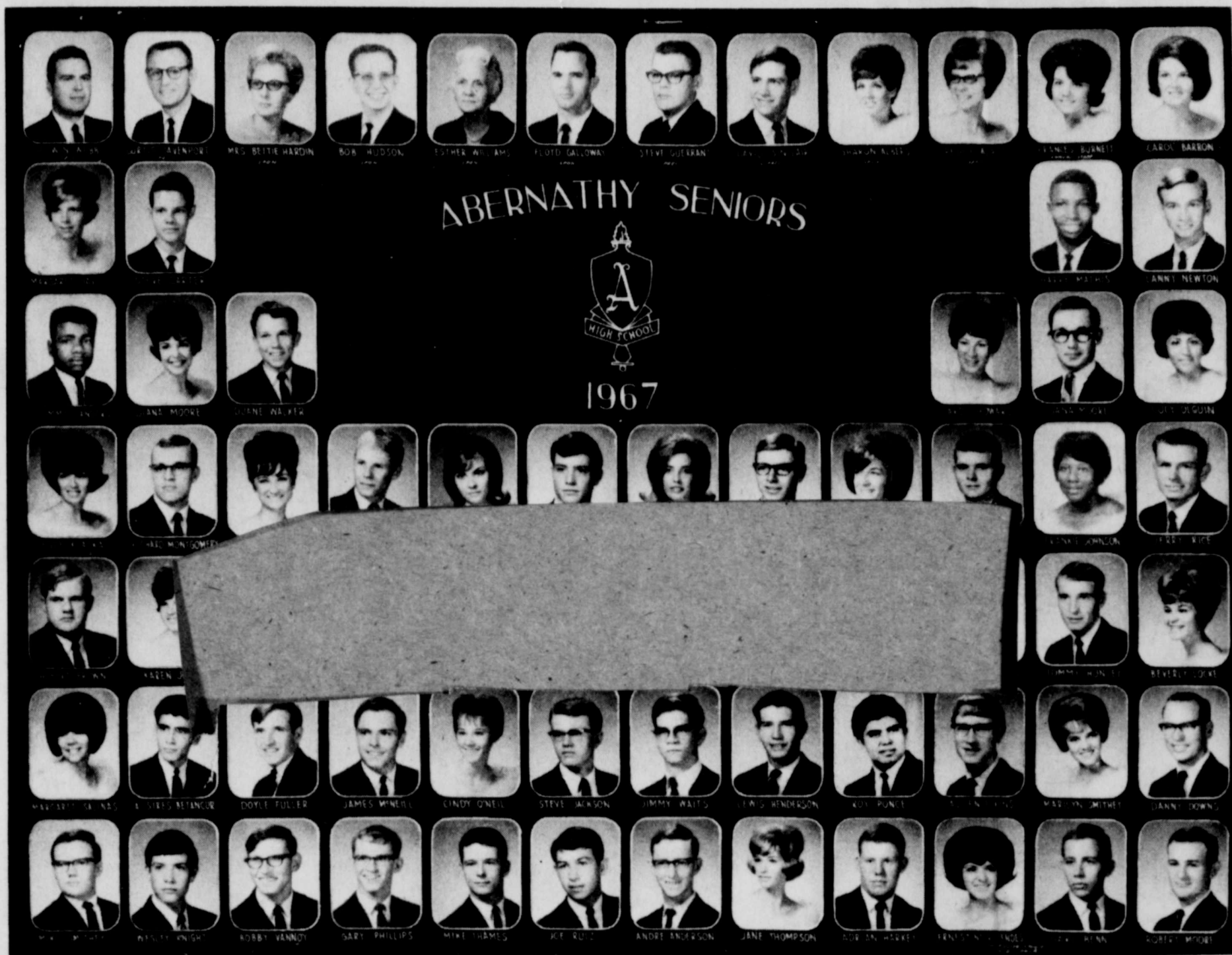

CO-OP GIN MEET HELD; COTTON CLUB TO MEET

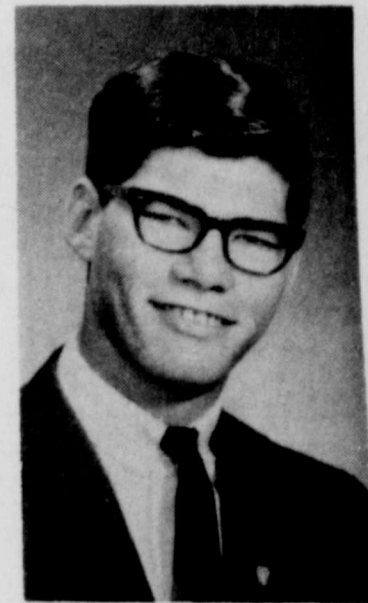

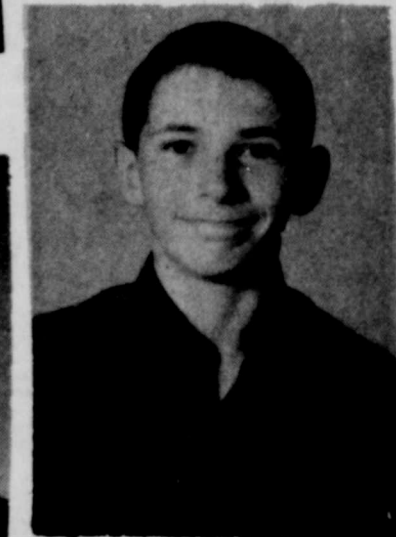

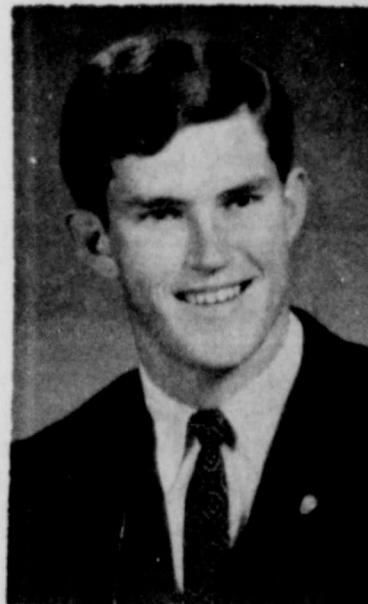

CITY COUNCIL HAS MONTHLY MEETING

The City Council of Abernathy held their Regular Monthly Meeting in the City Hall Monday, May 8, at 8:00 p. m.

The first business to be considered was the re-leasing of land to Abernathy Recreation Center. The Council agreed to lease the land for a five-year period under the same terms and conditions of the previous lease. After listening to a request for domestic water for the house at the Abernathy Recreation Center, the Mayor stated that the City Engineer had advised against making any water taps directly on the Airport line. The reasoning for this was the possibility of the formation of an air pocket in the line, which would cause the water to blow out over the top of the over-flow pipe or possibly damage the water line.

The next item for Council consideration was the appointment of a Board of Equalization for the year 1967. Kenneth Jones, H. L. Howard and W. A. Scott were appointed to serve on this Board.

The new markers will have white reflectorized letters and numerals on green background. The City Manager reported that he had contacted Wayne Smith of Hi-Plains Dirt Contractors and that he had agreed to seal-

coat and patch a portion of the streets in the Phillips Addition. The Council instructed the City Manager to check into the possibility of sealcoating and patching other streets in Abernathy that have bad spots.

Sokoll stated that the City may have to relocate and install some 200 feet of storm sewer that drains into the State Highway Dept. lake in South Abernathy. This is due to the beautification program of the lakes in South Abernathy. In other business, the Council instructed the City Manager to take bids on the purchase of a new shredder.

