RADIOLOGICAL COURSE IS SET TO START HERE

A 16-hour course to train radiological monitors has been scheduled for Abernathy, according to City Manager Bob Sokoll. The course is designed to train individuals in methods and techniques of using radiological data, evaluation of radiological information, and reporting procedures.

Any citizen who has the desire to be of service to his community by acquiring technical knowledge to better meet the challenge of the nuclear age is eligible to attend this course. The classes will be held in the City Hall Clubroom beginning Tuesday April 9th. The classes will be three hours long and are scheduled for Tuesday April 9th, Thursday April 11th, Tuesday April 16th, Thursday April 18th, and Tuesday April 23rd. All classes will begin at 7:00 p. m.

There is no charge for attending these classes. All costs are borne by the Texas Education Agency. The instructor for this course will be Bill Payne from Lubbock, who is an approved Radiological Monitor Instructor. Any citizen interested in attending this radiological course should contact Bob Sokoll at City Hall at his earliest convenience.

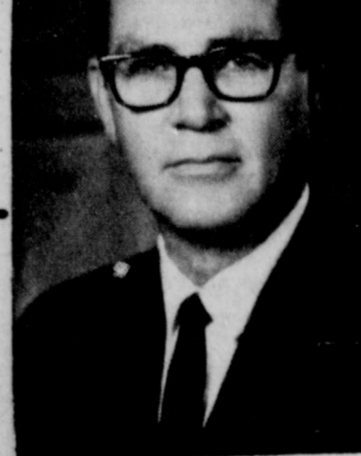

PLENTY MOISTURE FOR CROP PLANTING

Farmers of this area will have sufficient ground moisture to plant row crops, with most of it coming in the form of rain and snow, and very little by irrigation.

M. O. Hood reported a total of 4.37 inches of rain and 14.4 inches of snow for January, February and March. There was a trace of snow and 1.14 inches of rain in Jan., 5.9 inches of snow and 1.03 inches of rain in Feb., and 8.5 inches of snow and 2.20 inches of rain in March.

The above figures do not include the all-day slow rain which fell here April 1.

MAIL FOR SERVICEMEN

An illustrated pamphlet--Mail For Servicemen--outlining the expanded program for airlifting letters, packages and other military mail overseas at low postal rates is now available through Abernathy Post Office window clerks, Postmaster Herman Lambert announced today.

Postmaster Lambert said that "as a result of new legislation and action by President Johnson we are now airlifting more than 75 per cent of all mail going to the military men and women stationed abroad. We hope this guide will help more American families be familiar with these services and use them."

The eight-page pamphlet illustrates three services for airlifting parcels at rates the average family can afford, the speedy service now available for newspapers and news magazines to most overseas bases, the special rates for books and similar educational materials, and how to mail sound-recorded personal messages. The guide also provides parcel wrapping instructions, information on the time it takes parcels to reach Vietnam and other overseas bases from major U.S. cities, and pointers on the correct way to address military mail.

A family sending a 10-pound package from Abernathy to Vietnam, for example, pays only \$2.90 on a package marked "PAL," while the air parcel rate for the same package is \$7.23, Postmaster Lambert said.

On parcels weighing less than 5 pounds it might be more advantageous for a family to use the older (SAM) Space Available Mail service, which provides surface transportation to the port of embarkation and airlift overseas. A four-pound SAM package to a European military post from Abernathy costs only \$1.30. On packages weighing under two pounds air parcel post is often the patron's "best buy" for through airlift service, the pamphlet suggests.

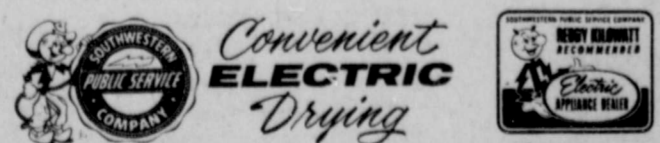

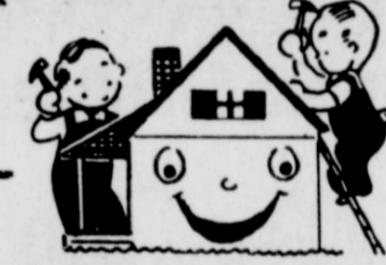
