



An ordinance regulating the keeping of dogs and cats in the City of Abernathy, requiring the licensing and vaccination of all dogs and cats kept in the City of Abernathy; providing for the impounding of dogs and cats found running at large; providing for the impounding of dogs and cats that are not licensed and vaccinated; establishing a city dog and cat pound; providing for fees for the redemption of dogs and cats so impounded and the procedure for redeeming such dogs and cats; providing for the destruction of dogs and cats not so redeemed by the owner or purchaser at a sale by some person other than the City of Abernathy; prescribing the duties of the Chief of Po lice pertaining to the enforcement of this ordinance; providing for a dog and cat catcher; declaring barking dogs to be a nuisance; declaring it a nuisance and a misdemeanor to keep dogs and cats under certain conditions; providing for the killing of rabid or vicious dogs or cats; providing for the enforcement of this ordinance; providing for a severance clause; repealing all ordinances in conflict with this ordinance; and providing a penalty for the

SECTION 25: PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with any provisions or provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$1.00 and not more than \$100.00 and any person who shall aid, abet or assist in the violation of any provisions of this Ordinance shall be deem ed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$1.00 and not more than \$100.00.
