## Odum Gets 99 Years For Pope Murder

A jury in 4th District Court Thursday sentenced convicted murderer Frankie Odum, 27, to 99 years in prison for his part in the Nov. 15, 1973, slaying of Clem Eugene Pope, a Canyon cattle buyer.

The 7-man, 5-woman jury found Odum guilty of murder with malice on Wednesday. The jury deliberated an hour and 40 minutes Thursday before assessing the punishment.

The panel deliberated only 40 minutes Wednesday before returning the verdict of guilty. Pope was found stabbed to death on the roadside at E. 3rd and Whitaker.

Odum's uncle, Frank Fales, was convicted of robbery in connection with the murder, and is serving a life sentence as an habitual criminal. Fales testified Wednesday that he, and not his nephew, actually killed Pope, but the jury apparently did not believe the testimony.

### AHS VO AG NEWS

What's Happening In the Ag. Dept.?  
This is the first in a series of reports on what is happening in the Abernathy High School Vocational Agriculture Department.

What is available? The Ag. Department offers a variety of courses to fit the needs of the various grades. Vo-Ag. I is designed to introduce the student to the field of agriculture on a preliminary basis.

Some areas covered include: The Future Farmer Organization; parliamentary procedure; breeds of livestock (cattle, swine, sheep, horses, poultry, dairy cattle, etc.) and their selection; introductory shop (tool identification, woodworking and welding); range and pasture studies; soils; crop production and record keeping.

Students are required to have a project program consisting of a productive enterprise (crops or livestock). These projects may be used for stock shows, commercial production, or both. Records of expenses and income are carefully kept on the projects. These records will be used in determining winners of the many FFA Foundation Awards to be presented at the Annual Parent and Son Banquet and advanced degrees on the area and state level.

Freshman students are referred to as "greenhands" until they are initiated into the FFA organization, at which time they become "Chapter Farmers". The initiation ceremony consists of the greenhands being accepted into the organization by the chapter officers. This year's ceremony will be conducted Tues., Oct. 15.
