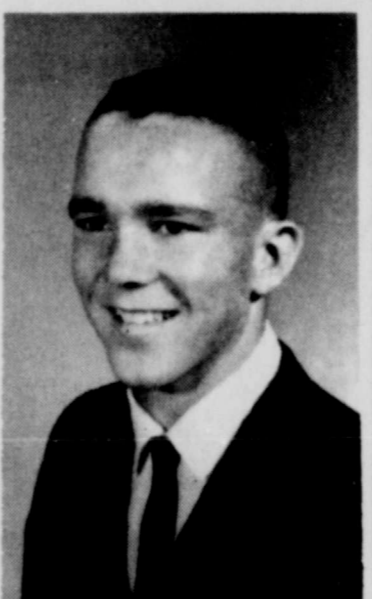

Medicare To Begin July 1st

Medicare, the new program of health insurance for the aged, begins on July 1, 1966, for all people over 65 who have signed up for it.

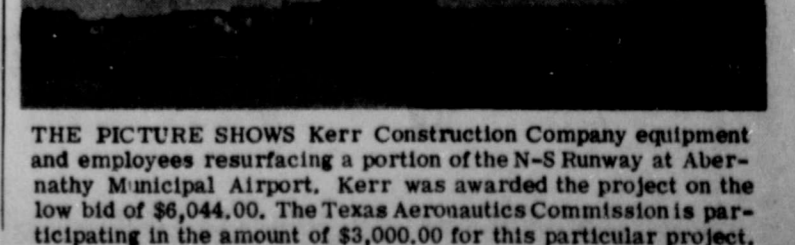
Many people are asking what they should do about their private health insurance plans. While this decision is a private one, Mencie King, social security officer-in-charge in Plainview, cautions: do not cancel any other health insurance you have until your medicare coverage actually begins.

This warning also holds true for people who become 65 in the future. If they apply for medicare in the three-month period before their 65th birthday, their coverage will not begin until the month they are 65.

King said that it is important that people approaching 65 do three things:

1. Obtain good evidence of your age well before your 65th birthday, so you will know when your benefits under medicare can begin.
2. Visit your local social security office as early as possible in the three-month period before your 65th birthday.
3. After you have established your age with social security, get in touch with the agent or company that provides your health insurance.

Your social security office, 1401-B West 5th Street, Plainview, has pamphlets that describe the medicare program. You may have one if you will drop by the office or call CA3-4371.

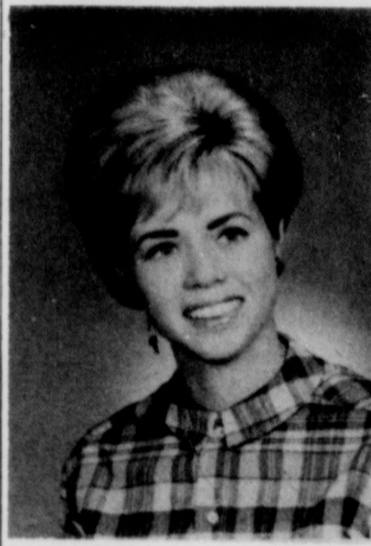

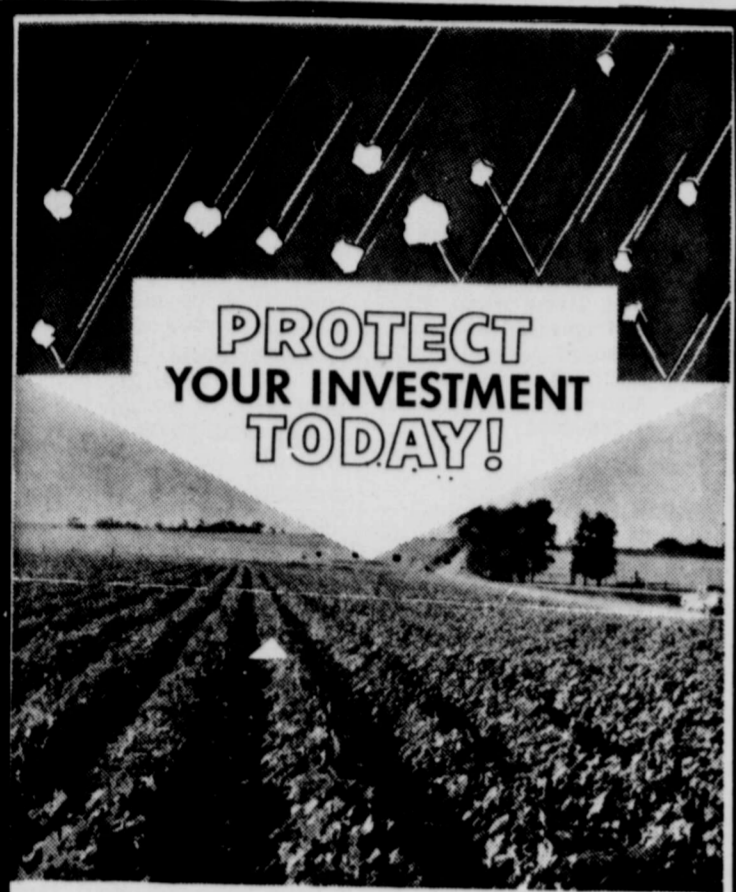
