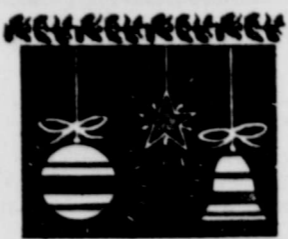

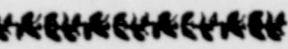

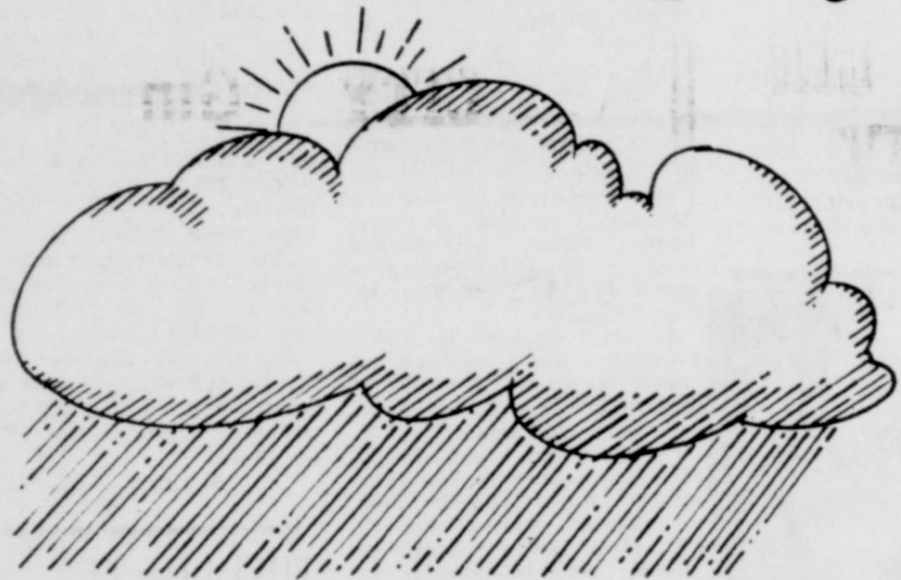

YF TURKEY SHOOT

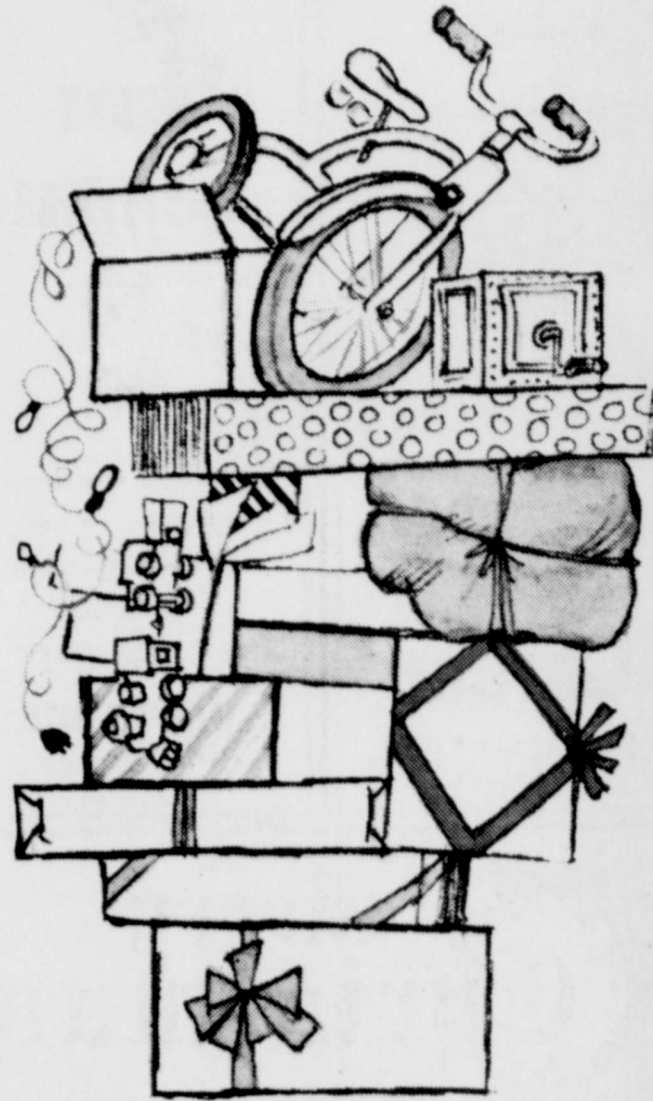
Abernathy Young Farmers Chapter will sponsor a turkey shoot Friday and Saturday, Dec. 19 and 20. Location will be two
