**Appaloosa Show's
Premiums \$1,000**

LUBBOCK--The second annual Appaloosa Horse Show, offering \$1,000 in premiums, has been slated as another feature of the big 52nd annual Panhandle South Plains Fair here Sept. 26.

Ken Cook, of Silverton, extension agent for Briscoe County, will be superintendent for the event. Bill Phinizy and Mack Head will be assistant superintendents, Bob Middleton will serve as ring steward, Tommy Buckner will handle the chores of secretary, and Jack Kyle of Santa Rosa, N.M., will be the judge.

The show has been approved by the Appaloosa Horse Club, Inc., of Moscow, Idaho, the Texas Appaloosa Horse Club, and the Golden Spread Appaloosa Horse Club.

Entry fees are \$7 per horse for halter classes, \$12 per horse for performance classes, and \$3 per horse for youth classes. Entries will be accepted from 7 a.m. to 8:45 a.m. on the day of the show. Competition will begin at 9 a.m.

In halter and performance classes, classes cash awards of \$15, \$12.50, \$10, \$7.50, \$5, and \$3 will be awarded to winners from first through sixth places.

Halter classes include 1966, 1967, 1968, and 1969 stallions; stallions foaled in 1965 and before; 1966, 1967, 1968 and 1969 mares; mares foaled in 1965 and before; 1965, 1966, 1967, and 1968 geldings; geldings foaled in 1964 and before; plus grand and reserve champions in stallion, mare and gelding divisions. Youth classes include showmanship at halter, western pleasure, junior and senior reining, pole bending and barrel racing. Banners and trophies also will be awarded in all classes.

The 1969 fair, slated Sept. 22-27, is offering a record \$37,235 in premiums.

Topping the Fair Park Coliseum stage will be a country and western variety spectacular featuring Marty Robbins (Sept. 22-23), Charley Pride (Sept. 24-25), and Buck Owens and his Buckaroos (Sept. 26-27). Roy Clark will emcee all twice-daily shows. Gentle Ben, Peggy Ann Nielsen, comedian Mike Caldwell, and the Congregation will also be featured.

Tickets are priced at \$2, \$3, and \$4 for 7:30 p.m. shows, and all persons will be admitted to 3 p.m. matinees for one-half price.
