Abernathy Sets Trustee Voting For April 5th

Qualified voters in the Abernathy Independent School District will go to the polls in Abernathy City Hall Saturday, April 5th to elect two school trustees.

Leland Phillips will be the election judge in the trustee balloting. Polls will open at 7 a. m. and close at 7 p. m.

Terms of Billie Harrison, president of the School Board, and Don McKenzie expire this year.

There has been a change in the trustee election method starting this year. Candidates file for a specific place against trustees whose terms expire.

Don McKenzie is seeking re-election, and those who have filed for McKenzie's place on the School Board are Laurin W. Prather, and L. A. Johnson.

Billie Harrison is seeking re-election, and Bud Rhodes has filed for membership on the

Voters to Name City Aldermen Here April 5

The qualified voters in the City of Abernathy will ballot Saturday, April 5, in an election to name three Aldermen on the City Council. Voting will be in Abernathy City Hall from 7 a. m. to 7 p. m., April 5. Zelma Hale will be election judge.

Absentee balloting also in City Hall, begins Monday, March 17, and ends April 1. City Secretary Otelia Clement will be in charge of absentee balloting. (In some elections, persons 65 or over may vote absentee even though they plan to be at home on election day.) (Check this with Otelia, who also will be in charge of absentee voting for school trustees.)

Terms of three City Aldermen expire this year. They are Harold Stillwell, Charles Nelson and Jerry Givens. They will be candidates for re-election. Other names on the city ballot for Alderman positions will be those of Lamar McKenzie, Jerry C. Adams and Carl Johnson.

Holdover members of the City Council are Mayor J. Pete Thompson and Aldermen Hoppy Toler and Harold G. Thompson.

Hours To Change At Dump Ground

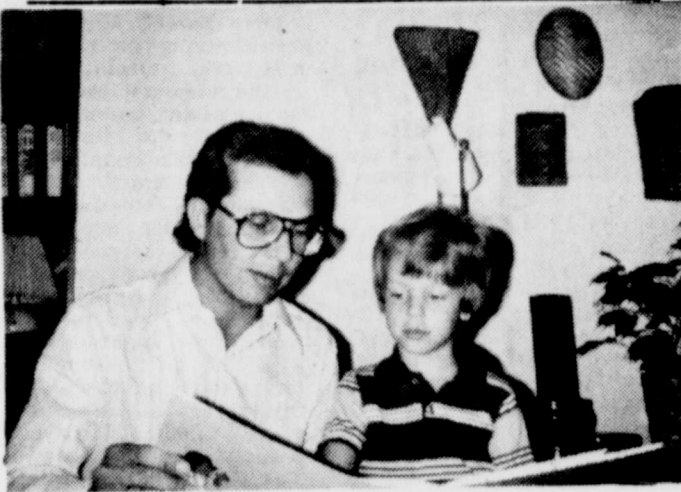

SOUTHWEST CORN BORER SURVEY:

The southwestern corn borer is alive and well on the High Plains. We at Palmer and Associates have recently been surveying random tilled and untilled corn fields east of Plainview to the Olton-Hart area to determine degrees of winter survival for southwestern corn borer. Winter survival is a good indicator of predicting the potential problem with this pest for the 1980 corn growing season.

The larval stage overwinters in the base of the corn stubble crown which may be three to five inches below the soil surface if left untilled. The soil and corn stalk surrounding the larvae offer an excellent overwintering site due to the insulation effect. Fields of corn followed by wheat are even more conducive since the beds are reshaped, pushing more soil around the corn stubble.

Our survey included three tillage situations: untilled and grazed-untilled, rebedded and sown with wheat, and properly tilled corn stubble. In the first situation, there was a thirty to fifty percent survival rate of overwintering larvae. The second type yielded thirty-five to fifty percent surviving borers. Properly tilled stubble showed no signs of overwintering borers. Tilling pulls the stubble above ground, releases soil adhering to the plant crown and decreases the insulating effect on the larval overwintering habitat. Cold weather is a natural controlling agent for these overwintering larvae.

