Distress program for wheat producers

COLLEGE STATION, Texas.- Juan M. Garcia, Texas State Executive Director of USDA's Farm Service Agency announced the availability of the distress loan program for wheat producers in Concho, Fisher, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Taylor and Tom Green Counties.

"Dropping wheat prices and lack of available storage have Texas wheat farmers facing a tough situation with their 2010 crop. FSA has implemented the distress loan program to give wheat farmers flexibility to market their crops and see if the wheat market rebound," said Garcia.

The 90-day distress loans allow producers to pledge their commodity as loan collateral and receive a loan on 75 percent of their eligible quantity.

Distress loans mature not later than 90 days after the date the loan is disbursed and must be repaid at principal, plus interest. If a producer can find an approved storage facility within the 90-day distress loan period, the commodity can be rolled into a regular nonrecourse loan for up to nine months, including the time the commodity was placed in the distress loan.

"Because the 2010 crop production is so high and storage opportunities are so limited, we anticipate additional requests to make distress loans available in other counties and the Texas State FSA Committee will address those on a county-bycounty basis," Garcia said.

A treasure in your backyard

Last week Runnels County became the center of a statewide effort to rescue an endangered species

INTERS, Texas.-Talk about endangered species usually makes people think about a remote and lonely continent, with rare animals such as white tigers or whales on the edge of extinction, but this tag can also be attached to a plant in your neighborhood.


The Callirhoe scabriuscula, commonly known as Texas poppy-mallow, is a rare and unique plant only found in four counties in central Texas; this federally protected species grows, blooms and reproduces along the Colorado River sand banks, about three miles from the main stream.

A growing colony of the Texas poppy-mallow was recently discovered in Runnels County on privately owned land, and relocated by conservationists from the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower center, Angelo State University and Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

This colony of 52 plants was growing in the sandy soil on a property located off Highway 67, west of County Road 259, just ahead from the Evergreen Cemetery, in Ballinger.

The plants, no different from a regular weed for the untrained eye, have a very unique and special beauty when you take a closer look at the fuscia as it colors a few lucky square feet of landscape for a couple of months each year.

Due to the few specimens found, very little is known about the Texas poppy mallow, but thanks to the relocation and reproduction efforts it could soon become the

subject of greater research. "There are more than 300,000 different species of flowers and some of them have properties we don't even dream of," says Minnette Marr, a plant conservationist with the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center, associated with the University of Texas at Austin.

"To illustrate the possibilities just think about the Pacific yew, a tree from which scientists were able to develop Taxol, a substance used to treat ovarian. breast and lung cancer."

Most of the Texas poppymallow population is under Texas Parks and Wildlife supervision, and when new construction was planned for the property where the poppy was located, every effort was made to conserve the flower by moving it to a new location.

Back at the Wildflower Center, the plants will be propagated to collect enough seeds to store on site for use by TPWD and other organizations when they restore native habitat.

Michael and Leah Goetz, owners of the Runnels County property, run a nearby greenhouse and are familiar with plant care as well as nature conservation.

"We knew the Texas poppymallows were there, and we are giving our best effort to save the species," says Leah.

Once the construction project is finished some of the seeds will be brought back to the site to be planted in a more organized, and controlled pattern that allows its co-existence with the owners of the property.

This species is perenni-

al, which means that the same plant grows back for an undetermined number of years, but not enough research has been done to know about the whole life cycle or reproduction habits of this plant.

Bonnie Amos, a member of the ASU Biology Department since 1987, has been working with Texas poppy-mallows for years, and the Concho Valley native knows about the delicate beauty of the local flora.

"This species is very unique, most of the land in Texas is privately owned and we depend on the public awareness for its preservation. It is a very rare plant that grows only in Mitchell, Coke, Concho and Runnels counties, and no other place in the world," said Amos.



The Texas Poppy-mallow

- Scientific name: Callirhoe scabriuscula
- **Endangered since: 1981**
- Size: Two feet and 6 inches tall or more.
- Habitat: Wind-blown, riverdeposited deep sands near the upper Colorado River.
- Range: Coke, Mitchell, Concho and Runnels counties.
- Reproduction: Red to purple cup-shaped flowers, about 1/2 in. long and 3/4 in. wide.
- Population: Only 10 known populations in Coke, Mitchell, and Runnels Counties.
- Some facts: Texas poppymallow differs from the common winecup because the stems are stiffly erect and thick like a pencil. The leaves of Texas poppy-mallow have irregularly-shaped

The poppy-mallow usually blooms from May to June. Bees use the flowers for nectar, pollen, and shelter, and help the plants reproduce by spreading pollen between

The flowers open each morning 2-3 hours after sunrise and close right before sunset. Within 30-90 minutes after pollination, the flowers close forever. If not pollinated, flowers continue to open each morning for 6-8 days.



Located in Runnels

County, nine miles south of Ballinger, the Multer Bros. Farm was founded by Adam Multer, and is currently owned by his grandsons Roman and Alfred Multer.

Adam Multer was born in Neustadt, Germany, and came to America to establish a new life. He and his wife Mary were married in Westphalia and on February 8, 1909, purchased 240 acres from Charlie Hanz. They build the fences and started to break the land.

Their first house was a small wooden shack and a dug-out. Several years later the family of eight moved to a two-story house.

In 1945, when Adam

retired, his son Leo acquired the land. After Leo's passing, in 1987, his two sons, Roman and Alfred acquired the farm.



In 1909 the land was used to crop cotton and milo and to raise livestock as well. The Multers still crop cotton and milo.
