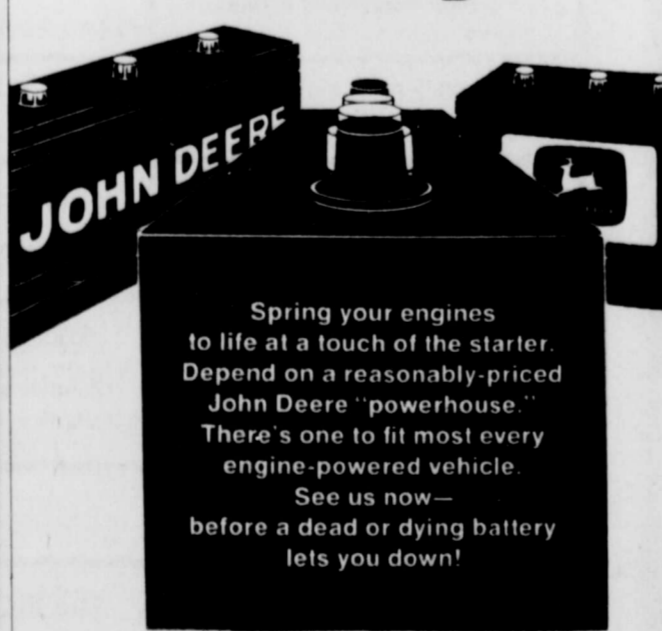

# 'Lopes Down Idalou

Idalou puresure to the goal line. Cuevas' kick tied the score at 7-7.

Idalou mishandled the ball on the kickoff, and Gary Smith picked it up at the 5 and made it out to the 12 before being downed by several Antelopes. Hobbs carried for 3 yards to the 15, and on the next play Bryant took a pitch out around right end and sailed down the sideline for 85 yards and an apparant TD. However, as he passed the Idalou bench, some of his teammates stepped out onto the field to watch his progress down the sideline and got into the way of an official following the play and the ref threw his flag, nullifying the play and penalizing the Cats 5 yards for "illegal substitution." Two plays later the Cats were still on their own 10 yard line, and Bryant punted out to his own 48.

With just over 2 minutes left in the second quarter, the Lopes put their well-oiled machine into motion. Lindsey slanted off-tackle for 15 yards and a first down at the 33, Heath lost a yard, then hit McGuire for 19 yards and another first at the 15 yard line. Heath kept left, but slipped down for a yard loss, then on the next play threw a quick toss to McGuire for 11 yards and a first with just 4 1/2 yards between them and a TD. Sanders hit the line twice, the second time going in from 4 yards out for the go-ahead score. Cuevas' kick was off to the right, but the Lopes were out front 13-7.

Their lead was short-lived, however, as the Wildcats took the short kick on their own 38 and went 62 yards in the remaining 33 seconds, capping the drive as the gun sounded with Bryant's 28 yard reception in the end zone for the TD. Lindsey raced in to block the extra point attempt, and the score was knotted at 13-13 until the final 9 seconds of the game.

Ken Sanders brought the second half kickoff out from the 8 to the 35, but a piling on penalty against Idalou moved the ball to the 49. An offside penalty against Idalou two plays later saved a pass interception, then Lindsey burst through for 15 yards to the 34. The Lopes moved to the 18 on runs by Lindsey and Dunn, but a loss, an incomplete pass and a 15 yard penalty moved the Lopes back to the 35. Lindsey went around right end for 11 yards to the 24, and on 4th down Cuevas attempted a 41 yard field goal which had the distance but was slightly off to the right.

The Wildcats took over at the 24 and moved out to the Abernathy 45 before again having to punt, this one going into the endzone. The Lopes took possession at the 20 and moved out to their 47 before punting back to Idalou with only a few seconds remaining in the third period. Bryant took the kick on his own 18, yet treated trying to avoid the Lopez rush and was nailed hard by Lindsey at the 10. Morrison and Rusty Powell stopped Hobbs for only a yard gain, then on the first play of the fourth quarter, Hobbs fumbled and alert Victor Dees recovered for the Lopes on the Idalou 14.

A yard loss by McCune, a one yard gain by Heath, a five yard delay of game

penalty and a five yard gain by Lindsey brought up 4th and 10 and Cuevas again attempted a field goal, this one from the 21, and again the ball was off to the right. The Lopes dug in after Idalou took over on the 20 and almost held, but the Cats made a first down by inches on a 4th down try, then picked up 3 more first downs while moving to the Abernathy 26. Idalou was caught holding and moved back to the 41. A pass intended for Bryant was almost intercepted by Kelly Mills. Another pass fell incomplete, and Barrera intercepted a 3rd down pass, but was out of bounds, and Bryant got off a 40 yard punt which went out of bounds at the Abernathy 1 yard line.

With only 3:29 remaining, and with the poise of pros, the Lopes moved the ball downfield, steadily but surely. Sanders failed to gain on the first play, then Heath hit Barrera for 7 yards out to the 8. On 3rd and 3, Lindsey hit the middle of the line but fumbled and guard Buddy Bowen fell on the ball for a 3 yard gain and a first down. Heath over-shot Barrera on 1st down, Lindsey hit the middle for 3 yards, then McGuire made a leaping catch for a Heath pass and 23 yards with 1:21 left to play. Heath handed to Dunn on a draw play and the halfback ziped to the 50 for 13 yards and another 1st down.

From there a pass fell incomplete, then Dunn and Lindsey ended up in almost the same spot at the same time for a pass from Heath, which Dunn caught for 15 yards, but Lindsey helped tackle him, apparently thinking the ball had been intercepted. McCune came back in and picked up 12 yards and another 1st down on a draw.

On 1st down from the 23, Heath had to get rid of the ball quickly and missed McGuire. Lindsey ran for 3, then Dunn went 11 yards on a draw, putting the ball on the 9 with only 9 seconds remaining. That's when Cuevas came through with the game-winning field goal.

In the excitement, the timekeeper apparently forgot to start the clock on the play, and with still 9 seconds following the play, Coach Aldridge tried to reason with the officials. But they tued a deaf ear and threw a flag, moving the Lopes back to their 25 yard line for the kickoff. Cuevas put the wetball on the ground and booted the slippery pigskin downfield. It was mishandled by two or three Idalou players before sure-handed Barrera fell on the ball for Abernathy at the 50 yard line, eliminating any further threat by Idalou.

Game time here Friday night in the Abernathy-Floydada contest is 7:30. This, too, could prove to be a close contest.
