
Raymond 'Gerald' Danford

ed and will extend through spring 2010 for temporary assignments, most lasting eight weeks to a few months.

The Dallas Regional Census Center is expected to hire about 111,000 workers to complete its task in its region, which includes Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi.





Put Your Tax Refund to Work

It's Tax Refund Season again. This year, of you're going to get a check from your Uncle Sam, why not put it to work to help you meet

your financial goals? Last year, the average tax refund was more than \$2,700, according to the IRS. The size of your refund, or whether you will get one at all, depends on your individual circumstances. But if you are going to get a refund, plan the more money you'll have ahead for what you'll do with it. Here are a few possibili-

• Pay down some debts. In these difficult economic times, you may be carrying a higher debt load that usual. If so, you may want to use some of your refund to pay down some of these debts. The lower your debt payments, the better your cash flow and

to invest for the future, • Build an emergency fund.

If you don't have an emergency fund containing six to 12 months' worth of living expenses, you could use your tax refund to start one. Without such a fund, you may find yourself constantly dipping into your long-term investments to pay for unexpected costs, such as a new furnace or an expensive car repair. Keep your emergency fund in a liquid account - one that you don't draw on for your day-to-day expenses.

· Help fund your IRA. In 2010, you can put in up to \$5,000 to your IRA. Consequently, if you receive at \$2,700 refund, you'd have more than half of what you need to fully fund your IRA for the year. (If you're 50 or older, however, you can contribute up to \$6,000 per year.) You might not think that your \$2,700 would make much of a difference in the long run. But by investing your refund and giving it many years of growth potential, you could end up with a sizable amount.

Consider the following: If you put \$2,700 in you IRA, and you earned, on average, seven percent a year for 30 years, you'd end up with about \$20,000, even if you never invested another dime. If you put \$2,700 every year in that same IRA, again earning an average seven percent annual return, you'd end up with more that \$270,000 after 30 years. (These examples are hypothetical illustrations and do not represent any current available investments.)

You'd eventually have to pay taxes on your earnings, typically when you make withdrawals at retirement. And if you qualified for a Roth IRA, you'd never have to pay taxes on your earnings, as long as you had your account for at least five years




