BALLINGER, Texas.- Early Voting for the November 2nd General Election will be conducted October 18th through October 29th at the County Clerk's Office from 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

There will also be a Special Election regarding the creation of a Runnels County Emergency District No. 1 for eligible voters that reside in the portions of the Miles Independent School District or Bronte Independent School District which are located within Runnels County and which

are not located within the Ballinger Memorial Hospital District or the North Runnels Hospital District. This proposition will be at the bottom of the General Election ballot.

Any qualified voter is eligible to vote early by personal appearance.

The last day to receive an application to vote by mail is October 26.

Sample ballots are available at the County Clerk's Office in Ballinger, the Tax Branch Office in Winters and the Miles City Hall.

CHANGE IS INEVITABLE

In spite of the fact that a team of employees may create an excellent work environment, the fact of life is that sometimes opportunities arise for an employee which may compel him or her to change jobs. Our small Police Department in Winters is no exception. As a Chief of Police, it is important for me to understand the reasons for which an employee might move to another location.

Recently one of our officers, Cody Wheeler, came to my office and spoke with me about an opportunity he had. Cody said that the opportunity would be excellent for his law enforcement career, provide more substantively for his family, and afford him the opportunity to continue his formal college education. He asked what I thought of the idea and wanted to know if I would support his efforts to better himself.

Now no chief wants to lose a good officer, because good officers are hard to find, but no chief worth his salt would hold an employee back from making a move that is positive and in the officer's best interest. Most rural Police departments cannot offer a clear, long-term, and upwardly mobile career path and young officers seeking to build their career will often stay long enough to learn the ropes and then move on. This is not a bad trade-off for the city because we get young enthusiastic officers who are eager to learn and serve. However, there is the reality of the fact they will more likely than not move on someday to seek the next challenge and step forward in their career.

Cody has been with us for almost two years and he has grown as an officer while serving the public with honor and integrity. We appreciate his service, and we will miss him as a full-time officer at the department. Cody has agreed to stay on as a reserve officer here and assist us as his schedule allows.

We are currently in the process of interviewing applicants in order to fill the position vacated by Officer Wheeler. We have established a multi-faceted interview panel that includes members of the community, law enforcement, ministry, and the city council. We believe the approach will help us find the most qualified applicant to serve the folks here in Winters. I am proud to serve with our team here in Winters and we ask for your prayers as we seek out the newest member of the team.



Firefighters visit Head Start

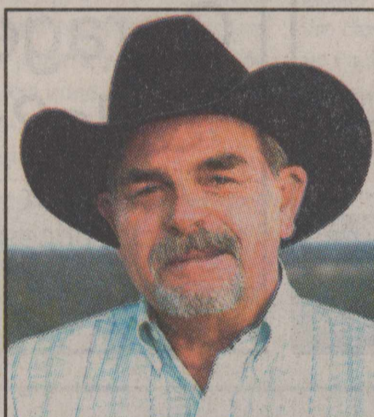

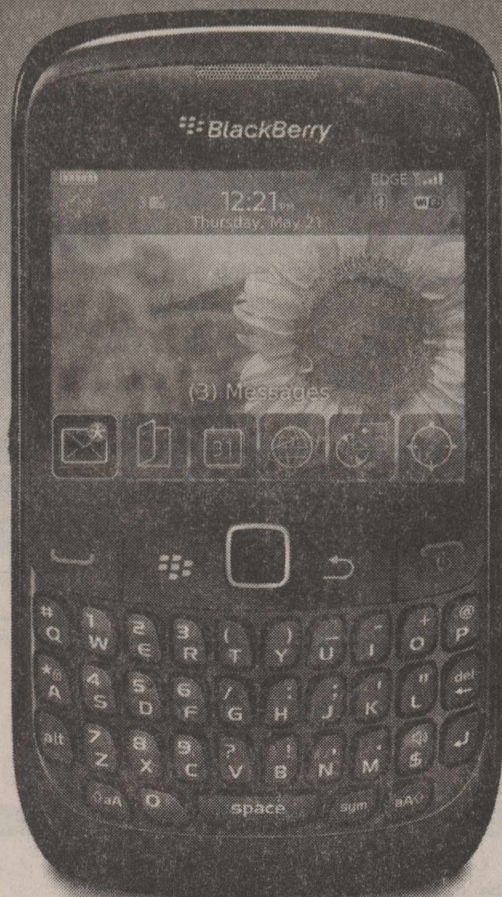

'Qualifications do matter'

Meet the candidates

The November 2 General Election is almost here, and for the Runnel County it will represent a very important change. After 15 years as County Judge Marilyn Egan is ready for retirement. Ray Anderson, former Municipal Judge and city employee chose to participate with the Democratic Party. The primary election and the runoff held earlier this year left Barry Hilliard, a local farmer and rancher as the Republican candidate.

