(4) Total acreage available for center-approximately 26 acres. (5) Cost of preparing building and grounds for stock show and other projected uses-\$204,000.00. This figure includes cleaning, painting, lighting, wiring, plumbpainting, lighting, wiring, plumbing, office space, rest rooms, open at 8 a.m. and close at 7 small meeting room, large arena for sales and judging and to be used for larger meetings, paving parking area, etc.

(6) The cost of retiring the bonds to finance the agricultural center at the proposed payment rate of \$20,000.00 per year over a 20 year period would figure out to \$2.11 for the average quarter section and \$1.22 per year for the average city home. However, the proposed band issue will not increase taxes. The increased valuations due to natural growth in the county will more than offset the annual cost of the proposed agri-
