Billy King of Lubbock and Kim McMenemy of Shallowater lighted candles.

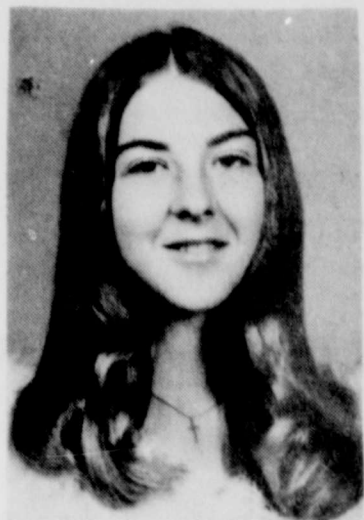
Wedding music was provided by Mrs. Danny Irvin of Lubbock, organist, and Miss Julia Irvin of Lubbock, vocal soloist.

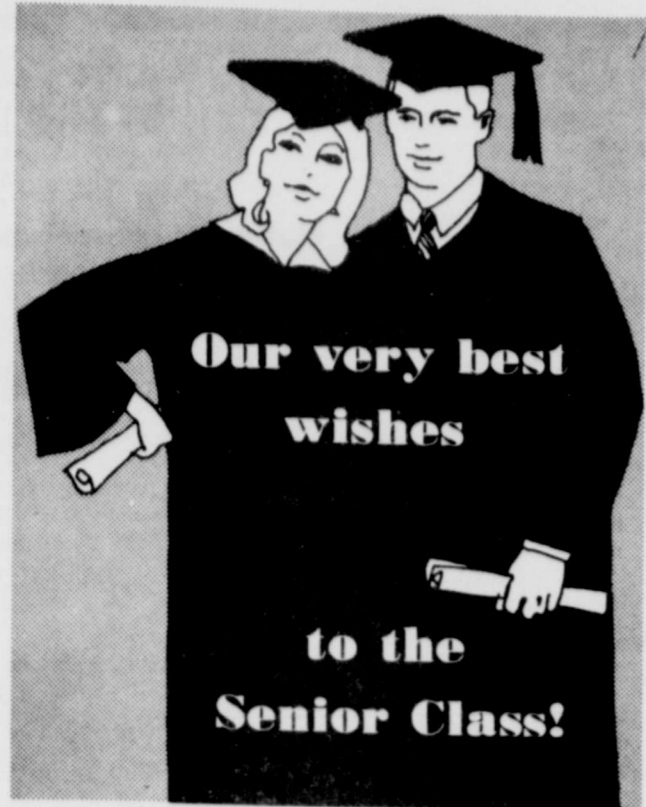

MRS. WARD STARTS CLASSES IN ENNIS

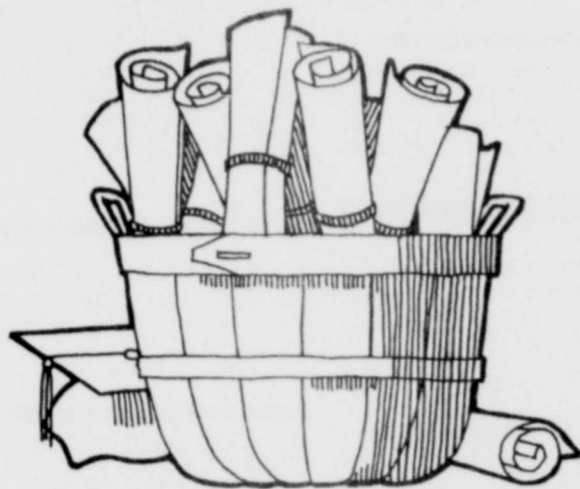
