### Tennessee Ernie, Merle Haggard Headline Lubbock Fair Attractions

The box office will open at Fair Park Coliseum, Lubbock, to launch ticket sales for headline attractions of the 54th annual Panhandle South Plains Fair, finance director Earl Kerr said.

The fair this year will be returning Tennessee Ernie Ford, comedian-singer Glenn Ash and The Celebration on the three opening days of the exposition, slated Sept. 27-Oct. 2.

On Thursday, an all-star Mexican variety show will be presented, featuring singer Lucha Villa and recording star Jose Alfredo Jimenez and the Guadalupans, a mariachi group.

Closing out the weekly run on Friday and Saturday will be a country and western spectacular featuring Merle Haggard, his wife, Bonnie Owens and The Strangers.

In addition to the coliseum box office, tickets also will be available at four other locations in Lubbock: TG&Y Continental, Sears downtown, Luskey's Western Wear and Montgomery Wards. Box office hours will be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Tickets are priced at \$2.50, \$3.50 and \$4.50 for all three segments. Show times are 5:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. daily. Tickets purchased prior to the fair opening will include a free gate admission pass. Mrs. Betty Putman will handle ticket sales.

More than \$38,000 in premiums are being offered exhibitors in this year's fair. A large military display, a free sway pole act, the popular Children's Barnyard and women's division, plus numerous livestock, agricultural, flower, art, commercial, and other shows are being planned.
