Kindergarten Registration Is August 25th

Gid Adkisson, Director of Bilingual and Special Education, announced that registration for the bilingual kindergarten will be held Tuesday, August 25, 1970, from 9:00 to 11:00 a. m. along with registration for other elementary grades. Registration will be held in the kindergarten room in the west end of the elementary building. All children who are five years old on or before September 1, 1970 are eligible to attend. Children who wish to enroll must have a birth certificate and must have been vaccinated for smallpox.

There will be three kindergarten classes during the coming school term in which both the English and Spanish languages will be used for instruction. Kindergarten classes will begin at 8:45 and end at 3:00 p. m. Children attending kindergarten will be eligible to ride school buses both to and from school.

There will also be three first grade rooms participating in the bilingual program. The first priority in assignment to these classes will go to children who attended the bilingual kindergarten during the 1969-70 school year. Part of the instruction in these classes will be by closed circuit television and there will be bilingual aides assigned to each class to assist the teacher with the language development program.

(Notice to Parents: The birth certificate you present when your child registers MUST be a CERTIFIED birth certificate. The "keepsake" certificate which the hospital issued when your child was born cannot be accepted as legal proof of age.)

Elementary Registration Is Scheduled

Jerry Moorhead, principal of Abernathy Elementary School, announced that students will register for the 1970-1971 school year Tuesday, August 25 from 9 a. m. to 11 a. m. After registering that day, students will be free to leave. The new school term starts Wednesday morning, August 26, at 8:45 o'clock.

Mr. Moorhead gave the following places of registration by grades:

First grade students will register in Rooms 21, 23 and 25, in the elementary school building. They must be six years of age on or before Sept. 1, 1970, and must have a certified birth certificate and a smallpox vaccination certificate to register.

Second grade students will register in Rooms 16 and 17. Third graders will register in Rooms 10 and 11.

Fourth grade registration will be in Rooms 5 and 6.

Those in the fifth grade will register in Rooms 1 and 2.

Special Education registration will be in Room 15.

VACCINATION, CERTIFICATE

Mr. Jerry Moorhead, principal of Abernathy Elementary School, reminds parents of students who will be in the first grade when school starts in August that they must bring a birth certificate and a smallpox vaccination certificate before they can be admitted.

First graders, and all other elementary school students, will register Tuesday, August 25, from 9 a. m. to 11 a. m. They may leave after registering. The 1970-1971 school term begins at 8:45 a. m.

AJHS To Enroll Here August 25

Frank Bartlett, new principal of Abernathy Junior High School, announced the following schedule for junior high students to register Tuesday, August 25: Sixth graders register at 9 a. m.; Seventh grade registers at 10 a. m. and Eighth grade registers at 11 a. m. Students are to use the main entry (east side of building) when they report to register. Classes will begin at 8:45 a. m. Wednesday, August 26.

Mr. Bartlett, who was assistant principal last year, follows Gid B. Adkisson, Jr., as principal of A.J.H.S. Mr. Adkisson will be in charge of the Bilingual Kindergarten Project.

High School Assembly Is Set August 26

Mr. Curtis Davenport, AHS principal, announced that all Abernathy High School students are to report to the school auditorium at 8:45 a. m. Wednesday, August 26, to attend a general assembly. After the meeting in the auditorium, all high school students who pre-registered at the close of the last school year will report directly to classrooms. Those who have not pre-registered will go from the auditorium to the principal's office, where they will be enrolled and scheduled for classes.

Farm Hand's Body Found

A farm worker driving a tractor on a dirt road about 8 1/2 miles southwest of Abernathy discovered the body of a Mexican national in a deep ditch beside the road shortly after 11 a. m. Monday.

The body was identified as that of Anacleto Gomez, about 30, who had worked on the E. A. Houston farms the past two months.

Capt. Charlie Bowman of the Lubbock County Sheriff's Department said the body had puncture wounds in the neck and chest. Justice of the Peace Wayne LeCroy ordered an autopsy.

Gomez' pockets contained \$356, Bowman said. He ruled out robbery as the motive for his death.



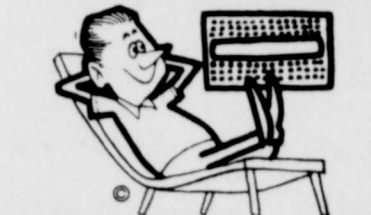
