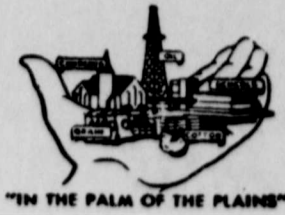

## FUNERAL HELD FOR MOTHER OF MRS. LANSDON

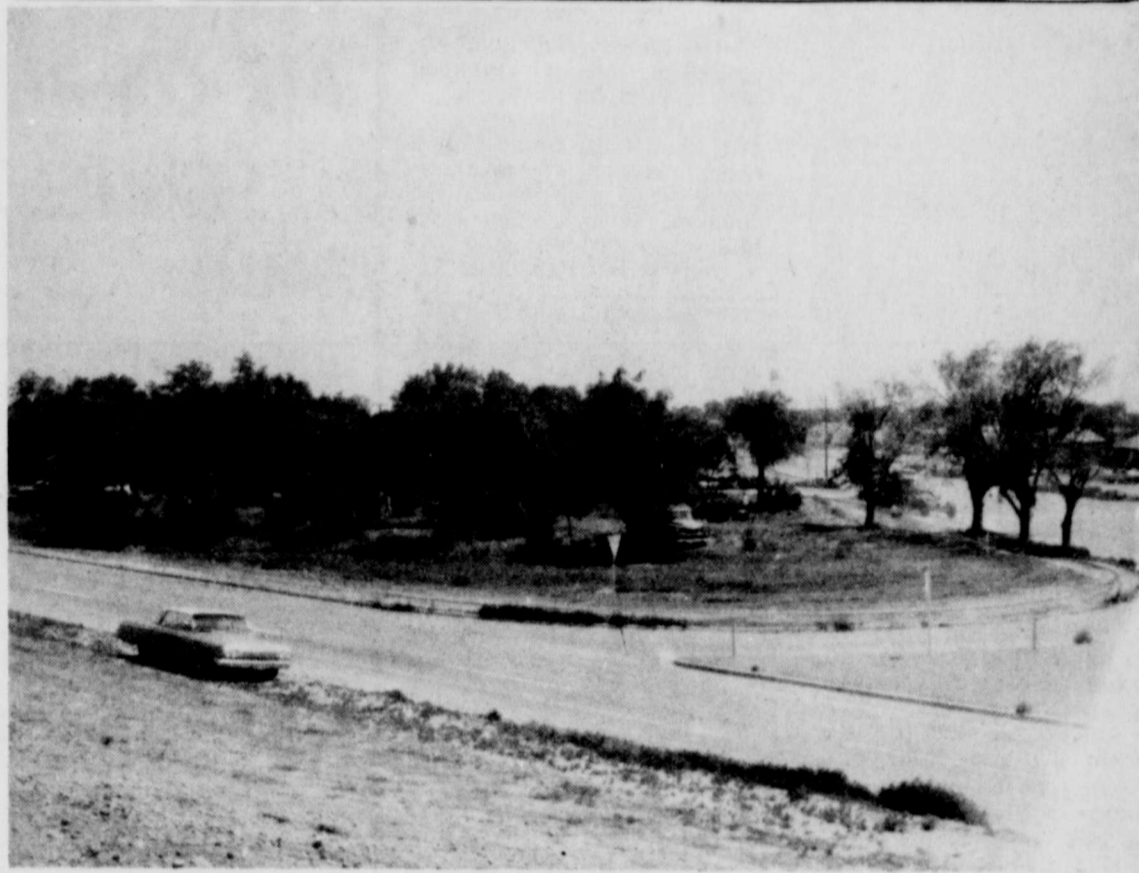
Funeral services were held in Marlow, Oklahoma for Mary Bell, mother of Mrs. Mallisa Lansdon of Abernathy.

## Aerial Spraying To Kill Mosquitoes

There will be fewer mosquitoes in Abernathy this week following aerial spraying of malathion insecticide by a specially equipped U. S. Air Force cargo plane.

