### Delwin Webb Gets Doctorate

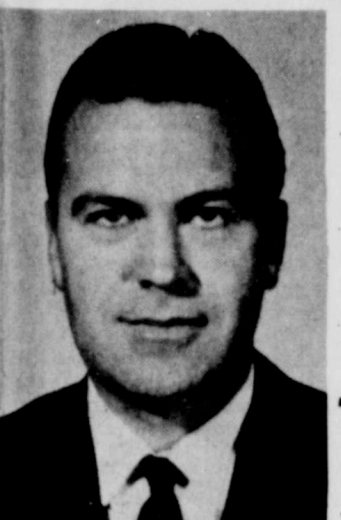
Twenty-three doctorates, the largest number ever to be awarded at a single ceremony, were conferred at Texas Tech's summer commencement exercises Saturday, August 26, said Graduate Dean Fred D. Rigby.

Among the 23 awarded the doctorate degree was Robert Delwin Webb, Superintendent of the Abernathy Public Schools. He received the Doctor of Education degree.

Superintendent Webb received his Bachelor of Science degree from Tech in 1949, and his Master of Science degree in Education in 1950. He is beginning his fifth year as superintendent of the Abernathy School system.

Dr. Rigby said this will bring the total number of doctorates for the year to 30, also a record, as seven doctor's degrees were awarded at the June exercises. The previous high for a single commencement was 14 in August 1964.

**Birth Certificate**  
Jerry Moorhead, principal of Abernathy Elementary School, announced that all first grade students enrolling must have a certified birth certificate before entering school.

A hospital birth certificate cannot be accepted as a certified birth certificate. The certified birth certificate may be obtained at the Lubbock County, or if they were born in another county, you may get the certificate from the County in which they were born.

**Vaccination Certificate**  
Also, all students enrolling in school must have a small-pox vaccination certificate.

**Watch For School Buses**  
"School days" are almost here again. The familiar yellow school buses will soon be back on the highways. The Sergeant reminds all motorists of the State Law regulating traffic in regard to school buses. The drivers of a vehicle upon a highway outside the limits of any incorporated city or town upon meeting or overtaking on either direction any school bus which has stopped on the highway for the purpose of receiving or discharging school children shall stop the vehicle immediately before passing the school bus, but may then proceed past such school bus at a speed which is prudent, not exceeding (10) miles per hour, and with due caution for the safety of such children.

### Adult Education Classes Offered

Adult education classes will be provided if there is a need. The school has a special grant to provide for two teachers for the functionally illiterate. This includes people who have not attended school or people who have less than a sixth grade education. This will be primarily a reading class, 120 hours in length at no charge. All books and material needed will be furnished through the grant.

Other adult classes will be taught at night during the school term if enough interested persons can attend. Any course will be offered on any subject if as many as 10 people register. Each subject will be for a full semester and a \$15.00 tuition charge will be made for each course studied.

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
Proposed **CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
NUMBER ONE ON THE BALLOT

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 9. That Section 9, Article VIII, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows: "Section 9. The State tax on property, exclusive of the tax necessary to pay the public debt, and of the taxes provided for the benefit of the public free schools, shall never exceed Thirty-five Cents (35¢) on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) valuation; and no county, city or town shall levy a tax rate in excess of Eighty Cents (80¢) on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) valuation in any one (1) year for general fund, permanent improvement fund, road and bridge fund and jury fund so long as the Court does not impair any outstanding bonds or other obligations and so long as the total of the foregoing tax levies does not exceed Eighty Cents (80¢) on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) valuation in any one (1) year. Once the Court has levied the annual tax rate, the same shall remain in force and effect during that taxable year; and the Legislature may also author-

ize an additional annual ad valorem tax to be levied and collected for the further maintenance of the public roads; provided, that a majority of the qualified property taxing voters of the county voting at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax, not to exceed Fifteen Cents (15¢) on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) valuation of the property subject to taxation in such county. Any county may put all tax money collected by the county into one general fund without regard to the purpose or source of each tax. And the Legislature may pass local laws for the maintenance of the public roads and highways, without the local notice required for special or local laws. This Section shall not be construed as a limitation of powers delegated to counties, cities or towns by any other Section or Sections of this Constitution."

