Next to this column is a reduced copy of a letter from the Texas State Department of Health, Austin, to Joe Chambers, owner and operator of Chamber's Funeral Home. The letter pertains to Joe's application for renewal of his permit to operate an ambulance.

After reading the letter, you will note that his vehicle and equipment actually EXCEEDED the requirements of the law. However, he is being denied renewal of his permit to operate an ambulance because the forms of application did not indicate compliance with the training requirements.

Joe has recently completed the standard course, but one of the requirements is that there must be two attendants, and one must have completed the prescribed First Aid course.

Actually, the ambulance service is a "service" which funeral homes have in the past offered as a sideline business. However, in recent years, because they were actually losing money on this service and because of state requirements, many of the funeral homes have given up such ambulance service.

It may be that Abernathy will need to acquire the services of "volunteer ambulance drivers. Hale Center has volunteers who are qualified first aid certificate holders who assist on necessary ambulance runs. Whatever the solution is, something needs to be done immediately. Interested citizens should take action to see that (1) volunteers are acquired to assist with local ambulance service, or (2) pressure is placed on state officials to relieve some of the added regulations under which such service personnel have been placed. In a small town, a local ambulance service may be the ONLY ambulance service we've got.

Don't get mad at Joe about this. He has been offering ambulance service here for a number of years, and as far as I know, there has never been any complaints. These added requirements are something the government come up with in recent years.

I always heard that a government that is big enough to give you something is also big enough to take it away! Might be something to that.

Dear Mr. Chambers:

Thank you for your application to renew your permit to operate a 1966 Ford ambulance.

In order to qualify for a permit in accordance with the provisions of Article 4590b, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, an ambulance must (a) carry the fifteen items of required equipment and (b) be accompanied by at least one person who has acquired, as a minimum, knowledge in first aid as prescribed and certified by the American Red Cross, evidenced by a certificate issued by the Texas State Department of Health.

It appears that your vehicle and equipment exceed the requirements of the law. However, your personnel training information forms do not indicate compliance with the training requirements. Therefore, we are unable to renew your permit until you have updated your training.

Please understand that we are eager to help you to meet these requirements, and feel free to ask for our assistance.

A report from Mayor Pete Thompson concerning the approval by the Lubbock County Commissioners to increase the amount paid to the Abernathy Voluntary Fire Department for out-of-town Lubbock County calls was heard. Meeting recently with the Lubbock County Commissioners, Abernathy and other town officials asked for an increase in such payments. Previously, for answering a fire call within Lubbock

County, the local fire department received \$117 from Lubbock. That figure has now been increased to \$250 per call answered.

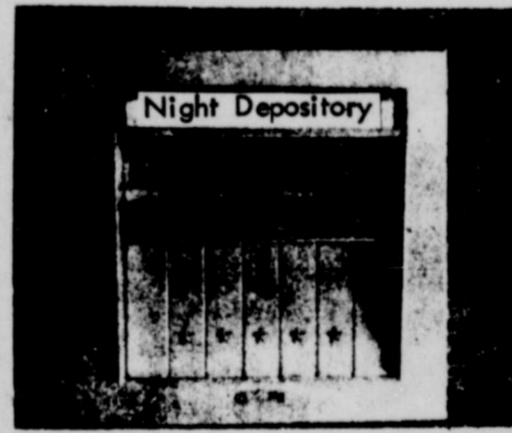
