New Directors Named To Board of SW Textiles

Three local men were elected to serve on the board of directors of Southwest Textiles during a stockholders meeting held last Thursday morning. Those elected were Billie Harrison, Joe Lovelace and David Pinson. They will serve with R. R. Struve, A. B. Reid, W. F. Wolf and Joe Thompson until the annual stockholders meeting in June.

Southwest Textiles recently launched into a modernization program by purchasing new open end spin-ning machinery invented in Europe. The first installation in the United States of this new revolutionary spinning equipment was made during 1972. Southwest Textiles is the first mill in Texas to install open end spinning. This new method of spinning fibers into yarn is totally unrelated to the conventional method which has been in use for two hundred years and longer. The Abernathy mill presently has two of these new frames in operation with a third one due shortly and four more to be installed in the spring of

1974. Tests made on yarn produced on the open end spinning is superior to yarn produced on the older system.

The machinery companies who make and sell open end spinning state that they are now from one to three years behind on deliveries. The spinning speed of these new frames is from three to five times faster than ring spinning. Less labor is required due to the elimination of certain processes that are necessary with the old meth-

Southwest Textiles will continue to use ring spinning until all open end frames are installed. Joe Thompson. general manager, reports that he has signed a contract with the Cambodian government to export yarn to Pnom Phen.

R. F. Littleton Meeting of School Trustees Is Held Services for Robert F. Lit-

School Adopts Quarter Unit Plan; Classes 9 to 4 p.m.

In regular January 7th meeting of the Abernathy Independent School District Board of Education, the board voted unanimously to comply with the Texas Education Agency regulations on the Quarter Unit Plan for classes beginning with the 1974-75 school year. This plan has been optional for two years but is now compulsory for present schools with limitations as set by the Texas Edu-

Cation Agency.

The credit system that has been in elfect for half a century will be changed beginning with the 1974 school year. Semesters will no longer be used. Instead of semesters, the 1974 school year will see the initiation of the Quarter Unit System replacing the 22 credits required for graduation. Seniors graduating next year will have quarter units recorded on their transcripts. A quarter unit may be earned by attendance in class for 55 hours during a 60 day period per school year In Abernathy, this will consist of three 60-day quarters for a total of 180 days of instruction. The recommendations for gradua tion will include 72 quarter units that may be in a 4 year period. Sixty of these units will be graded classes and will meet standards forentrance into any state supported college in the state of Texas.