While conducting our survey, we discovered evidence of pupation. The pupae is the transformation stage from the overwintering larvae to the adult. What this suggests is early emergence of the moth this year; possibly as early as May 1. The Olton-Plainview area has an average emergence date of June 1 as seen from this same survey in past years.

The bottom line for this survey's results is that 1980 corn adjacent to these high overwintering populations could have economically damaging and early first generation borer infestations. High densities of first generation larvae can be very detrimental and may result in "dead heart". This is caused by consumption or disruption of the meristematic tissue (growing point) inside the whorl. Young corn may be killed or fruiting greatly reduced due to this type of injury.

Manipulation of plantings dates has been very helpful in the past to lessen the severity of first generation borers and subsequently reduce the attractiveness of corn to borers throughout the remainder of the season. Corn planted as early in March as possible up to, and no later than, April 7 will reduce attractiveness since the corn plants will be more mature and less succulent at times of high borer density. Also, the more mature corn will be better able to resist infestation leading to a reduced need for chemical control, an important cost factor in corn production. Lodging of infested plants if it does occur, may be delayed until around September 15. Corn should be harvested by this date which allows a margin of safety before lodging can occur.

TEXAS AG RECEIPTS UP---Cash receipts from agricultural products reached a new high in Texas last year, according to Texas Agricultural Extension Service estimates. They totaled \$9.6 billion, up from \$7.9 billion in 1978. The big jump was due to a bumper cotton crop, along with good prices, plus an excellent beef market. Cash receipts from beef totaled \$4.1 billion while cotton receipts hit the \$1.6 billion mark. Total livestock receipts are estimated at \$5.3 billion while the crop sector added cash receipts of \$3.9 billion. Agriculturally related areas such as timber, hunting, fishing and horses added another \$474 million.

Right before He died, Jesus cried out, "It is finished." He had finished the task which He was born unto this earth to do--that of dying for sinners.

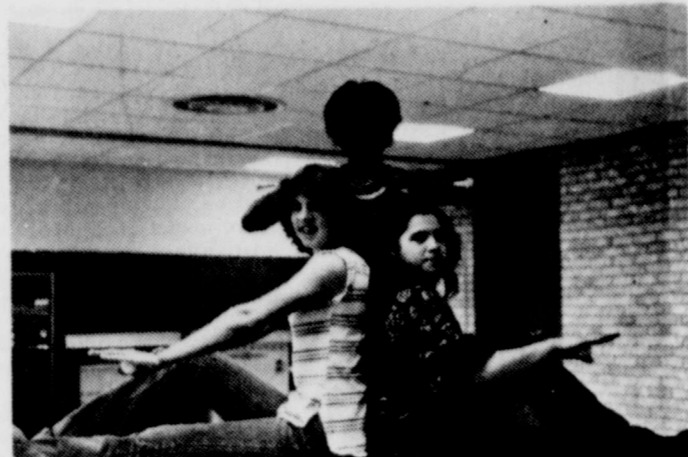

Tax Pamphlet Is Available At New Deal City Hall

Patty Pledger, tax assessor-collector for the city of New Deal, today announced the availability of a new 12-page pamphlet which may help local residents save on their property taxes. According to Patty Pledger, the pamphlet explains how the property tax system in Texas operates, and highlights possible tax savings available to citizens. The publication was developed by the State Property Tax Board in accordance with Senate Bill 621, passed by the Texas Legislature in 1979. Information in the pamphlet is applicable to property taxes collected by all levels of local government, including counties, cities and school districts. Patty Pledger noted that homeowners are eligible for a \$2,000,000 city home-ownership exemption from the value of their property. Additionally, owners of agricultural land have the option of having such property taxed at its productive rather than market value. April 30th, 1980 is the rendition deadline for the City of New Deal, and Patty Pledger urged citizens to render their property and apply for exemptions or productivity values for which they may qualify before that date.
