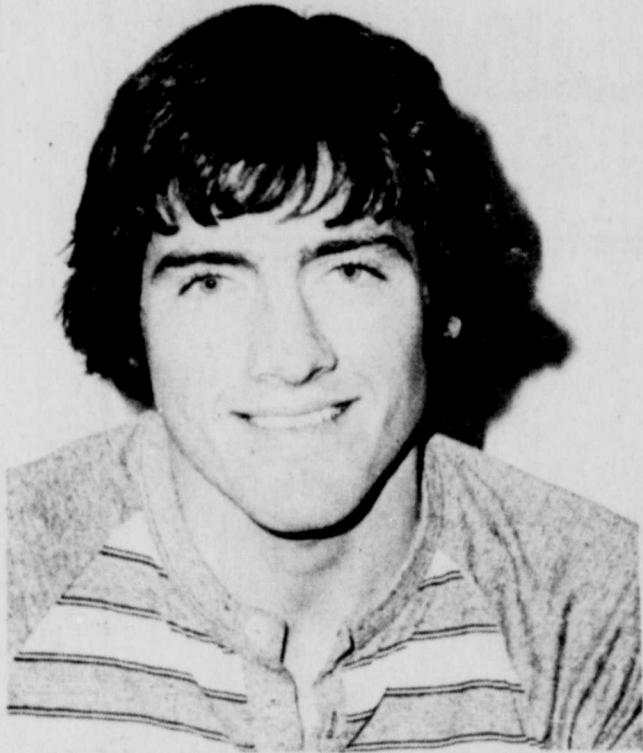

... From Basketball Family
LEVELLAND--Like father,
like son. And don't forget
Mother.

When it comes to basket-
ball, the above axiom ap-
plies to Dick Rogers of Aber-
nathy, a 20-year-old sopho-
more at South Plains College
and starter for the Texan
basketball team.

"Both my parents were
good basketball players in
high school," Rogers recall-
ed. "They encouraged me to
play."

His father, Kenneth, now
a farmer, and his mother,
Montez Rogers, "were named
to all-district teams in high
school. My dad was named
Most Valuable Player once
at a high school tournament,"
Rogers said.

The trophies and awards
his parents won during their
youth spurred their son to test
his mettle on the courts. "I
started playing basketball in
the eighth grade," he said.
He's been playing ever since.

While a student at Aber-
nathy High School, Rogers
earned basketball honors to
match those of his parents.
In his junior year, he received
an honorable mention in
both All-District and All-
South Plains.

Rogers was named to the
All-District and All-South
Plains teams during his senior
year and also was named
Player of the Year for the
All-South Plains team. He
made the third team in All-
State competition.

Rogers graduated from
Abernathy High School in
1973.

He now plays forward for
the SPC Texans and usually
scores in the double figures.
But its not all basketball
for him. Rogers sandwiches
in basketball practice along
with study for a 17-hour load
he is carrying this semester.

He also serves as president
of the student body. "I act
as a representative for the
College during many of its
functions, such as school as-
semblies and a Mexican
Fiesta held this November,"
Rogers said.

He was elected to the post
last spring.

As student body president,
Rogers is a member of the
Student Senate executive
council, a body which meets
once a month.

Rogers also is a member
of the P. E. Majors Club and
has helped coach a women's in-
tramural basketball team at
Gillespie Hall, a women's
residence hall at SPC.

Rogers is a candidate for
graduation in May from SPC
with a degree in physical ed-
ucation. "After that, I plan
to go to another school, con-
tinue to play basketball,"
Rogers said. He is uncertain

ACCIDENT PROMPTS CAUTION

It's that time of year again
when that old battery just
doesn't seem to have the zip
it used to--oh well--just
boost it off from another car.
CAREFUL--either, or both,
of those batteries could po-
tentially explode and blind
or seriously burn you. Espe-
cially if one of the batteries
has recently been on a charg-
er.

This example illustrates the
danger. Last Monday, the
High School Power Mechan-
ics class was making a simple
battery boost on a well en-
gine, when a cable sparked
and ignited battery fumes from
a battery which had been
recently charged. The battery
exploded and blew acid into
Robert Scott's eyes and
face. Luckily a water faucet
and baking soda were
available within 30 seconds.
Several other students and
Mr. Cox were sprayed, but
they only suffered ventilated
clothing from the acid.

