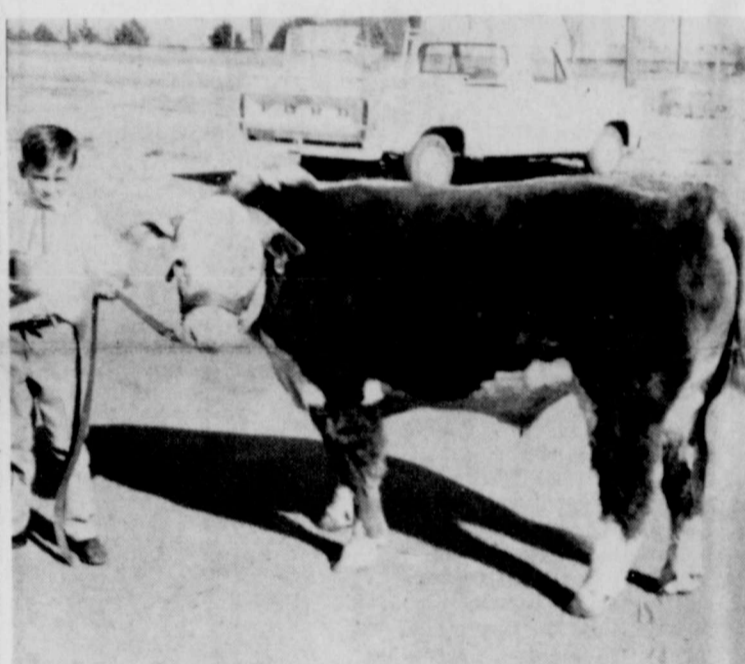

Rites Here For War Victim

Funeral rites are pending at Chambers Funeral Home in Abernathy for Navy Corpsman David DeWayne Overstreet, 22. He was killed in action March 23, near Quang Tri, South Vietnam. He was serving as a medic with a U. S. Marine Corps Detachment at the time of his death. He was the son of Delbert Overstreet, Eldorado, Texas, formerly of Abernathy. Other survivors include his step-mother and two brothers of the home and a sister in Stephenville. An uncle, Virgil Overstreet, resides in Abernathy. Another uncle, L. S. Overstreet, lives in Petersburg.

David DeWayne Overstreet was graduated from Abernathy High School in 1965. He entered the Navy in October, 1967. The body will be flown to San Francisco, Calif., then to Lubbock. Date of arrival at Lubbock was not known at press time.

Chambers Funeral Home will receive the body at Lubbock. Funeral rites probably will be held in an Abernathy Baptist Church, local relatives said. Burial, with military honors, will be in Abernathy Cemetery, either by the side of his mother's grave or in the plot in the cemetery reserved for servicemen who gave their lives for their country.

Presentation of the Outstanding Citizen Award Thursday night was made by David Ray Pinson for the Chamber of Commerce. Following is the introduction which Pinson read in revealing the name of the one selected as Outstanding Citizen.

If you have ever felt that this community was a humdrum place, in a rut, and destined to slip backwards, then you have failed to make the acquaintance of our outstanding citizen for the year.

This person possesses the attributes of an attorney, a philosopher, a physician, a mediator, a sociologist and a theologian.

But what has this person done to create all of this excitement?

Birth April 10, 1938. . . . Fairly young. Attended school through 8th grade at Hale Center. . . . and high school in Abernathy. Married for 15 years, has five children. Some time ago, there was a move to establish neighborhood centers in communities that wished to qualify. The move was sponsored by the O. E. O., Office of Economic Opportunity. The function of these centers was to promote any activity which might elevate socially or economically, the minority groups in the area. It was not a hand out program, but one of self help and rehabilitation.

The main problem was to find someone who could administer this center, and fortunate smiled on us here in Abernathy when the person that we pay tribute to tonight, was selected for the job.

Now, through the diligent effort of this person, . . . sewing classes, driver training courses, cooking classes, and furniture refinishing classes are in regular attendance. In the planning stage is a recreational program for the children. On the surface, the above classes appear unexciting to the layman, but to the person who has never made a dress for her daughter, . . . or the person who has never been able to prepare a nourishing, tasty meal for her family, these classes indicate to them, for the first time, that someone cares.

It is a fact that to oversee the Neighborhood Center, a salary is paid. What is not realized by most is that this administrator never considered this job a simple 9 to 5 position. From early morning till late at night, . . . concern for others is the motive. Aside from her official duties, she manages to teach in Sunday School and Training Union and is the president of the Women's organization of her church. She also serves as the church clerk.

For a group of people who

have been down trodden all of their lives, imagine how they respond to a person showing genuine interest in their problems, helping them get to the doctor or hospital; helping them file a tax return; helping them with naturalization papers or birth certificates, driving the elderly to the Old Age Assistance office in Plainview for an interview, . . . securing legal aid for them, . . . assisting in a solution to a family crisis in the home, . . . helping them translate a weighty matter into their own language. . . . But most of all, standing ready to inform these

people of their rights and privileges. Opportunities available, but due to ignorance or timidity, failure to take advantage of the situation.

Religion has meant much to her and for this reason her life sparkles with a particular radiance. Goodness prevails when she is present. She loves her work; her people trust her, she is a wonderful community ambassador.
