A discussion concerning the energy crisis and its effect on the local schools highlighted the December 3rd meeting of the Abernathy Independent School Board of Education. The board was made aware of the complete context of the governor's recommendations to conserve energy in the state schools and of the presentation of more conservative measures to be conducted for a 90 day period beginning January 1st. It was pointed out that no official directives have been received by the schools and would not be until the state board met later during the week of December 3rd. It is anticipated that schools will be asked to close earlier and reduce all extra - curricular activities and also reduce the heating and lighting. When official directives are received, the local schools will abide by

these directives. The board also discussed recommendations concerning the use of the new junior high building as a community tornado and storm shelter. Rules and regulations for this purpose will be printed at a later date.

Routine reports presented to the board were: tax collection report, showing 91.03% of the roll as having been collected; it was noted that December was the last month to receive a discount (1%). Also presented was a complete budget progress report, a health and an enrollment report which showed an increase of 10 students during the month of November over the previous





### FIRE DEPT. NOTE TO AREA GINS:

ABERNATHY VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT P. O. Box 266 Abernathy, Texas

To the Gins in the Abernathy area. Here is a "Hind Sight Report"

It is always easy to look back and see what could have been done. If we look at some of the things that happened at disasterous gin fires, maybe we can plan some things to do and some not to do that will at least cut down the loss.

In every disasterous gin yard fire one thing is common, they start on unusually windy

The worst fires start on the windward side and move with the wind across the parking

Where Gins and parking areas are close together the worst loss sometimes happens on the near by parking area rather than on the one where the fire starts.

We find that the fire really gets out of control when someone moves the burning trailer through the parking lot in an effort to get the fire out of the

What can we do? Good House Keeping. Keep burrs and trash to a min-

2. Keep all trailers that are known to have fire in them from stopping at the Gin.

a. Sometimes a fire will start in a trailer on the way to the gin. If it has NOT broken out into the open. move the trailer away from the gin quickly and call a fire department. Encourage your customers not to move their trailers on extremely windy days.

b. If a trailer stops at at your gin with a fire that has broken in to the open, CALL A FIRE DEPART-MENT. DO NOT drag the trailer any farther than necessary to protect property. DO NOT drag it toward the parking area. DO NOT drag it any faster than you would drag one without a fire in it, preferably slower, as fire peels off of a trailer easier than unfired cotton and scatters worse. Try not to drag it toward the wind. Use any extinguishing agent available to slow the fire until the Fire Department arrives. The less you scatter the fire the easier it will be

to control. Make every one a fire sniffer. Cotton burning has it's own odor and can be smelled no matter how deep it is in a

a. Try to get your yard mensmoke conscious. Ask all of them to really try to smell cotton on fire as they work around the trailers. b. Ask your customer, if he parks his trailer, to

make one last trip around the trailer to smell for fire. 4. Park all trailers with enough room at the toung for a vehicle to hitch on and drag it off. Don't push toungs under another trailer.

IF A FIRE BREAKS IN TO THE OPEN ON A TRAILER TAKE ACTION QUICKLY AND ACT AS IF YOU KNOW IT IS GOING TOBE A DISAS-TER. (Everyone will be happy if it is not).

a. Call a Fire Depart-

ment.
b. BEGIN IMMEDIATE-LY to move the UNFIRED trailers on the WINDWARD side of the fired trailer. UNFIRED trailers can be moved as fast as practical as they only scatter unfired cotton.

c. DO NOT MOVE THE FIRED TRAILER, Moving a trailer with fire in it fans the fire and causes it to burn more freely, it scatters fire and sparks to every

trailer it passes.
d. USE ANY EXTINGUISHING AGENT
AVAILABLE TO SLOW THE FIRE UNTIL A FIRE DE-PARTMENT ARRIVES. If the trailer must be moved for some reason, move it slowly as practical and with the wind if possible, passing as few trailers as possible.

e. MOVE EVERY TRAIL-ER THAT IS TO THE WINDWARD SIDE OF THE FIRED TRAILER, START-ING WITH THE NEAREST. IF THE FIRE IS CONTROL-LED YOU CAN STOP MOVING TRAILERS BUT UNTIL IT IS, ACT AS IF EVERY ONE OF THEM WAS GOING TOBURN, Remem -

f. Park trailers from the windy side of the fire in a separate place so if they should have fire in them they will not catch the ones that are less likely to have

g. Pre-plan a place to go with your trailers. Move unfired trailers toward the wind and fired trailers with the wind.

When a fire starts ask every one who can to drag a trailer and have someone to tell them where to park. Start moving them immediately and act as if every trailer on the lot was going to burn. They will in about 10 or 15 minutes if some action is not taken.

If you are on the windward side of another gin that has a fire you may be in more danger than they are. Move your trailers before it is too late. A fertilizer nurse tank full

of water with one half gallon of liquid concentrated detergent in it makes a wonderful fire fighting apparatus.
Squeeze the hose to 3/4 to 1
inch with fittings. MAKE A LIST of anyone you can de-pend on to bring these tanks with motor driven pumps to your gin to aid in fire fighting. They will fill a Fire Truck, control spot fires, wet the trash and do all kinds of fire fighting work that does not require pressure. It takes about 4000 gallons of pressurized water to begin to control a yard fire that is just some what out of control. If you know of a large water tanker that will help, get it on the list.

These are some of our experiences with bad gin yard fires. I know you Gin managers can add a lot to these ideas. What I am trying to do is get it written down so we can accumulate experiences that will help everyone. A 154 barrel oil field water tanker pulled up beside our tanker pumper and furnished us all the water we could use on a burr catcher fire. We used 1-1/2 inch lines because we knew we were not going to run out of water before we could get things under con-trol. That is why we have learned that fertilizer tanks will spread water further than fire trucks. At one time we had a large water tanker with a spreader on the back to come to our aid. They drove all around the yard several times and wet the ground to

control the trash ites.

If you have any ideas please share them with us and we will appreciate them.
