

FIRE INSURANCE INCREASE FOR COMMERCIAL RISKS ONLY

BAIRD — The following article will perhaps help you to understand a recent story that was published in an area newspaper concerning the insurance rates for our city. This newspaper has asked one of our local insurance firms and a member of the Baird Volunteer Fire Department to explain the article, and Felix Manion was so kind to do so.

The fire insurance key rate for Baird is up one cent over the previous year according to the State Board of Insurance.

Key rate is determined by charging a city for certain fire hazards, and giving credit for certain fire prevention equipment or practices.

The one cent increase was caused by the Fire Department's reserve pumper or hose truck being out of date. All other charges and credits were not chang-

This increase applies to commercial risks only, and will not affect fire premiums on dwellings. An increase in fire record credit from 15 to 20 percent will cause a reduction in all fire premiums in the City of Baird. Baird, to date, has the lowest key rate of any town in Callahan County.




