JAPAN
Dear Mr. Davenport:

I thought I would write to you so you could tell the Abernathy people about my trip so far.

I had a wonderful time in Hawaii and everything was so beautiful.

We arrived in Tokyo, Japan on June 26 and rode the Super Express train to Osaka, Japan June 27.

I am living with a really wonderful family. The only person in the family that speaks
English is the 20 year old daughter, and she doesn't speak it
very well. I have eaten Japanese food nearly every meal
and I really like it. They mande me make them hamburgers

Last Friday night the Osaka
Lions had a party for all of
the YEPER'S in Osaka and their host families. Sunday I visited a very small Protestant
church, then we went to Kyoto to see the Budist Temples.
W'e visited the Tinkakeyi Temple and a universty. Kyoto is
a very beautiful town and famous for tourisss.

The weather is very humid here. It has rained every day I've been here. My family has kept me very busy. Tomorrow I will meet a friend of Mr. Billie Harrison. He is going to take me to an AFS party. He speaks English very well.

Now I know what it feels like to be a foreigner. I feel pretty sick sometimes when everyone around is speaking Japanese and I am the only English speaking person around. But as a whole, I have really enjoyed my trip very much.

On Jt.ly 11, all of the kids in Osaka area will stay at an English House for five days. Here we will learn all of the Japanese customs and put them to practice. I am looking forward to this.

For my doctoral dissertation for the Ph.D. degree in Linguistics, I am doing an etymological study and linguistic and of the place names of thirty-eight counties in the Panhandle-South Plains area of Texas. Gill Seeks Information

Mr. Donald A. Gill, professor of English at El Centro College in Dallas, is preparing a study of the origins of the names of all towns, rivers, creeks, and other place names on the map of thirty-eight counties of the Panhandle- South Plains of Texas. Hale County is one of those included in the study. The study will serve as his dissertation for the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Linguistics from East Texas State University and will also be published in book form at a later date.

Gill, a fellow West Texas from Ropesville, received his Bachelor of Arts degree from West Texas State University in 1960 and his Master of Arts degree from the University of Colorado in 1966. He is the son-in-law of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Benn, 913 1st Street, Abernathy.

At this point in his study, Gill has exhausted his sources of recorded material and must rely on living sources to help him. Thus the citizens of Hale County are asked to aid him in discovering the origins of names

of the county.