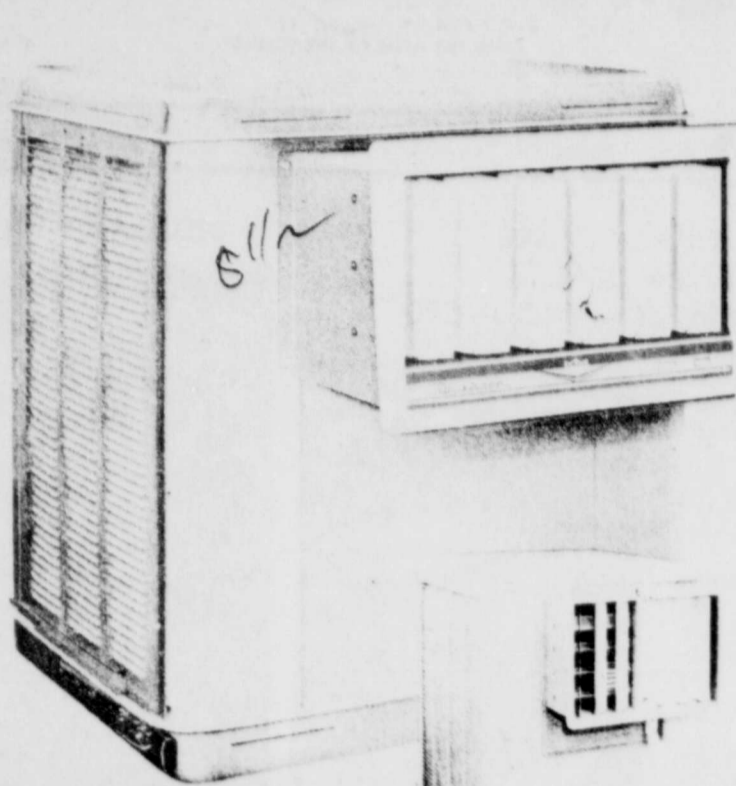

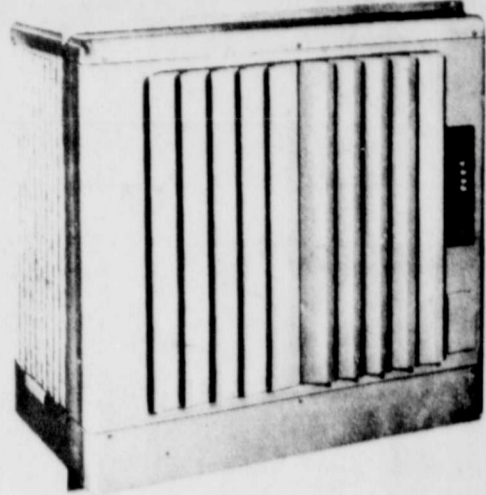

REV. LONG LEADS BAPTIST PROJECT

Baptist leaders in Lubbock, Lynn & Garza counties will co-sponsor with the 1,8 million-member Baptist General Convention of Texas one of more than 100 major conferences across the state introducing a 1967 Christian concept dealing with total stewardship from a family point of view.

Included in the new approach is a money management emphasis not only on what the family gives, but the wise use of what is kept.

Leadership and families in Lubbock Baptist Association, comprised of approximately 43,600 members in some 66 churches and 16 missions in the three county area have been invited to attend the Thursday (May 18) conferences at 7:30 p. m. in First Baptist Church, Lubbock.

Rev. Hubert Long, pastor of First Baptist Church of Abernathy, is stewardship chairman of Lubbock association and will lead in promotion of the area program through the year in addition to his work coordinating the Thursday night conference.

Overall purpose of the sessions is to introduce an effective approach for churches to implement 1967 materials featuring "a Christian family witnessing to its faith."

Two staff members of the BGCT Stewardship Division-- Cecil Ray and Robert Longshore, both of Dallas--and administrative leaders of Lubbock association also are scheduled to lead in the meeting, which includes two 7:30--8:30 p. m. sessions.

1967 "family witness" materials will be introduced in the meeting of all pastors, music education directors and staff members in the leadership conference. period also will be given study of church budgets, management and tithe, will-making and estate planning.

In a simultaneous session, individuals and family groups will examine the matter of Christian witness in spending, giving and ownership. Dr. W. M. Turner of Lubbock, area missionary, and Rev. D. L. Lowrie, pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in Lubbock and associational moderator, will preside.

Major thrusts of the conference will come in a joint worship service at 8:30 p. m. with presentation of the new materials and showing of a noted convention filmstrip "The Money Trap." Dr. Patterson's special message, "The Family Bearing Witness to its Faith," will conclude the conference.

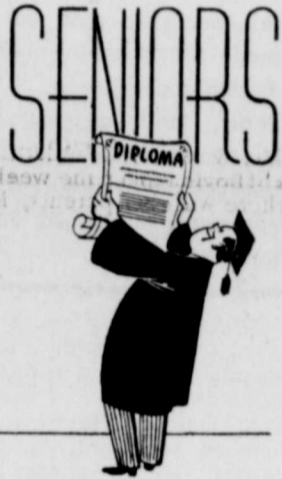

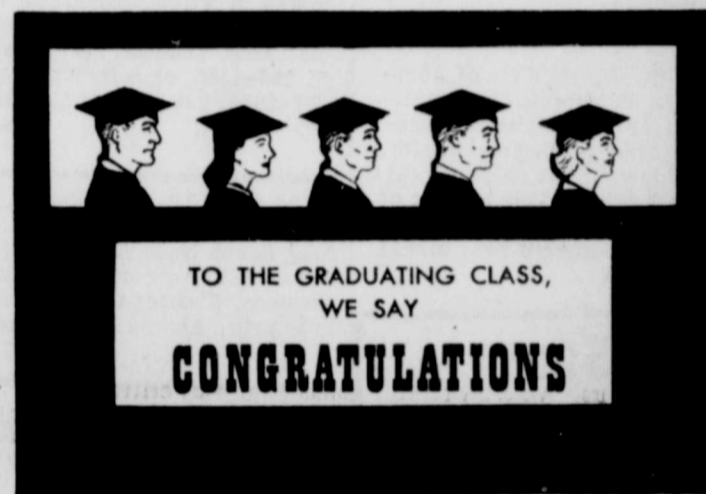

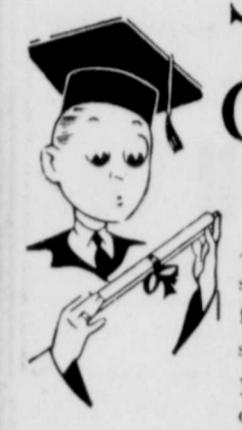
