Plaque At School To Honor Memory Of Mrs. Moorhead

The Board of Education of the Abernathy Independent School District met in regular session on Monday, December 6, 1976, at 7:30 p.m. in the board room at the high school.

The Board examined and approved bills for the previous month. The following reports were reviewed and approved: budget progress report for the first one-fourth of the school year; and a tax collection report showing that 90.59% of the current roll has been collected; it was pointed out that December is the last month for receiving the 1% discount and all taxes that are not paid by January 31st, 1977 will become delinquent.

Other reports were the enrollment report revealing 1163 students, an increase of 15 from the October 30th report. The lunchroom report showed that approximately 627 students per day are eating in the cafeteria.

The financial statement for the 1976 Football Season was presented. Total income for all games, varsity, junior varsity, and junior high, was \$9,685.

The board voted to erect a plaque in the Elementary School for dedication to the memory of Beverly Moorhead. This plaque will be placed in the elementary school library.

The legislative developments included Agricultural Use Adjustments which were presented and explained to the board as a part of the Governor's study on tax values of Texas Property.

The board was given copies of a letter stating that the Academic Center had been recommended by the Texas Education Agency as an exemplary school to the United States and International Offices of Education.

Approval was given for the National Honor Society to be permitted an educational tour during the third quarter of the school year. It is planned for the tour to allow the students to see the Texas Legislative Program in action.

The Board also authorized studies for improvement of Custodial Services and telephone communications improvement.

The next regular meeting of the board will be January 3, 1977. Those in attendance at this meeting were: Billie Harrison, President; Bob Riley, Vice-president; David Pinson, Secretary; Lon Carmickle; Richard Howard; Dan Fondy; and Jerry Oswalt. Also attending were: Dr. Delwin Webb, Superintendent and Mr. Earl Carter, Business Manager.

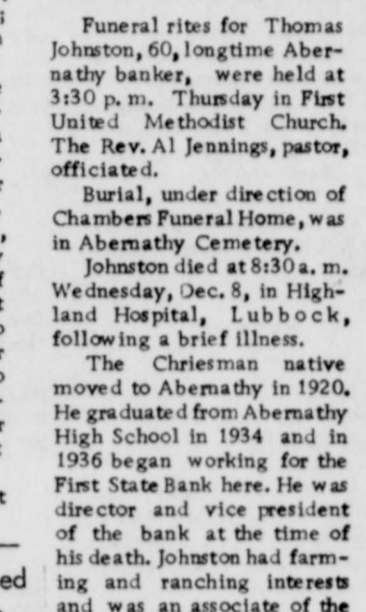

Survivors include one son, Mason Hawkins of Lubbock and two grandsons, Jerry and Randy.

