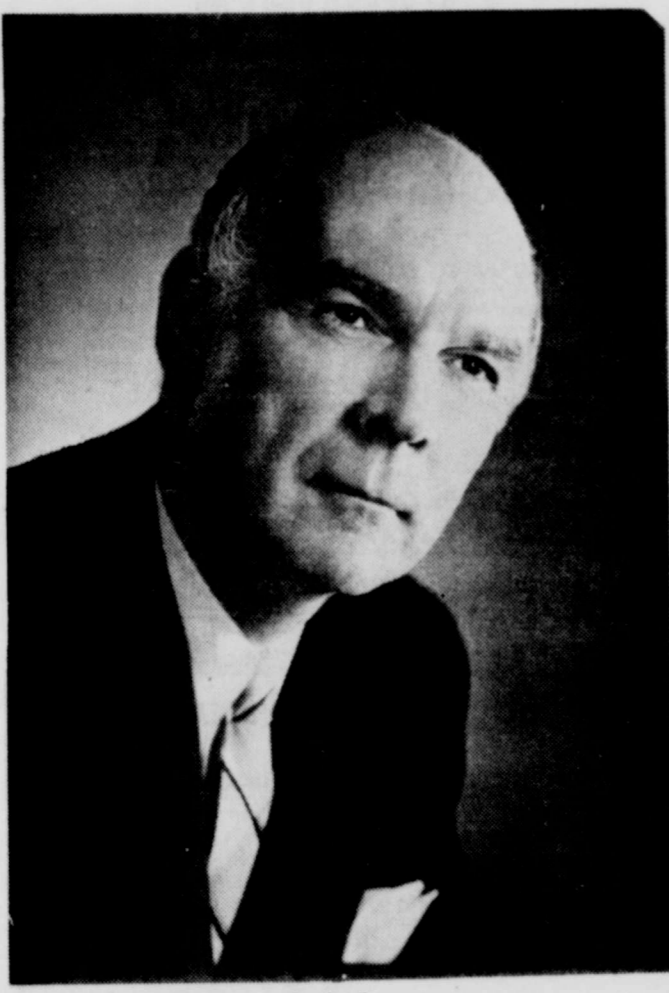




Outstanding citizens to be revealed at banquet

The incumbents were R. C. Bufe, Sam Storrs and Perry Loompy.

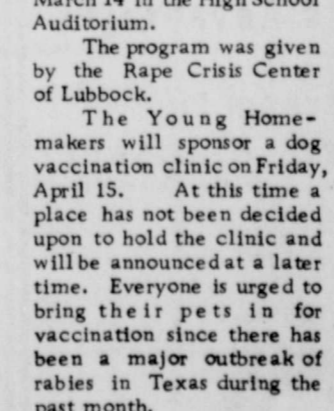



NEW IH PARTS SYSTEM STARTS AT DEALERSHIPS

By joining a new parts service, International Harvester dealer Struve Implement Company, Abernathy now is able to quickly locate and order agricultural equipment parts for his farmer-customer from anywhere in the nation, the Kansas City IH office announced.

This new concept, called the "Doloris" service, operates through the dealer's computer parts terminal. That is, he is linked to the company's gigantic computer complex near Chicago and, therefore, parts distribution centers and dealers across the United States.

Briefly, here's how the Doloris service works:

Let's say a farmer steps up to the parts counter and asks for a specific part which is not in the dealer's inventory. The dealer's parts man then goes to the computer terminal and plugs in the part number into the Doloris system. Seconds later, the printout shows where the part may be located and in what quantity--from anywhere in the United States. Another punch of the terminal's keys orders that part and sends it on the way to the dealer and his farmer-customer.

Not only does this system save ordering time, it also cuts down on expenses by showing the most efficient way to help.

According to Wilbur R. Stringer, manager of IH's Dallas Agricultural Equipment Region which covers this area, "the new Doloris service is yet another way our dealer helps his farmer-customer avoid downtime by waiting for critical parts."





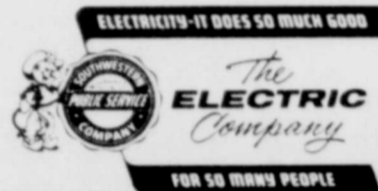
