

The Defense Department Monday reported that an Abernathy man, Marine Cpl. Raymond Stanley Joy Jr., was killed in action in Viet Nam. Joy, husband of Mrs. Dixie Lee Joy of Abernathy, previously had been reported missing in action.

Mrs. Joy said late Monday that she understood from a military source that her husband, the dodge. member of a U. S. Army Special Forces team, was killed near Ba To, South Viet Nam, on Dec. 16. United Press International reported last Thursday the massacre of three Marines and eight Vietnamese by a large band of North Vietnamese regulars on Dec. 16. All three of the Marines were attached to the Ba To Special Forces Camp, located 310 niles north of Saigon.