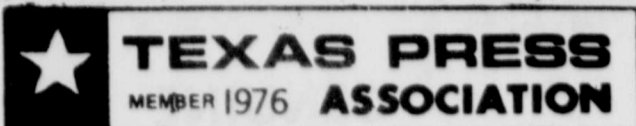

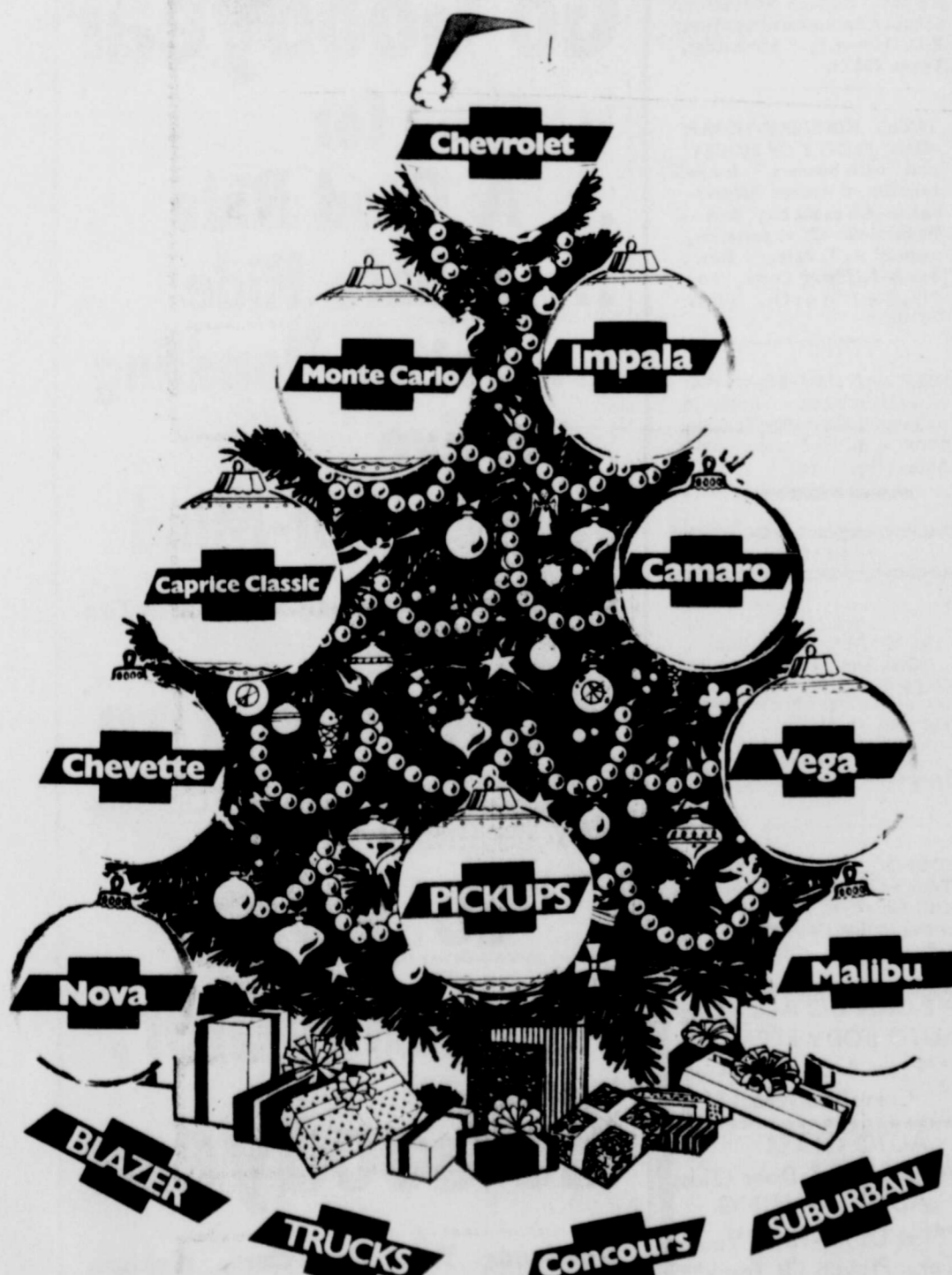

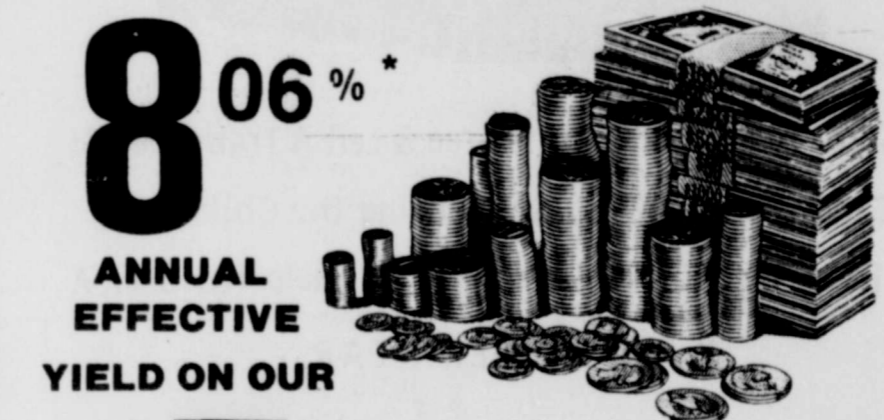
