The Antelopes, led by Kent Snodgrass with 22 points, whip-ped the Bulldogs 69-46. Dick Rogers had 16 points and Joe Evans chipped in 10 points as the Antelopes took home the

Champion trophy.

Working their way into the finals of the tournament, the Antelopes defeated the Cotton Center Elks Thursday night 85-49. Kent Snodgrass had 19 points, with Joe Evans and Ray Martin each chipping in 10

The Antelopes blasted out another victory by beating Tatum, New Mexico, 86-67 in the Friday night contest. Ray Martin topped all scores with 28 points, while Joe Evans and Kent Snodgrass had 12 and 10 points, respectively.

In an earlier game this past week, the Antelopes defeated the Frenship Tigers by a score of 74-58. Ray Martin led all scores with 25 points and Dick

Rogers had 18. The Antelopes have definitely out-classed their opponents this year. Each victory, except for one against Dimmett, has been by a large margin. Let's hope that when the stiffer competition begins, and it will, that they can continue to show the poise and winning attitude that has been their trait for the first part of the season. After all, a lot of people have scheduled their vacations around the time of the state tournament.

LADY 'LOPES The Lady 'Lopes took the consolation championship of the Abernathy tournament by defeating Hart 65-50. Katrina Allen led the 'Lopes with a 22 point effort.

The girls lost their first game of the tournament 57-42 to Cotton Center on Thursday

Friday night saw a victory against the Abernathy JV 85-39. Katrina Allen once again paved the way with 24 points. Pam Rogers for the JV also had 24 points. This victory put the Lady 'Lopes in the consolation bracket against Hart, which they won.

The Antelopes will play Kress Dec. 19 at Abernathy and then travel to Frenship Dec. 22 to meet the Tigers again.
