## THREE QUALIFY FOR EAGLE SCOUT RATING

Fritz Struve, 16 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. R. R. Struve, has become the first Eagle Scout from Abernathy in at least 25 years. Ruwayne Struve, his 14 year old brother, and Tim Hill, 13 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Hill, also of Abernathy, have completed requirements for the Eagle rank, also. All three boys passed the district board of review Thursday night, March 14 in Lubbock. All three boys are members of the Order of the Arrow, an honorary fraternity in scouting. They were tapped for this honor last summer at Tres Ritos, N.M., scout camp. Fritz is serving as secretary of the Arrowhead Clan at present. Claudie Williams is also a member of the Order of the Arrow.

The requirements for the Eagle rank are very rigid. The boys must earn 21 merit badges, complete six months as a Life Scout, participate in a community project and conservation project while a Life Scout, show leadership ability in home, school, church, and community. With the Eagle rank comes added responsibility to God and man.

Much of the credit for the success in reaching this mile stone in their scouting careers goes to the scoutmasters Mr. Verlin Barton and Mr. Gean Nunn, and to the boy's parents who have given them help, inspiration, and guidance from the Cub Scout days until now.

Fritz has earned every rank in Cub Scout and Boy Scout programs. He and Ruwayne plan to participate in a scouting program on through college. Fritz will receive the Eagle Award at the Court of Honor on April 28 in Lubbock. Ruwayne and Tim will receive their awards at the next Court of Honor.

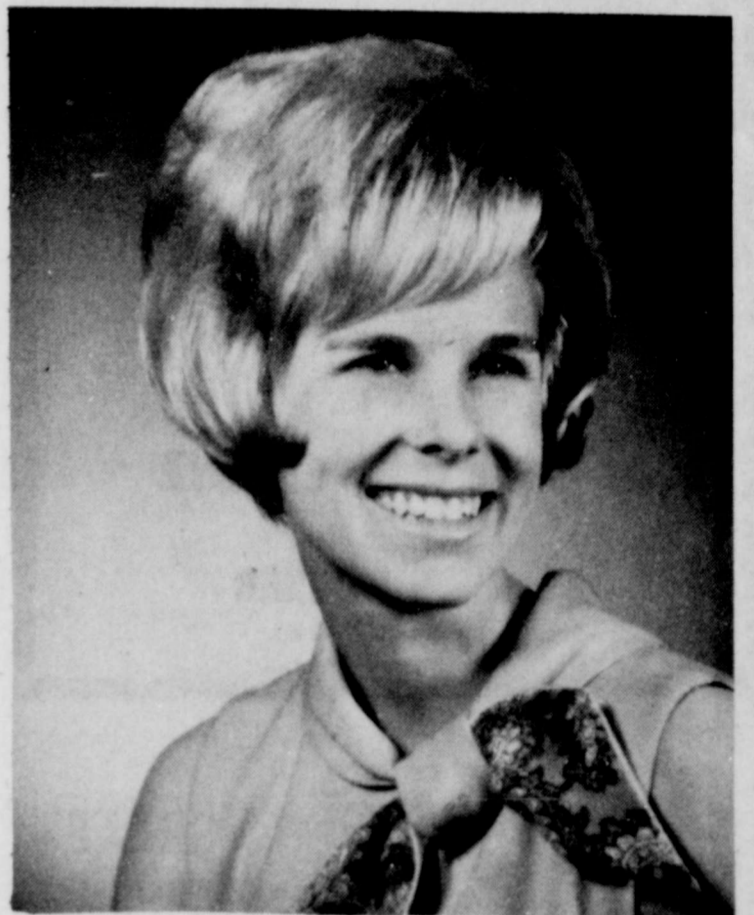
Boney will be seen around in an entirely different business from what he has been in for the past several years here. Matthews will continue the business as is with the added service of a mechanic.

## MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The Abernathy City Council met in regular session Tuesday, March 12, 1968, at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Roy E. Jones; Aldermen Lee Echols, L. G. Deering, Joe Chambers and Royce Henison.

Absent: Councilman Ralph Wolf.

The minutes of the previous council meeting were read and approved as read.

Representatives of the Federal Aviation Administration, Farmers Home Administration and Abernathy Recreation Center discussed the possibility of a long term lease of 78.9 acres of land for the purpose of the ARC obtaining a long-term loan to do necessary improvements at the golf course.

City Attorney Malcolm Tisdell explained that the F. A. A. and F. H. A. could not reconcile their differences regarding standard provisions and that an impasse had been reached that would not allow the long term lease and long term loan to come about.

Tisdell stated that the only alternative left to the city would be to sell the 78.9 acres to the ARC at its fair market value. He further stated that F. A. A. approval will be necessary before any such sale can be made.

L. G. Deering moved and Joe Chambers seconded that Mayor Jones be authorized to apply to the Federal Aviation Administration for a release of restrictions on approximately 78.9 acres of airport property now being used by the Abernathy Recreation Center with the intention to authorize same for sale to the ARC.

Motion carried.