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on November 11, 1967, at which election all ballots shall have printed on them the following: "FOR the constitutional amendment allowing counties to put all county taxes into one general fund." "AGAINST the constitutional amendment allowing counties to put all county taxes into one general fund."

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
Proposed **CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
NUMBER FOUR ON THE BALLOT

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding a new Section in Article III to be known as Section 52e, reading as follows: "Section 52e. Each county in the State of Texas is hereby authorized to pay all medical expenses, all doctor bills and all hospital bills for Sheriffs, Deputy Sheriffs, Constables, Deputy Constables and other county and precinct law enforcement officials who are injured in the course of their official duties; providing that while said Sheriff, Deputy Sheriff, Constable, Deputy Constable or other county or precinct law enforcement official is hospitalized or incapacitated that the county shall continue to pay his maximum salary; providing, however, that said payment of salary shall cease on the expiration of the term of office to which such official was elected or appointed. Provided, however, that no provision contained herein shall be construed to amend, modify, repeal or nullify Article 16, Section 31, of the Constitution of the State of Texas."

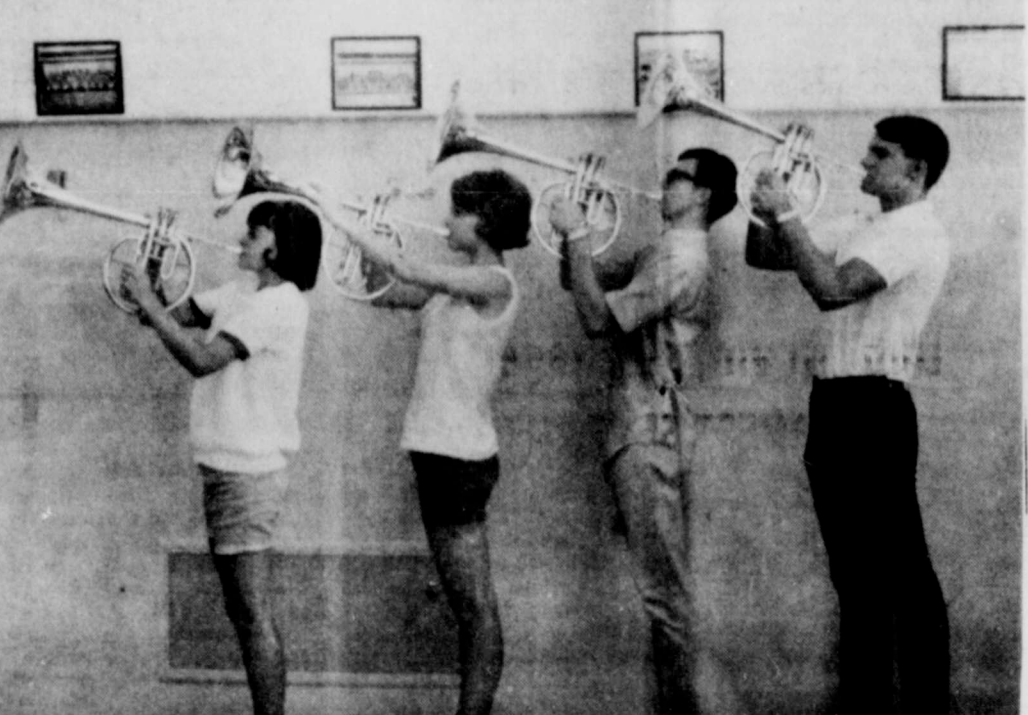

A reception in the church followed the ceremony, after which the couple left for a wedding trip to Dallas and Six Flags. They will reside in Crosbyton.

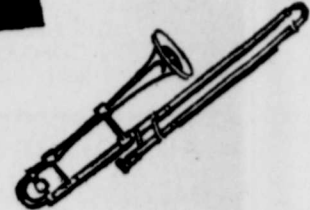
