The South Plains Homemaker Service is a program designed to meet your community needs. Through this program, mature, dependable homemakers are employed and trained to provide in-home care services to elderly and disabled persons. Many older individuals desire to remain in their own homes, and with such homemaker services as menu planning, and meal preparation, escort to the doctor or beauty shop, personal care and grooming assistance, help with laundry and light housekeeping, and even situation and companionship, an alternative to nursing home or institutional care is made available. The services are provided at a nominal fee according to a client's monthly income and ability to pay The homemakers who provide services are local residents, trained and supervised in performing the inhome care duties. They participate in a paraprofessional training program covering a variety of topics on aging, including physiollogy and psychology of aging, personal care, Red Cross first aid, nutrition related to elderly needs, consumer education, safety in the home, and sources of assistance for disabled and older persons. This enables the homemaker to expand educational and employment opportunities, and provide a beneficial service in their own community. 

Texas Almanac, which listed



Using the water, light and gas meter method of estimating population, Abernathy should have over 3,000 inhabitants now--1977. The highway signs still list the local population as 2, 625 which probably was the 1970 census report.
