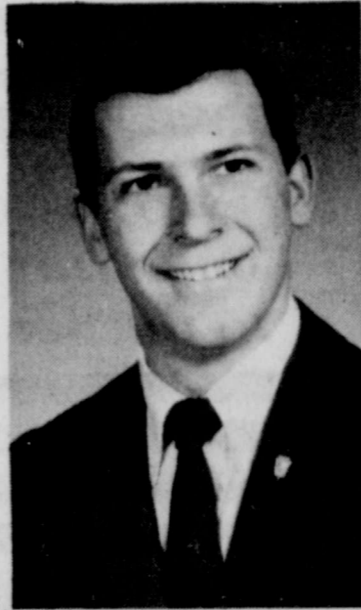

#### SUMMER READING PROGRAM ABERNATHY SCHOOL

JUNE 9 - JULY 21

Morning program will consist of showing films, story telling and looking at books. Schedule will be according to teachers schedule. No books will be checked out in the morning. This schedule will be for those attending summer school.

#### AFTERNOON 1-4 LIBRARY OPEN TO PUBLIC 9--August 1

Application forms are to be filled out and completed by parents. This form will be kept on file and the child will be issued a library card. This card is to be brought each time books are checked out of the library. A fine of 10¢ will be charged for lost cards.

There will be Aquanauts. A certificate will be issued when a child has read 2 books. Then a sticker for each succeeding book will be given to place on the certificate. Fourteen books are to be read to complete certificate. A record will be kept of all books read by the child.

The following policies have been established concerning the use of the summer library reading program.

1. A child must have completed one year in school to be able to check books out by himself.
2. A child may check out 2 books for a period of 1 week.
3. Pre-school children must be accompanied and assisted by a parent at all times.
4. Parents of pre-school children must check out books in their own name and not in the child's name.
5. Books may be renewed one time.
6. A fine of 2¢ per day will be charged for over-due books.
7. All lost and damaged books must be paid for.
8. Children may come to the library and read books from 1-4 provided they abide by the rules.

## Rainfall Total Climbs In Area

Farmers are looking for "ground-drying weather" to plant, or re-plant, cotton and grain sorghum crops. Storms hit this area Thursday and Friday bringing up to three inches-plus rains in parts of the territory. The public reported seeing a tornado north of Tuco in the rainstorm that hit here early Friday evening. There was no report of damage from the twister.

In rainfall measurements for May 13-17, M.O. Hood reported a total of 2.80 inches of rain in Abernathy. This, added to the previous 1.87 inches earlier this month, brings the total rainfall for May to 4.67 inches, to May 17. Total for the year to that date is 8.83 inches.

## Hale County Water Association Seeks \$25 Donations

Constitutional amendment #2 which will be voted on August 5, 1969 is extremely important to every citizen interested in the future of West Texas. This amendment if passed, and there is an if, will authorize the state water commission to increase its bonded indebtedness up to 3 1/2 billion dollars. This amount of money is necessary to finance surface water from the Mississippi River. The concern for the passage of this amendment is being aired in all of the water association groups.

Water Incorporated has contracted for TV and newspaper advertising in the amount of \$200,000.00 to assure passage of this amendment. Most of this advertising will be spent in East Texas. The passage of this amendment is a must for the future of West Texas. This \$200,000.00 will be the amount of money spent statewide.

The Hale County Water Association has considered a goal of \$15,000.00 as its fair share of Water Incorporated state budget. Hale County has 18 communities which means that each community needs to raise something less than \$1,000.00. Farmers will receive the first direct benefit from surface water, therefore the current drive to raise this \$15,000.00 will be presented to the farmer first. The Hale County Water Association would like to see each farmer owner and/or operator to contribute in at least \$25.00 to this drive. 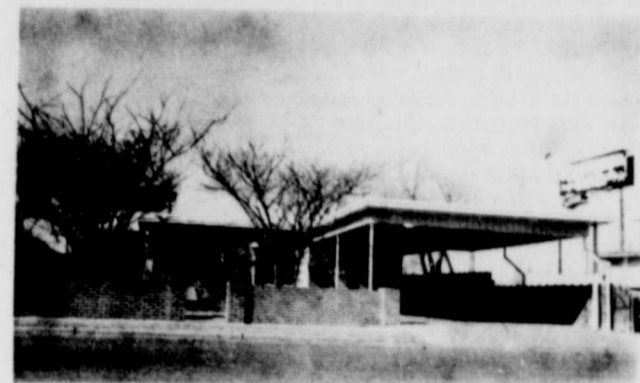