Robert suffered a badly
burned eye, but, luckily, no
permanent damage. It can
happen to you!

Safety Rules to Observe
When Working with a Bat-
tery:

1. Don't use a match,
lighter, etc. to check the
water level in your battery.
 2. Don't arc across the
posts with a wrench or screw
driver to check the battery.
 3. Do flush eyes and skin
with fresh water, and soda if
available.
 4. Do contact a doctor
immediately.
 5. Do soak clothes in soda
and water mixture. A pint of
household ammonia in one
gallon of water, or soda and
water, will neutralize acid
spilled on floor.
 6. Hook-up booster bat-
teries from good battery to
dead battery (reduces the
chance of sparks.)

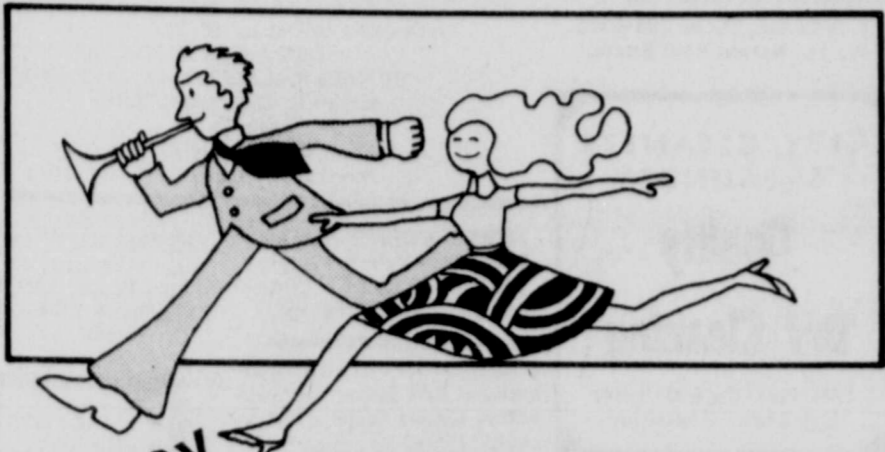

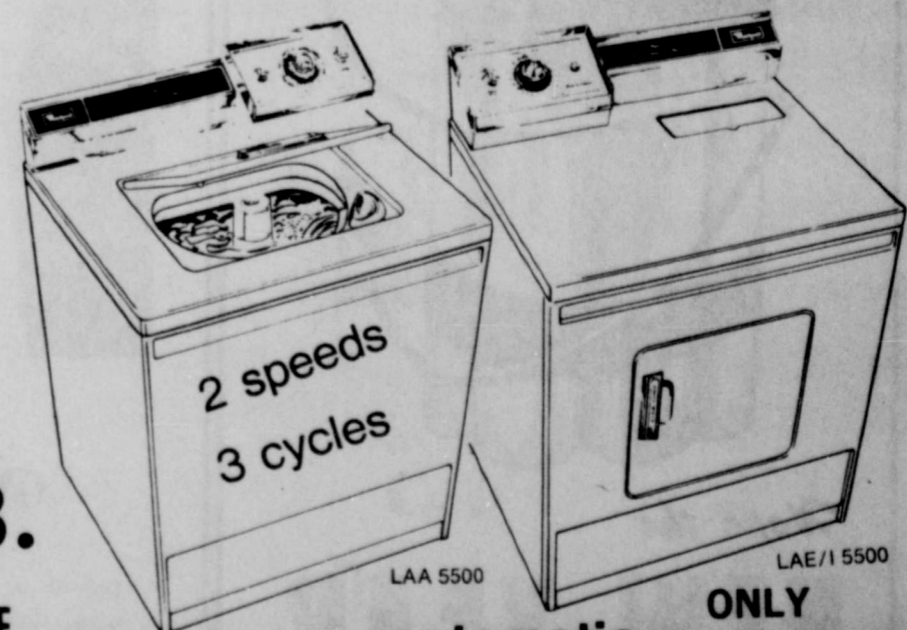
