ROLLING HOME DESTROYED AND PERMANENT HOME DAMAGED IN FIRE AT PINSON'S FRIDAY

Members of Abernathy Volunteer Fire Department faced a "first time" fire-fighting experience in the cold pre-midnight weather Friday. They battled in a partially successful attempt to save two homes belonging to, and used by, the same family. Lost was the completely self-contained rolling home of the David Ray Pinson family, and badly damaged was their conventional home, 702 15th St.

The fire in the garage house using the rolling home was discovered about 10:20 p.m. Friday by the Pinsons' next door neighbor north, Mrs. Fred Boone saw the blaze when she went to her kitchen sink for a glass of water before retiring. She called the fire department and her daughter, Joy, rushed to the Pinson home to warn them. "We were watching the news when Joy came in," Pinson said. Some of the Pinsons' five children were in bed but none were asleep. In addition to the Pinsons, an overnight guest was in the house, Johnny Rantz, son of Mr. and Mrs. Hilbert Rantz. And, one of the Pinsons' daughters, Kim, was an overnight guest of the Curtis Davenports' daughter that night.

Cause of the fire was believed to have been a heat lamp in an enclosed "breezeway" between the residence and the 2-story garage. The lamp was there to keep the Pinsons' dog warm. "The lamp either exploded or was knocked over by the dog."

SON-IN-LAW DIES

Wendell Bagwell, 40, Lubbock advertising man, died Dec. 4, in a Houston hospital following a lengthy illness. Funeral rites were in Ford Memorial Chapel, Lubbock First Baptist Church, and burial was in Resthaven Cemetery, Lubbock. He was a son-in-law of Mr. and Mrs. Virgil Halford, Abernathy.

Pinson theorized. The dog survived, unharmed.

The garage and contents were a complete loss and the west end of the residence was badly damaged.

The "rolling home" was a retired highway bus which Pinson bought in Amarillo from Continental Trailways. The 33-passenger bus had logged over a million miles on the run between Memphis, Tenn., and Los Angeles before it was sold.

It was the third bus which the Pinsons had converted to a rolling home. They began in about 1962, with a used school bus. Later, they bought a bus of the type used in cities, then the ACF-Brill from Continental.

Converting the buses to completely self-contained homes was a family project. They had made only one long trip in the one which burned. They went to Minnesota last summer. The bus was ample in size for the 7-member Pinson family, and on one occasion had "slept" 13 persons, Pinson said.

To the People of Abernathy,

There is a group of men in our midst who pose as ordinary family men most of the time, but when trouble arises, they transform into "super" public-servants, willing to leave their warm, comfortable homes, in the middle of the night, temperature at 17 degrees, to assist a neighbor in trouble.

Our home would have been totally demolished, except for the valiant effort of the Fire Department and our other friends who helped us so much.
