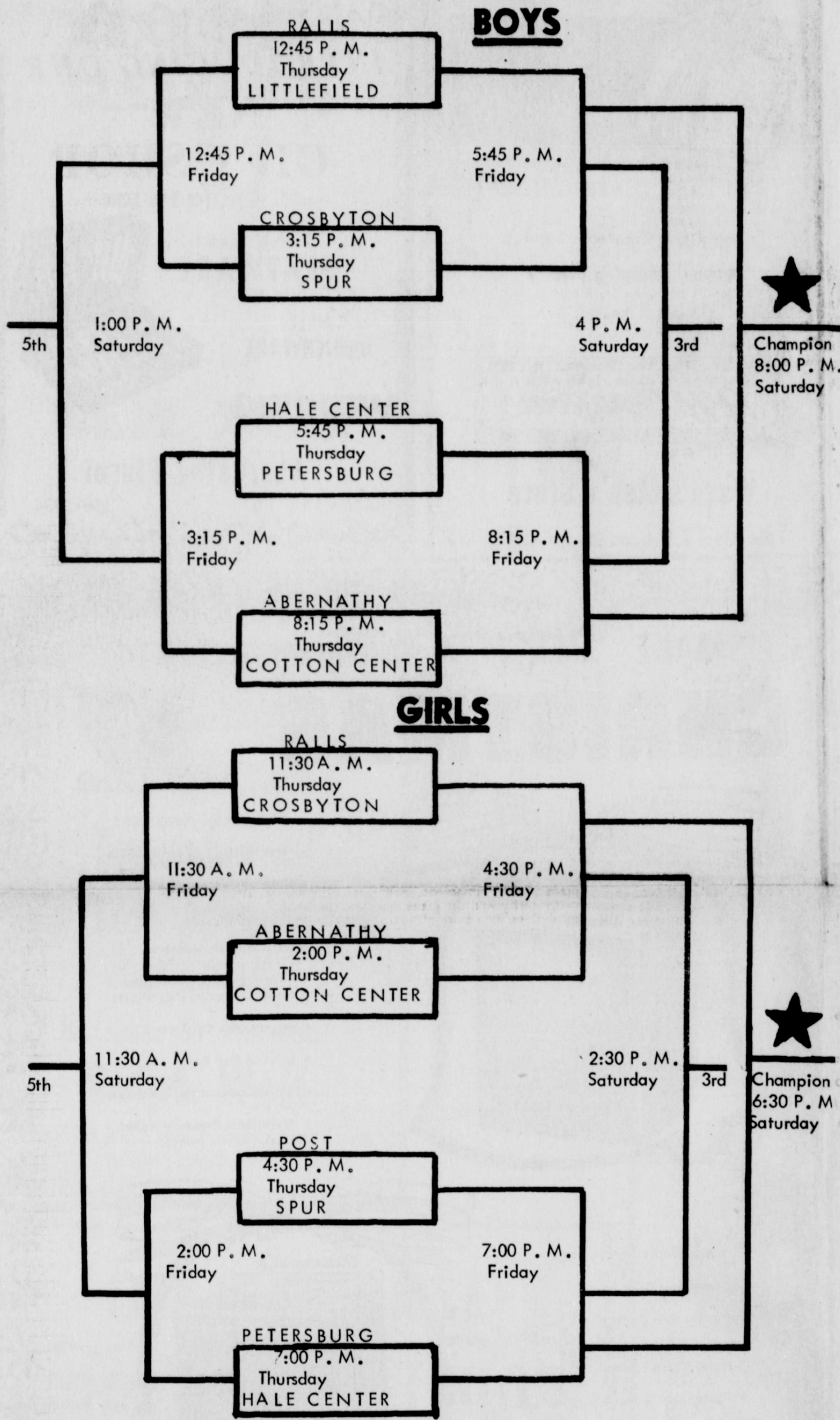

## VARSITY BOYS IN PLAINVIEW MEET

The Varsity boys basketball team remained winless this past week, falling to Plainview and McAdoo in the Plainview Tournament. The Antelopes were defeated by class AAAA Plainview in the first round of the tourney. The score was 88-42 in favor of the Bulldogs, a ball club that is expected to be a top contender in their district. The top Lope point scorer was Don Snodgrass who finished with 25 points, most of them coming on long jump shots as the tough Plainview defense made it difficult for the Antelopes to get in close for the short shots.

In the second round of the tourney the Lopes fell to Class B McAdoo, 53-41. McAdoo was just the opposite of the tall Plainview team, having only one boy over six feet. But the poor uninspired play of the Antelopes again kept them from gaining their first victory of the year. Snodgrass was the top scorer with 19.

Coach Hill commented on the Antelopes play in the tournament: "Against Plainview we played as well as we were capable of playing, but I was very disappointed with our performance in the McAdoo game. Our boys were listless, slow in their movement and reaction, and played as poor as we have played in any game this year." He added, "We expect better basketball from them and we know they will play better."

## AHS GIRLS WIN 3rd IN SLATON TOURNEY

The Abernathy girls basketball team came from behind a 29-18 deficit to defeat Sundown 56-46 to win the first round of the Slaton Tournament. Playing an outstanding game for Abernathy were Jenevia Johnson, Rickie Covey, Nancy Lambert, Marilyn Barton, Ramona Olguin, and Dreuann McCune.

