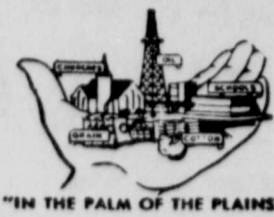

Abernathy Soldier Wounded In Vietnam

Abernathy has its third grim reminder that the United States is at war... a local soldier was wounded in Vietnam!

Mr. and Mrs. Wayne R. Arthur, 511 First Street, Abernathy, received word from their soldier son, Pfc. Jerry D. Arthur, that he sustained a stomach wound from a bullet March 31, while returning from patrol duty. They received a letter from him concerning the injury, than a telephone call from him. Jerry called from Clark Air Force Base, Manila, in the Philippines. When he called, Jerry did not know whether he would be hospitalized in Manila, sent to a hospital in Japan or be returned to a hospital in the States.

Pfc. Jerry D. Arthur, 20, graduated from AHS in 1965. He entered service August 24, 1966, and received training at Fort Bliss, El Paso, and at Fort Polk, La. He visited here during the 1966 Christmas holidays, and was back for a visit late in January, 1967. He went from here to San Francisco, leaving there Feb. 3, and arriving in Vietnam Feb. 5.

An earlier reminder that we are at war came in March of this year, when another Abernathy soldier was injured when his helicopter was downed in action in Vietnam. He is SP4 David Fargier, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Freeman. He was sent to a hospital in Japan. Mrs. Freeman reported Monday that they talked to David by telephone Sunday. He reported that he is doing fine and soon may leave the hospital in Japan. He did not know where he would go from Japan.

One Abernathy serviceman has lost his life in Vietnam. Marine Cpl. Stanley Joy was killed in battle action late in 1965, or early 1966. Word of his death was received here in early January, 1966.

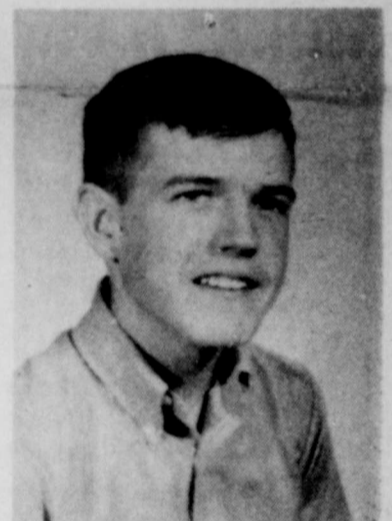

dent, Darrel Johnson. The banquet is open to the public and tickets can be purchased in the Business Administration Office.

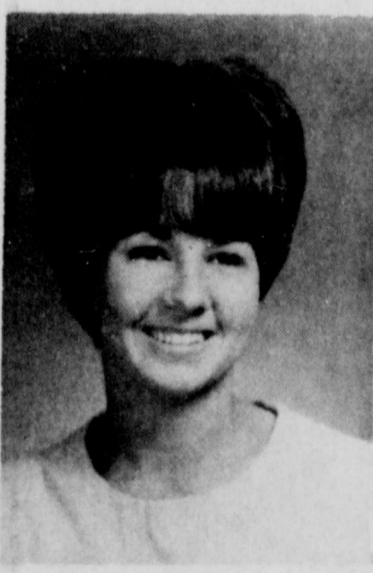
BROTHER DIES

ABILENE--Kickoff for the \$2.8 million Community Gifts Campaign of Abilene Christian College Design for Development was held Wednesday evening, May 3, at Abernathy Church of Christ.


The campaign in Abernathy began with the 7:30 p. m. showing of the film "Educating for Christ's Living." City chairman for the Community Gifts Campaign in Abernathy is Everett B. Maxwell. He is assisted by Delbert Beaton and Eugene Davidson.

The Community Gifts Campaign will be conducted among the alumni, parents and friends of ACC in more than 250 Texas cities. The effort will reach about 30,000 persons during 1967, seeking three-year gift pledges up to \$3,000.


The Design for Development, initiated in 1965, is a 10-year program to raise \$25.7 million for academic, physical and endowment expansion.

The Phase 1 three-year target of the campaign is \$10.4 million, and currently more than \$9.8 million has been raised. The Community Gifts Campaign is designed to help complete Phase 1 by its February, 1968, deadline.

Lubbock officials of the cooperative said the \$1,639,000 loan announced by Cong. George Mahon would be used to construct 247 miles of distribution lines to serve 1,950 new meters, 25 miles of high-voltage transmission lines, and two new substations.

The cooperative, which currently serves some 11,000 meters in parts of Lubbock, Hockley, Hale, and Crosby counties, represents a total investment thus far of some \$10 million. There are currently some 2,500 miles of distribution lines and 18 substations in the system.

Cotton Transfer Referendum Vote Is May 15-19

Growers in more than half the U.S. cotton producing counties can vote in a mail referendum May 15-19 on transfer of their cotton planting allotments.

The right to transfer--through sale or lease of individual farm allotments to other farmers in the state--must be approved by at least two-thirds of the growers of each county voting.

In previous referenda, such right has been approved in 412 counties.

John Martin of the Hale County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service said 5,000 to 5,200 ballots will be mailed to Hale County growers and their wives. Ballots will be mailed from the Plainview office in time for eligible voters to mark their decisions by May 15. Martin said.

In previous elections county voters have turned down the proposal to sale or lease allotments across county lines.
