DIES OF BURNS IN SAN ANTONIO

Six-year-old Raquel V. Salazar of Hale Center died Friday in a San Antonio hospital after her week-long bout to recover from third-degree burns covering 90 percent of her body.

Brooke Army Medical Center officials said the girl died about 9 a.m. Friday, just over a week after she was rushed to the San Antonio burn center for emergency treatment from Lubbock's Methodist Hospital.

Authorities said the girl was injured when a pickup truck in which she was riding lost a rear wheel and went out of control, overturned and exploded into flames March 23 about four miles north of Abernathy on U.S. 87.

Funeral arrangements were set for 4 p.m. Monday in the First Baptist Church in San Diego, with burial following in the San Diego Cemetery under direction of the Mauro P. Garcia Funeral Home.

Survivors include her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Adan Salazar of Hale Center; a brother, Adan, Jr., of the home; a sister, Maria of the home; and her maternal grandmother, Juanita Vidal of San Diego.

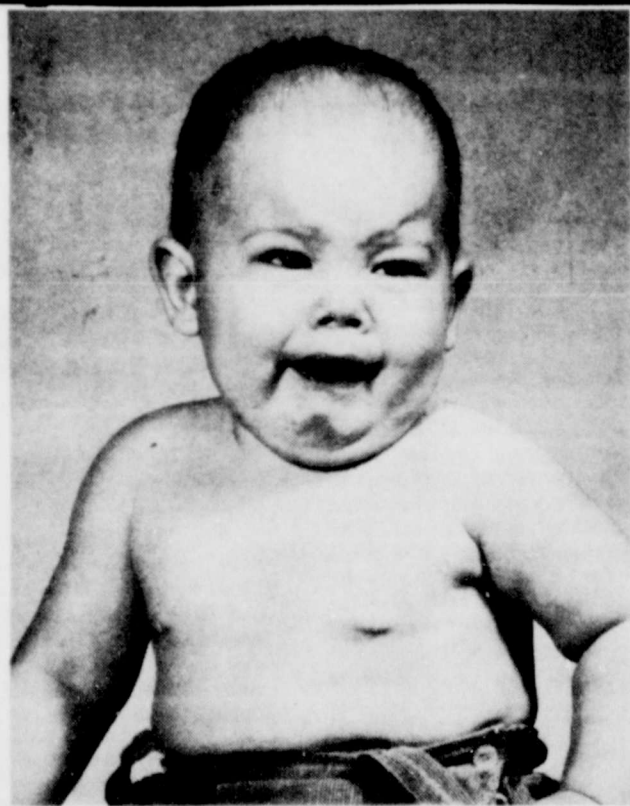

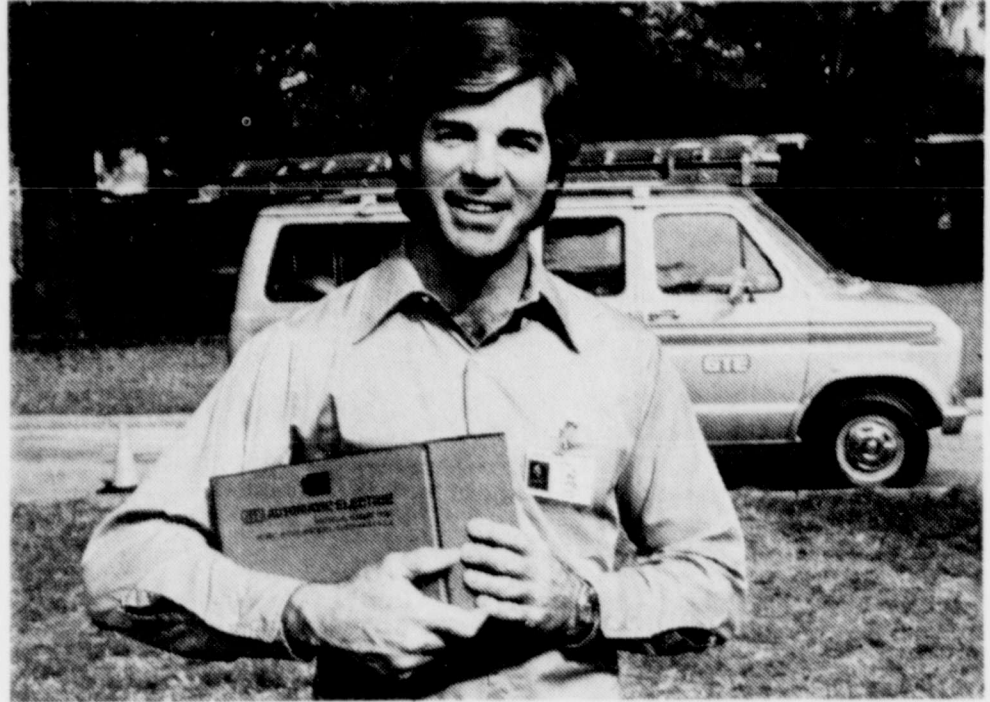