Saturday morning the Abernathy girls played Roosevelt, the only team to beat Abernathy this season and they did it by 28 points. Roosevelt did it again, but it was a different story. Roosevelt won 54-52 in an overtime. Abernathy was behind Roosevelt 40-31 with 3 minutes left in the game. Abernathy came back to tie the score up 48-48 at the end of regulation play. In the overtime Roosevelt was able to come up with the last and winning basket.

In the Roosevelt nine girls turned in a tremendous losing effort they were Karen Payne, Ramona Olguin, Marilyn Barton, Dreuann McCune, Rickie Covey, Jenevia Johnson, Karen McClendon, Kathy McClendon, and Nancy Lambert.

The Abernathy girls played Slaton Saturday night for third place in the tournament. Abernathy easily won the game and third place by a score of 55 to 40. In the Stanton game all sixteen of the varsity girls saw action, with seven girls getting in the scoring column. The Stanton game win gave the girls a record of 5 wins and two losses.

Dreuann McCune a junior forward for Abernathy who scored 62 points in the Slaton Tournament was selected to the All-Tournament Team.

## Basketball Tournament Begins

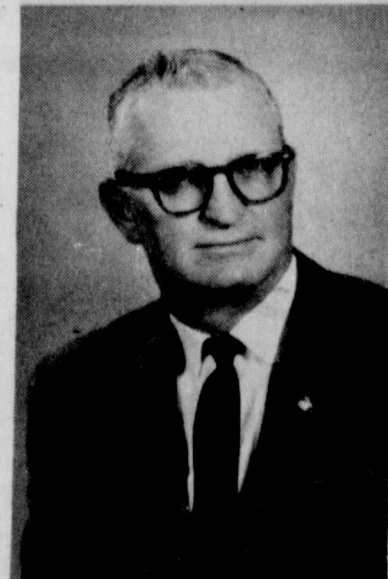
The Annual Abernathy Invitational Basketball Tournament will be reeled off this week in the Abernathy High School gymnasium. Defending champions of both boys and girls brackets return to try and make it two in a row. Ralls was the winner in both the boys and girls divisions last year, and the boys are picked as the team to beat this year.

Ralls boys will face their toughest competition from teams in their own district--Crosbyton, Spur, and Petersburg. Others in the boys bracket are Cotton Center, Littlefield, Hale Center, and Host Abernathy.

## FIVE GENERATIONS OF THE NEIS

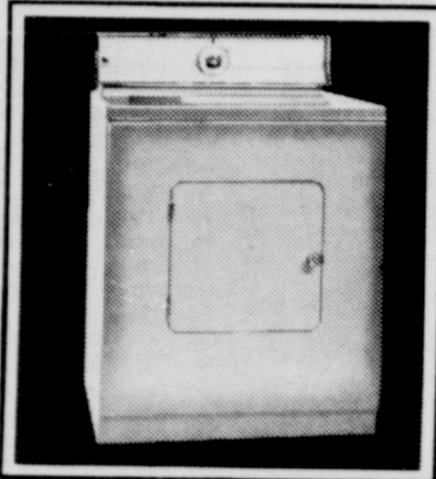

**REPORT ON NAZARENE ACTIVITIES**

The Rev. Louis Schaap, pastor of the Abernathy Church of the Nazarene reported that the local church gave just over 15% of its total income to the World wide missionary effort of the denomination of which it is a part. This contributed \$3,114 dollars toward the over \$7,000,000 which the denomination gave to its world mission program in 1969.

Dr. John Stockton, general treasurer, estimated that the 1969 giving total would reach \$7,300,000. This would be an increase of 6 1/2% over the \$6,854,000 spent on Nazarene world missions in 1968.

The Nazarene world mission program takes in work by over 600 missionaries, teachers, doctors, nurses and builders and world-wide broadcasting schedules.

Early in 1970 Nazarenes will open work in Honduras which will be the 49th world area with work sponsored by the denomination. A church also has been started in Guam, in the Mariana Island of the Pacific.

Other gains during the year were the construction of English-speaking churches in Tokyo and at Yoshihara, Okinawa.

A total of 41 Nazarene college students gave their summer vacations in 1969 to work at mission stations in South and Central America. This plan will be repeated in 1970.

More than 280 pastors attended the first Nazarene Central American preachers' conference at Guatemala City, Guatemala, December 1-5. The new Nazarene Central American Bible College is scheduled to open in March, 1970, on a campus near San Jose, Costa Rica.

The Nazarene world mission program has 85,879 church members and an enrollment of 168,500 in Sunday School. The denomination has a world membership of over 465,000 persons.

Pastor Schaap also stated that this is the 10th year in recent church history that the Abernathy church has given over 10% of its yearly income to the cause of world missions through the general denominational program.

ren's choir in a full program of songs, with a short devotion from the pastor, the Rev. Conrad M. Ryan.

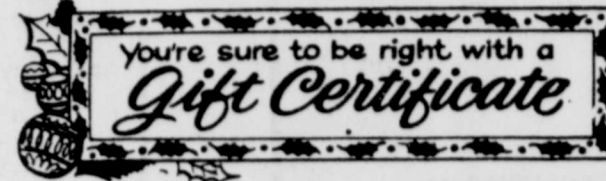