Prior to the Runnels County election, The Winters Enterprise presents an inside view with both candidates, their vision of the county, their achievements and goals.

Concerned about the senior citizens and with a long record in public service, Raymond "Ray" Anderson presents himself to the Runnels County voters as a man of experience, qualifications and an independent running with the Democratic Party.

"My main concern is the Senior Citizen Center, our senior citizens are so important to us and is really important that we keep those senior citizen centers going", said Anderson.

According to the Democrat the meal served at the center is the only one that many people get during the week.

"A complement to that is Meals on Wheels, this program not only provides the food and necessities for a lot of the elderly folks, but also represents the only social contact that those individuals have."

The money needed to keep those programs going is increasing every year. In 2009 the county government had to contribute \$65,000 to keep these centers going and this year the amount was \$97,000.

"That is probably where my experience with large businesses and money would be a benefit, hopefully we don't have to cutback from any other program, but this is the number one priority for me", said Anderson.

The Democratic candidate said that when it comes down to an election the voters should consider each candidates qualifications.

"I think qualifications really do count, if I had decided back in 1995 that I wanted to be a county Judge I couldn't

have picked better jobs to qualify me for this job."

Anderson spent 10 years as a Municipal Judge and five years in city government administration where he worked for grants and emergency management, he is actually a certified flood plan manager.

"Most of my qualifications are things that I have done within the last 15 years," he said.

Anderson retired from the city a few years ago but he still goes and has some contact with the local government.

When he decided to become a candidate, he started to get more involved in the county administration, attending to county meetings workshops and budget workshops.

"I want to be a good manager, when it comes to tax money it seems like federal an state continuously find ways to take our money and move it to federal or state resources, one of the few ways we have to get our money back is grants."

Anderson said the county must become more proactive on grants.

Anderson defines himself as an independent, the last Democratic president he voted for is Jimmy Carter, he also chose

Ross Perot in the Presidential race and now he decided to run on the Democratic Party so his voice can be heard.

"When a Judge makes a decision nobody asks what would a Republican have done."

The Republican candidate has spent the nights studying and trying to prepare for the duties of becoming the new County Judge.

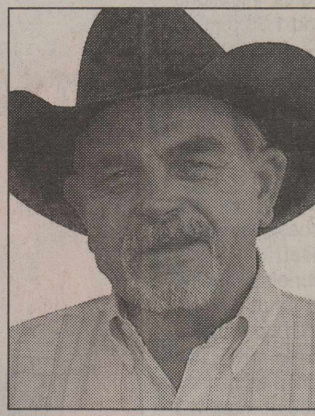
The Republican primary held on March and the April runoff helped Hilliard to gain more experience in the political process, and for November 2 he will be doing just minor adjustments to his campaign.

Blizzards are back

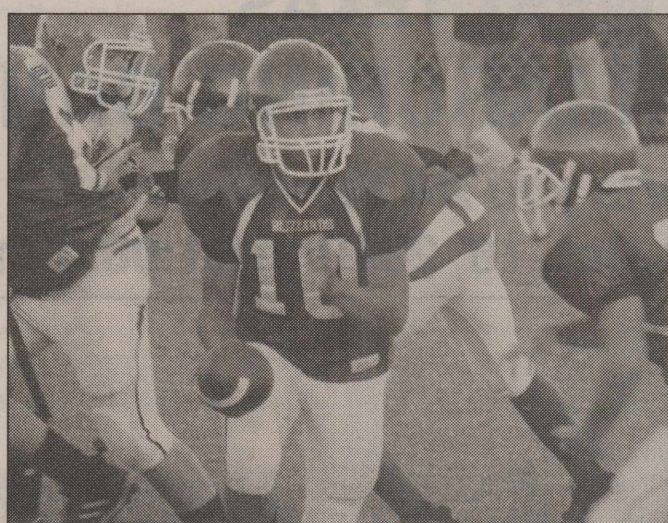

WINTERS, Texas.- Friday night in Eldorado appeared to get started a lot like a not so distant bad memory. However as things turned out the Blizzards finally took charge of the action and rolled to another victory with a 32-20 win that at times resembled a prize fight with both fighters standing toe to toe and taking each other's best shots and still standing until one staggers. Neither one willing to blink.