Judge C. A. Abernathy said this week that the Air Force plane will be in Hale County for seven weeks to carry out weekly aerial spray programs in both Abernathy and Plainview.

Hale Center is also slated for aerial spraying, with two treatments scheduled in July.

While the spraying is directed at the encephalitis-transmitting mosquito known as Culex tarsalis, Judge Abernathy emphasized that there was no epidemic of this disease here. "Fortunately, we have been free of this disease so far this year", Judge Abernathy noted.

Abernathy has had cases of mosquito-borne encephalitis in past years.

Judge Abernathy said the research study is expected to provide much needed information on protection of the population from disease-carrying mosquitoes.

The announcement from Judge Abernathy noted that the aerial spraying is done by the 4500th Special Aerial Flight Group, Tactical Air Command, with headquarters at Langley Air Force Base in Virginia.

"This is the same group that provide the effective mosquito control last summer during the epidemic of St. Louis encephalitis in Dallas," Judge Abernathy said. "They have aerial spraying as their primary mission and during 10 years of operation have not had a major mishap."

The Air Force plane now in Abernathy and Plainview is equipped to spray concentrated malathion insecticide at a rate of only 3 ounces per acre. In order to get ideal coverage with the insecticide the plane flies at an altitude of approximately 150 feet. Spraying is done in the early morning hours to take advantage of minimum wind conditions.

Malathion is one of the safest of all known insecticides, Judge Abernathy noted, adding that the dosage, as applied, is harmless to humans, as well as fish and wildlife.

One of the fringe benefits to citizens resulting from this research project will be better control of all kinds of mosquitoes as well as flies and other annoying insects.

Participants in this research study include Hale County and two selected cities, the Texas State Department of Health, the U. S. Air Force, and the National Communicable Disease Center of the U. S. Public Health Service.

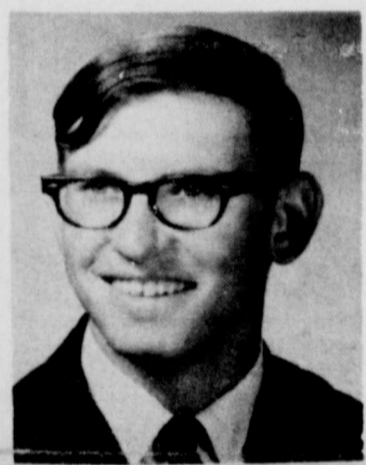
## New Event Scheduled For Bar-None Rodeo

## MRS. BETTYE MARTIN ATTENDS BIOLOGY INSTITUTE

Mrs. Bettye Martin, Abernathy High School biology teacher, and a host of secondary school teachers of biology from 19 states and two foreign countries are participating in an institute in biology which runs through August 4 at the University of Oklahoma.

The institute, supported by a \$72,280 grant from the National Science Foundation, offers the 69 participants opportunity to develop increased subject-matter background, achieve greater competence as teachers and attain additional levels of qualifications. Institute enrollees may work toward a master's degree.

A special feature of the institute is a seminar in high school biology, a course required of all participants. The seminar deals with recent advances in biology, and the subject matter is presented by selected guest lecturers within specialized areas of biology.

Other courses available to participants, who enroll for not less than six and not more than eight credit hours, include three-hour courses in organic chemistry, the history of science since 1700, plant kingdom and the taxonomy of vascular plants and a four-hour course in the natural history of invertebrates.

Institute director is Dr. Doyle E. Anderson, chairman of OU's department of Botany and Microbiology and associate professor of botany.

## Water Importation Group Sets Up Dues

Membership dues to finance the operation of Water, Inc., recently formed organization to facilitate imported irrigation water to West Texas, Eastern New Mexico and Oklahoma, were set Tuesday during the initial executive committee meeting.

General minimum annual membership dues were set at \$25. Other dues were set according to investments, capital stock, etc. of individual members and corporations.

Farmers, ranchers and landowners dues were set on a per-acre basis. Irrigated farm lands dues will be 10 cents per acre; non-irrigated farm lands, five cents per acre and rangeland, two cents per acre.

## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY ACCIDENT REPORT

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 22 accidents on rural highways in Hale County during the month of May, according to Sergeant Thurman Keffer, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in 15 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$18,310.00.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first five months of 1967 shows a total of 71 accidents resulting in no persons killed, 37 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$46,250.00.

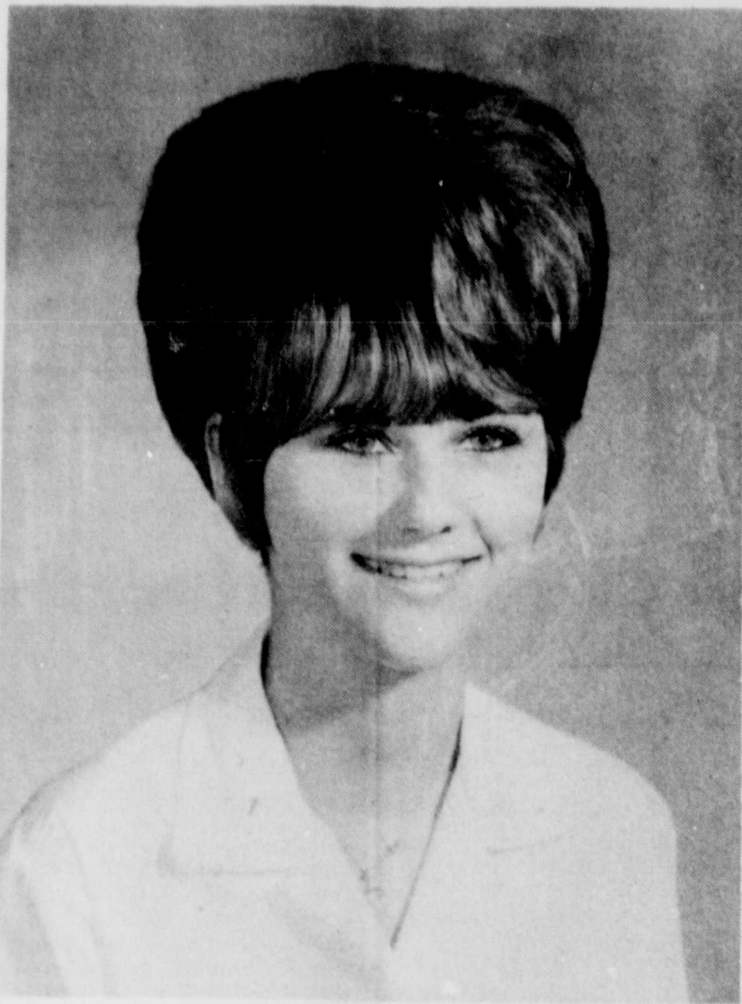

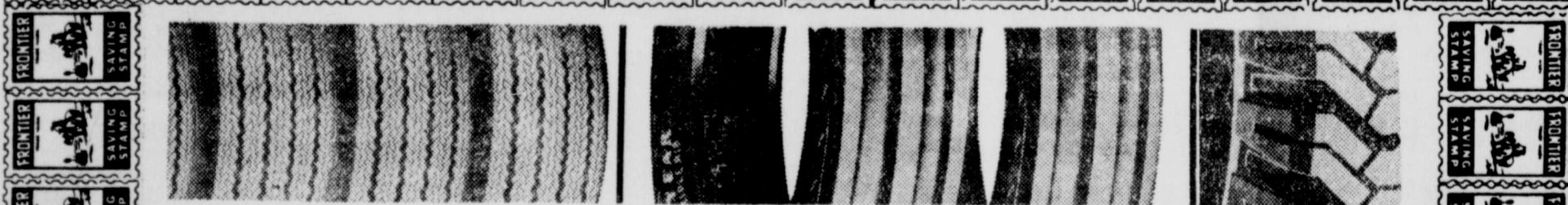