**PUBLIC NOTICE**

**Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER FIVE ON THE BALLOT (SJR8)**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:**

Section 1. That Section 51-a of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 51-a. The Legislature shall have the power, by General Laws, to provide, subject to limitations herein contained, and such other limitations, restrictions and regulations as may be by the Legislature be deemed expedient, for assistance grants to and/or medical care for, and for rehabilitation and any other services included in the federal laws as they now read or as they may hereafter be amended, providing matching funds to help such families and individuals attain or retain capability for independence or self-care, and for the payment of assistance grants to and/or medical care for, and for rehabilitation and other services to or on behalf of:

"(1) Needy aged persons who are citizens of the United States or non-citizens who shall have resided within the boundaries of the United States for at least twenty-five (25) years;

"(2) Needy individuals who are totally and permanently disabled by reason of a mental or physical handicap or a combination of physical and mental handicaps;

"(3) Needy blind persons;

"(4) Needy dependent children and the caretakers of such children.

"The Legislature may prescribe such other eligibility requirements for participation in these programs as it deems appropriate.

"The Legislature shall have authority to enact appropriate legislation which will enable the State of Texas to cooperate with the Government of the United States in providing assistance to and/or medical care on behalf of needy persons, in providing rehabilitation and any other services included in the federal laws making matching funds available to help such families and individuals attain or retain capability for independence or self-care, to accept and expend funds from the Government of the United States for such purposes in accordance with the laws of the United States as they now are or as they may hereafter be amended, and to make appropriations out of state funds for such purposes; provided that the maximum amount paid out of state funds to or on behalf of any needy person shall not exceed the amount that is matchable out of federal funds; provided that the total amount of such assistance payments only out of state funds on behalf of such individuals shall not exceed the amount of Eighty Million Dollars (\$80,000,000) during any fiscal year.

"Supplementing legislative appropriations for assistance payments authorized by this Section, the following sums are allocated out of the Omnibus Tax Clearance Fund and are appropriated to the State Department of Public Welfare for the period beginning September 1, 1969 and ending August 31, 1971: Three Million, Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,600,000) for Old Age Assistance, Two Million, Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000) for Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled, and Twenty-Three Million, Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$23,900,000) for Aid to Families with Dependent Children. Such allocations and appropriations shall be made available on the basis of equal monthly installments and otherwise shall be subject to the provisions of currently existing laws making allocations and appropriations for these purposes.

"Provided further, that if the limitations and restrictions herein contained are found to be in conflict with the provisions of appropriate federal statutes, as they now are or as they may be amended to the extent that federal matching money is not available to the state for these purposes, then and in that event the Legislature is specifically authorized and empowered to prescribe such limitations and restrictions and enacts such laws as may be necessary in order that such federal matching money will be available for assistance and/or medical care for or on behalf of needy persons.

"Nothing in this Section shall be construed to amend, modify or repeal Section 21 of Article XVI of this Constitution; provided, further, however, that such medical care, services or assistance shall also include the employment of objective or subjective means, without the use of drugs, for the purpose of ascertaining and measuring the powers of vision of the human eye, and fitting lenses or prisms to correct or remedy any defect or abnormal condition of vision. Nothing herein shall be construed to permit optometrists to treat the eyes for any defect whatsoever in any manner nor to administer nor to prescribe any drug or physical treatment whatsoever, unless such optometrist is a regularly licensed physician or surgeon under the laws of this state."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday in August, 1969. At the election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting "FOR" or "AGAINST" the proposition:

"The Constitutional Amendment providing for assistance to and/or medical care on behalf of the needy aged, the needy blind, the needy disabled, and the needy dependent children and their caretakers; establishing Eighty Million Dollars (\$80,000,000) as the maximum amount that may be paid per year from state funds for assistance only; allocating and appropriating additional sums supplementing current legislative appropriations for assistance grants, and authorizing the Legislature to enact such laws as may be necessary in order that federal matching money will be available for assistance and/or medical care."