L. G. Deering moved and Lee Echols seconded that the City Manager be instructed to contact Virgil Rhodes to request that an easement be given the city covering the lake area where the excess sewer effluent discharges. An alternative to this easement

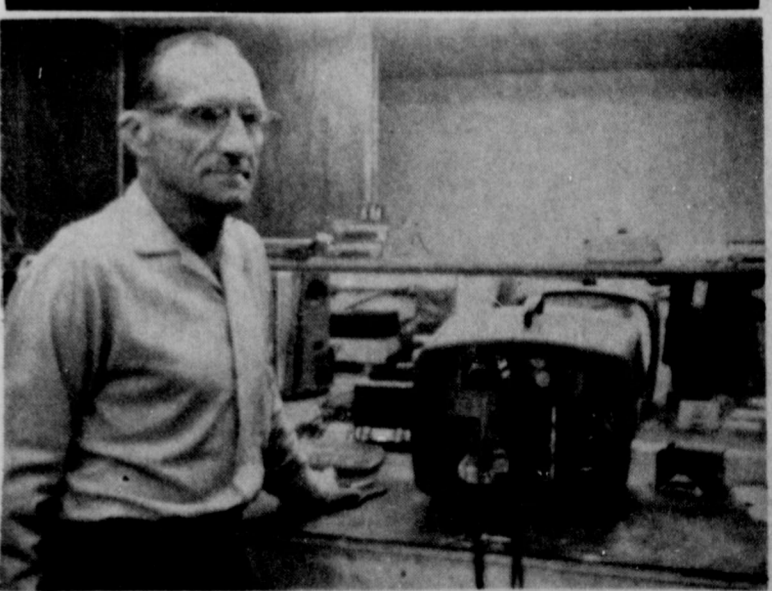
L. G. Deering moved and Lee Echols seconded that Reid Chevrolet be awarded the purchase on its low bid. Motion carried.

**150 Top Cowboys Due Here To Compete In ABC Rodeo**

LUBBOCK — More than 150 of the world's top cowboys and some of the nation's finest stock will be rolling into Lubbock this week as the Hub City heads toward the gala opening of the 26th annual ABC Rodeo, scheduled March 20-23 in Municipal Coliseum.

Sonny James and his Southern Gentlemen also will be featured at each of the 8 p.m. performances. His latest record, "A World of Our Own," is currently No. 1 atop country music ratings across the nation.

The list of units participating in the annual downtown parade was closed last week, and arena

entries wind up at 6 p.m. March 19. The cowboys will be competing for \$12,000 in purses and added money.

The parade will launch the four-day run at 4 p.m. March 20. It will feature several queens, cowboys, five Lubbock high school bands, nearly two dozen area riding clubs and sheriff's possees, clowns, and parade marshal, D. Burns of Lubbock.

In addition to the usual rodeo fare and special entertainment by James, one of the nation's top country music recording stars, the sponsoring Downtown Business Club has added other

attractions.

Area youths also will compete in riding events in a special segment of the program, and there will be a parade of champions from the South Plains Junior Livestock Show, being staged March 19-23 at the Panhandle South Plains Fairgrounds here.

Advance tickets may be purchased at Pioneer Hotel, rodeo headquarters, or from any ABC member. Reserved box seats are \$3.50 each. Other prices include reserved seats \$3, general admission \$2.50, student and military general admission \$1.75, and general admission for children 12 and under is \$1.25.

Beutler & Son of Elk City, Okla., will produce the rodeo. Wilbur Plaugher, rodeo performer and actor, will return as clown, and Clem McSpadden Oklahoma legislator, will serve as announcer.

Among the top cowboys due

here are Larry Mahan, Brooks Ore, two-time world champion all-around cowboy, who set a single season record by winning \$51,966 last year; Shawn Davis, Whitehall, Mont., world champion saddle bronc rider who earned over \$25,000 in 1967; and Glen Franklin, House, N. M., who netted \$31,268 in calf roping during 1967 to earn the championship in that event.

Many other top riders and ropers will be in action.

Proceeds from the rodeo are used to support ABC youth activities here.



### IN HALE COUNTY

#### Farmers Will Plant 123,569 Acres Cotton

Hale County farmers' intention to plant a total 123,569 cotton acres and to divert 22.2 per cent of the 158,885-acre county allotment is on a par with the expected plantings over the 23-county Plains Cotton Growers, Inc. West Texas region.

The intended plantings by Hale County farmers show an increase of 19,401 acres over last year's 104,168 acres.

According to preliminary reports made Monday through

Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service offices, farmers in the 23-county region plan to plant approximately 1,688,875 acres of cotton, an increase of 258,491 acres over 1967's total of 1,430,384 acres.

This estimate is subject to revisions of the county ASCS final reports to the USDA but revisions are expected to be minor. The final count will be issued by the USDA April 2.

Area farmers enrolling in the government's cotton program before the sign-up deadline Friday have allotments totaling 2,193,901 acres. The farmers signed up to divert 505,026 acres or an average 23 per cent of the allotment. In 1967, area farmers diverted 34 per cent of their cotton allotments.

An average yield of 519 lint pounds per acre could give the 23-county area a crop of about 1.7 million bales of 480 pounds net weight.

If these plantings materialize, the 1968 crop could realize the largest cotton acreage production since 1965.

County farmers have signed intentions to divert a total 35,316 cotton acres.

These crashes resulted in one person killed, 25 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$26,216.  
The rural traffic accident record for Lubbock County during the first two months of 1968 shows a total of 85 accidents resulting in two persons killed, 42 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$59,456.  
The rural accident summary for February for other counties in the South Plains shows (the number of accidents is given first followed by the number of injuries): Bailey: two and five; Cochran, two and none; Crosby, 17 and 11; Dickens, two and two; Floyd, four and four; Garza, three and none; Hale, 18 and 10; Hockley, 13 and seven; Lamb, six and two; Lynn, five and five; Terry, nine and four; and Yoakum, one and none.  
No fatalities were recorded as a result of rural traffic accidents in February in any South Plains county except Lubbock.
