


one ele's shop and the out buildings, which had shops in them in past years, can someday be used again. The house was built some-

The house was acquired by J. C. Wooldridge Lumber Company which be came Higginbotham Bartlett. It housed the lumber yard managers and their families. Hugh Vaughn, a former manager, says it's a well built house but getting pretty old now. He moved his family into it in 1947 and built two more rooms onto the back. During renovation, his mother-in law from Hale Center insisted that he install closets everywhere possible. It has lots of storage space Dale and Ann Thickstun tranferred to Abernathy from Lubbock 10 years ago. Dale is manager of Pioneer Natural Gas Company. He is a native of Indiana; she grew up in Lubbock. Their laughter, Juliana, is a nurse at Heath Sciences Hospital in Lubbock.
