The first order of business was the opening of sealed bids on the leasing of the Airport and Sewer Disposal Plant Farms. The Council awarded the sewer farm lease to L.J. Kitchens, who bid \$1,000 per annum for a three-year term. Fred Crenshaw was awarded a three-year cash lease on the airport farm for \$2,761.00 annually.

The featured speaker at the District 2 4-H Club Gold Star Banquet took one look Tuesday night at the 40 teenagers representing the cream of the region's 4-H Club crop and said "this is the type of thing we oughta bottle up and send to Dr. Timothy Leary, the LSD promoter."

At a time when bearded beats who burn flags and draft cards while living it up with the aid of assorted drugs "get into the spotlight because of their audacity," Americans should remember that "young people like these 4-H'ers are the norm," asserted advertising executive Jim Wiggins of San Antonio.

Speaking to more than 450 persons attending the tenth annual district Gold Star banquet

## Yields Lower

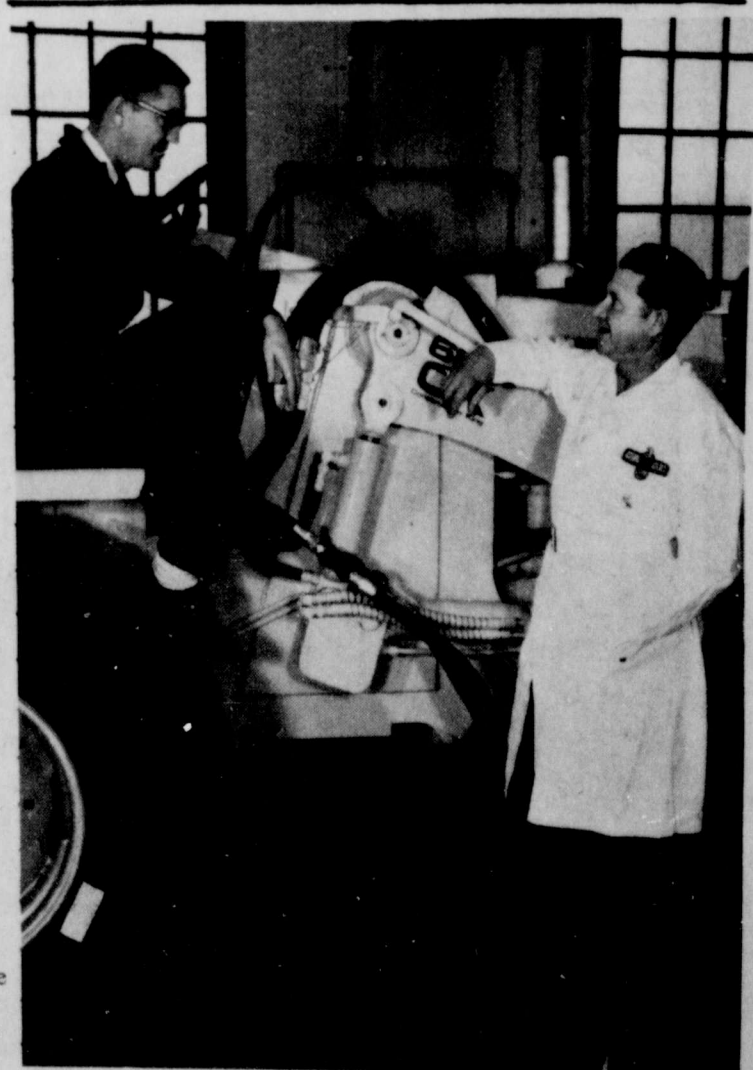
Because growers compared full in the 1967 cotton program and because of abnormal weather conditions and insect infestation, cotton acreage and yields for 1967 were substantially below last year's, and the upland crop will total only a little over 8 million bales. Since domestic usage and exports during the marketing year are expected to exceed the small 1967 crop, the carryover by Aug. 1, 1968, is expected to fall to about seven million bales. Stokes said.

Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman recently praised cotton farmers for the "magnificent job" they have done in whittling down the huge supply of cotton to a stock of manageable size in the short period of two years. Now, he said, the challenge is to produce the right kind of cotton and to keep balance. The 1968 program has been designed to produce sufficient cotton to meet expected demand and to encourage the production of a higher percentage of the medium and longer staple lengths. For 1968, Stokes said, Hale County has a total of 137,777 acres available for allotment to growers of upland cotton.
