David began playing football in Junior High when he played as a 7th and 8th grader. He also played as a Freshman. He made the Varsity Squads as a Sophomore and started as a defensive tackle. As a Junior he was selected as an All District defensive tackle and received Honorable Mention on the All South Plains Team. He was also selected to Who's Who in National Athletics as a Junior. During 55 scheduled games he never missed a game and is one of the two original players that started together in Junior High. When asked what he would remember most about football he replied, "Coach Zierlein—he is really a good guy—and of course the other players." CITY SALES TAX NETS \$8,073.31 FOR QUARTER ENDING SEPTEMBER 30TH

The Local Sales and Use Tax, commonly known as the Municipal Sales Tax, is a permissive tax which can be levied by any Texas City upon approval by a majority of its qualified voters. It is collected along with the State Sales Tax, by the Comptroller of Public Accounts and is remitted quarterly after deductions of statutory fees allowed for collection.

The Sales Tax check for the quarter ending September 30, 1974, has just been received from the State in the amount of \$8,073.31. The amount received for the same quarter in 1973 was \$9,319.93; however, total collections for the first three quarters for 1974 exceed those of 1973 by nearly \$2,000. The following is a comparison of

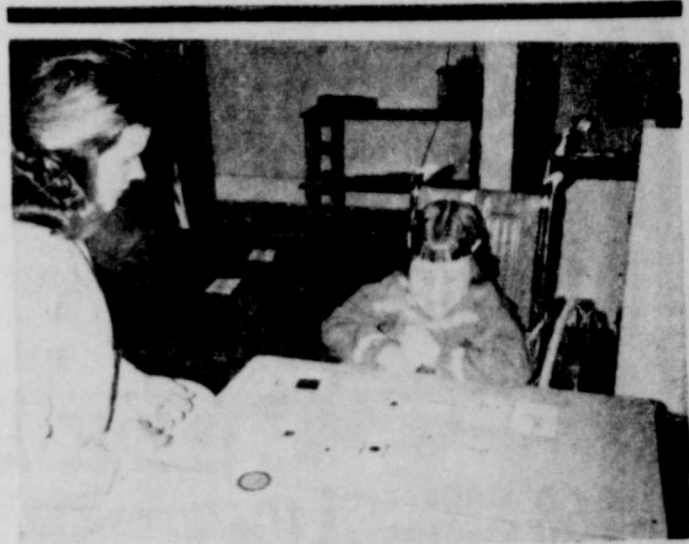
third quarter receipts for prior years: 1969--\$6,175.10; 1970--\$6,129.27; 1971--\$6,135.67; 1972--\$6,306.30; 1973--\$9,319.93; 1974--\$8,073.31.
