HAIL, WIND, RAIN BLAST SOUTH PLAINS

The most devastating hail storm ever to hit the South Plains threw a double punch to Hale and Lubbock Counties Friday, June 13. Part of this area north was damaged by hail and wind early that morning and the second storm of Friday the 13th hit the entire area in the late afternoon and early evening.

Wheat and row crops were either badly damaged or completely wiped out by the storms. Windows in homes were shattered by the big hail stones which were carried by high velocity winds. Hundreds of homes in north Lubbock and south Hale sustained damage both inside and outside. Hail, water and flying glass also ruined drapes, carpets and furniture when windows were knocked out. Roofs were damaged, and outside walls and trim were ruined by the hail on homes that had wood, stucco or slate siding. Insurance adjusters are busy in the area determining damage to crops and buildings.

In the late afternoon-early evening storm, Bob Stephens of radio station KWGO four miles north of town spotted a tornado in the air some five and one-half miles northwest of Abernathy. The twister was going east. No damage from the tornado has been reported. The tornado, which was verified by the Lubbock weather station, caused local storm sirens to be turned on by the police.

Abernathy's police car, which had to stay out in the storm so patrolmen could watch and report, was badly damaged. The two red emergency lights atop the vehicle were broken, as was the spot light, rearview mirror and other glass. The car was dented by hail.

Along with the hail and high-wind was a heavy rainstorm. M.O. Hood reported a total of 3.43 inches of rain in Abernathy June 13-16. This brings the total moisture for the year to 13.27 inches.

Many fields showed evidence of washing of soil in the more than 3 inches of rain that fell June 13.

Stunned by the crop-killing storm, farmers are pondering what to replant: cotton? grain sorghum? soybeans? Planters will start rolling again just as soon as land dries enough.

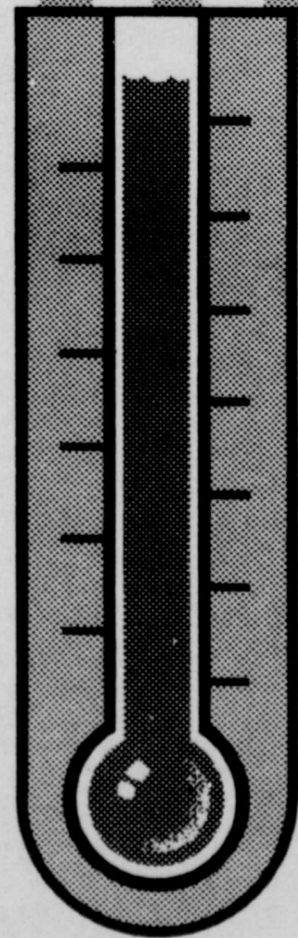

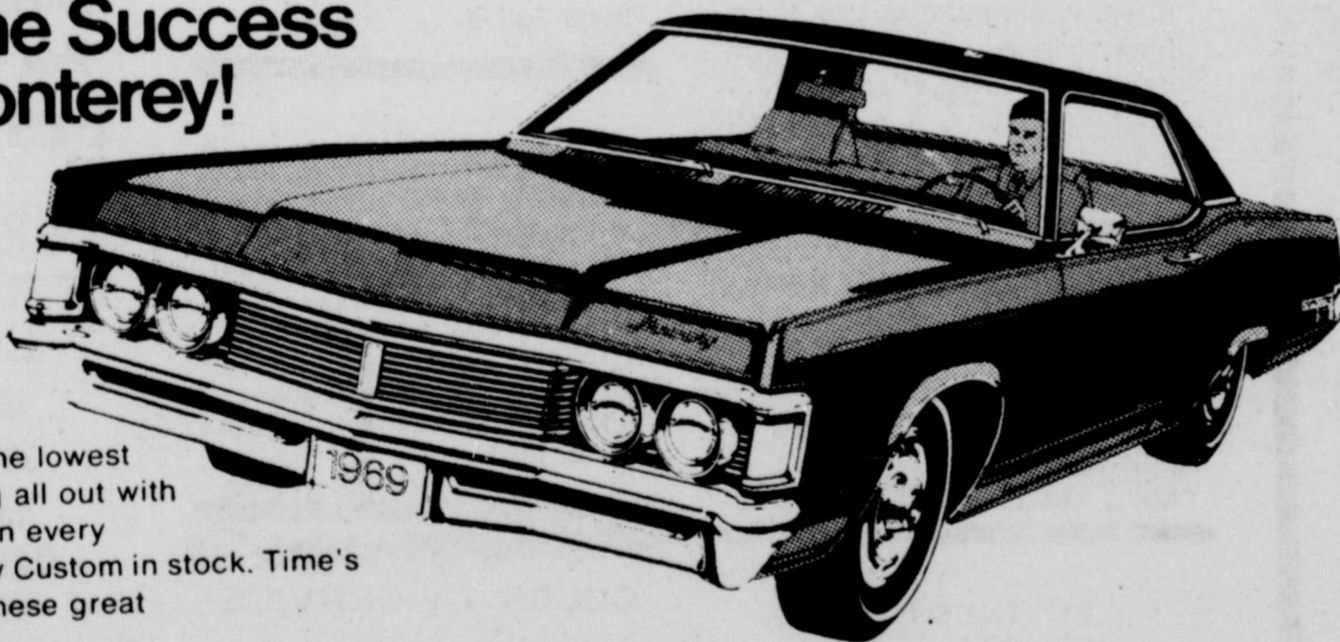
