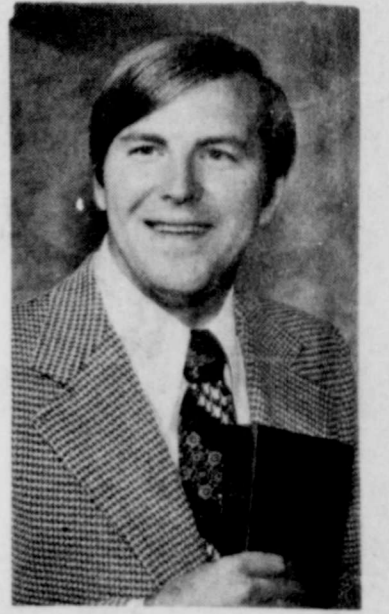
Last Home Games For Antelopes And N. D. Lions
