not wish to pay the poll tax will be issued a free poll tax receipt, but it will bear information indicating its holder has not paid the tax and is eligible to participate in national elections only.

Persons not paying the poll tax will be unable to vote in local or state elections.

Report Given

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 32 accidents on rural highways in Hale County during the month of November, according to Sergeant D. S. Lawson, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These wrecks accounted for one death, 16 persons injured, and an estimated property damage in the amount of \$13,715.00.

The rural traffic accident summary for this county from January through November shows a total of 201 accidents resulting in nine persons killed, 119 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$122,609.00.

The veteran patrol supervisor announced that every effort will be put forth including a rigid enforcement program, to try and stem the tide of traffic deaths

during the holiday season. We find ourselves confronted with the alarming fact that the past five year average indicates some 238 persons will be killed in traffic crashes in Texas this December. During the month of December for the past five years there has been 1191 traffic deaths. Of this number, 432 or 36% occurred during the holiday season. The sergeant stated, "It is almost certain that the death toll in traffic in Texas for 1963 will be the greatest on record, exceeding the all time record of 2611 in 1956."

The sergeant gave some tips for driving during the holiday season: 1. Know and obey all traffic laws, 2. Do not drive after drinking, and 3. Plan your trip so as to have rest periods about every 100 miles to combat fatigue. By complying with these tips, it will help you to arrive at your destination alive.

Commissioners Court Takes Notice Of Delinquent Taxes

The Hale County Commissioners Court handled only routine items in their regular meeting last week. Principal business transacted was the decision to close the courthouse Dec. 25-27 for the observance of Christmas. The courthouse will also be closed as usual on Saturday, Dec. 28.

The court delayed any action on the employment of Carter & Burgess, consulting engineers, in regard to clear zone right-of-way at Hale County Airport and also delayed action on proposed salary increases for county employes for 1964.

Both items, however, are expected to be brought up for discussion at the next session of the court. The commissioners will meet Dec. 20 at 8 a.m. at the courthouse instead of the regular fourth Monday of the month, Dec. 22. The date was changed because of its falling in Christmas week.

The commissioners approved the purchase of a new unit tax writing machine for the office of

the tax assessor-collector. Only bid on the machine was from the Addressograph - Multigraph Corp. of Lubbock and was for a net \$6,862.05. The company requested that half of the amount be paid on Nov. 1, 1964 and half on Nov. 1, 1965, with no interest or carrying charges.

The court discussed at length with Bill Hollars, the tax assessor-collector, the matter of collection of delinquent taxes dating back to 1919. Hollars told the court that delinquent real estate taxes since that date amount to approximately \$40,000. He said bulk of the property consists of vacant lots in Abernathy, Hale Center and Petersburg.

Hollars suggested that tax attorneys be hired on a contingency basis to file suit for collection of the taxes. No action was taken.

The court approved the investment of some \$265,000 from various county funds in U. S. Treasury bonds. They also paid the monthly bills.

Pay Poll Tax Now

Hale County residents can pay their 1963 poll taxes now and avoid the rush, according to Bill Hollars, tax assessor-collector. The taxes are being collected at four locations over the county—the Hale Courthouse in Plainview, Walters Mens Store in Hale Center, Maclon Agency in Abernathy and Kelly-Suits Agency in

Petersburg. Hollars said he will also provide for additional collection sites during January. Holders of the 1963 receipts will be eligible to vote in 1964 elections. Texas voters last month voted to retain the poll tax as a requirement for voting in local and state elections. However, an amendment to the Federal constitution, which now lacks ratification by only two states, would eliminate the payment of a poll tax as a requirement for voting in the election of officials on a national level. Hollars said that in the event the amendment is ratified, persons who do not wish to pay the poll tax will be issued a free poll tax receipt, but it will bear information indicating its holder has not paid the tax and is eligible to participate in national elections only. Persons not paying the poll tax will be unable to vote in local or state elections. **Mail NEWS to The Review.**