It would be the home town Eagles who would deliver the first blow. Taking the opening kickoff and starting at their own 25 they would put together an impressive 14 play drive that never left the ground. The Eagles never put the ball in the air as they marched the ball the distance and used up more than half of the first quarter. It was with 5:33 left in the first that Eagle running back Jaymie Oharrow finished it off with a 1 yard run. The extra point failed and the score was 6-0 Eldorado.

EJ Hendricks would return the kickoff to the Blizzard 38 and the visitors would get right to work on a 6 play drive that would end with Cristian Sandoval busting up the middle for 16 yards and the score. Highlights of the drive included a 22 yard completion from Riley Ripley to Devin Martinez on 3rd and 6. Orlando Rodriguez's extra point was good and the Blizzards would take a lead they would not relinquish, 7-6.

The kickoff set the Eagles up at their own 23 and gave the Blizzard defense the opening they needed as the BBWC attitude returned. After an initial first down Cannon Bryan

and Steven Nava would combine on a tackle for loss of 8 bringing up 3rd and 17 where a loss of one would force the punt at 4th and 18 as the first quarter ended with the Blizzards up 7-6.

The two would trade punts as the second quarter began leaving the Blizzards near midfield. Angel Barron would get 6 on first down then Ripley would find Sandoval for a 44 yard touchdown. Rodriguez would prove good on the extra point and the Blizzards moved to a 14-6 lead with 5:36 left in the half.

The Eagles set up at their own 37 and promptly put the ball on the ground where CJ Johnson found it giving the Blizzards the ball at the Eagle 37. The Blizzards would not capitalize on the turnover after a nine play drive when Ripley was sacked for a 2 yard loss on 4th and nine giving the home team the ball at their own 14 with 1:30 left in the half. The first snap would prove disastrous for the Eagles as the ball ended up in the end zone where they fell on it giving the Blizzards a safety and setting the score at 16-6.

The free kick from the 20 would set the Blizzards up with a short field at the 35

with 1:19 left in the half. Nine plays later the Blizzards would face 2-10 with 6 seconds left on the clock. With the field goal team lined up Rodriguez, out of the hold of Hayden Nitsch, would continue his perfect night with a 27 yard field goal and give the visitors a 19-6 lead to take into the locker room.

The Blizzards would receive the second half kickoff and proceed to put together an 8 play drive that would end with Ripley finding Sandoval for 47 yards and the touchdown. Rodriguez split the uprights and gave the Blizzards a 26-6 comfortable lead with 8:15 left in the quarter.

The ensuing kickoff put the ball at the Eagle 25 as the home team put together a quick drive culminating in an 11 yard touchdown run with 7:01 left. The ep was good and the comfort zone had been reduced to 26-13.

The kickoff and return set the Blizzards up at their own 29. Facing 4th and 17 the Blizzards would force to punt giving the Eagles a short field at the 37. Six plays later a 1 yard touchdown run and extra point would reduce the comfort zone to a shaky lead at 26-20 with 1:20 left in the 3rd quarter.

With 1:14 left in the 3rd the Blizzard offense would hit the field with the realization that what seemed an insurmountable lead was now looking shaky. On first down Sandoval ripped off 35 yards to the Eagle 30 as the 3rd quarter ended. Three plays later Barron would find the end zone from 5 yards out. With the score at 32 to 20 the Blizzards elected to go for two. The Ripley pass would fall to the ground incomplete leaving the score at 32-20 with 11:24 left in the contest.

With time running out the Eagles would put together one more threat. Setting up at their own 35 and put together a 10 play 4 first down drive. Six play into the drive they were set up 1st and goal at the 9. EJ Hendricks would make it much more difficult with a tackle for loss of 7 bringing up 2nd and goal from the 16. An incomplete pass on 2nd and goal combined with a nine yard gain on 3rd and goal brought up 4th and goal from the 7. The BBWC would rise to the occasion and flush the Eagle qb out where Angel Barron would end the threat and turn the ball over on downs at the Blizzard five yard line.

With the major objective to run off the remaining time the Blizzards kept it simple and put together two first downs and ticking off any chance that the Eagles had for a comeback. Facing fourth and nine the visitors would punt after taking a knee to get the clock running. The punt would put the Eagles at the Blizzard 43 with little time left. A pass completion (their first of the game) moved the ball but left the clock running. As the last seconds ticked off the Blizzards would take home the win with a 32-20 knockout of the Eldorado Eagles.

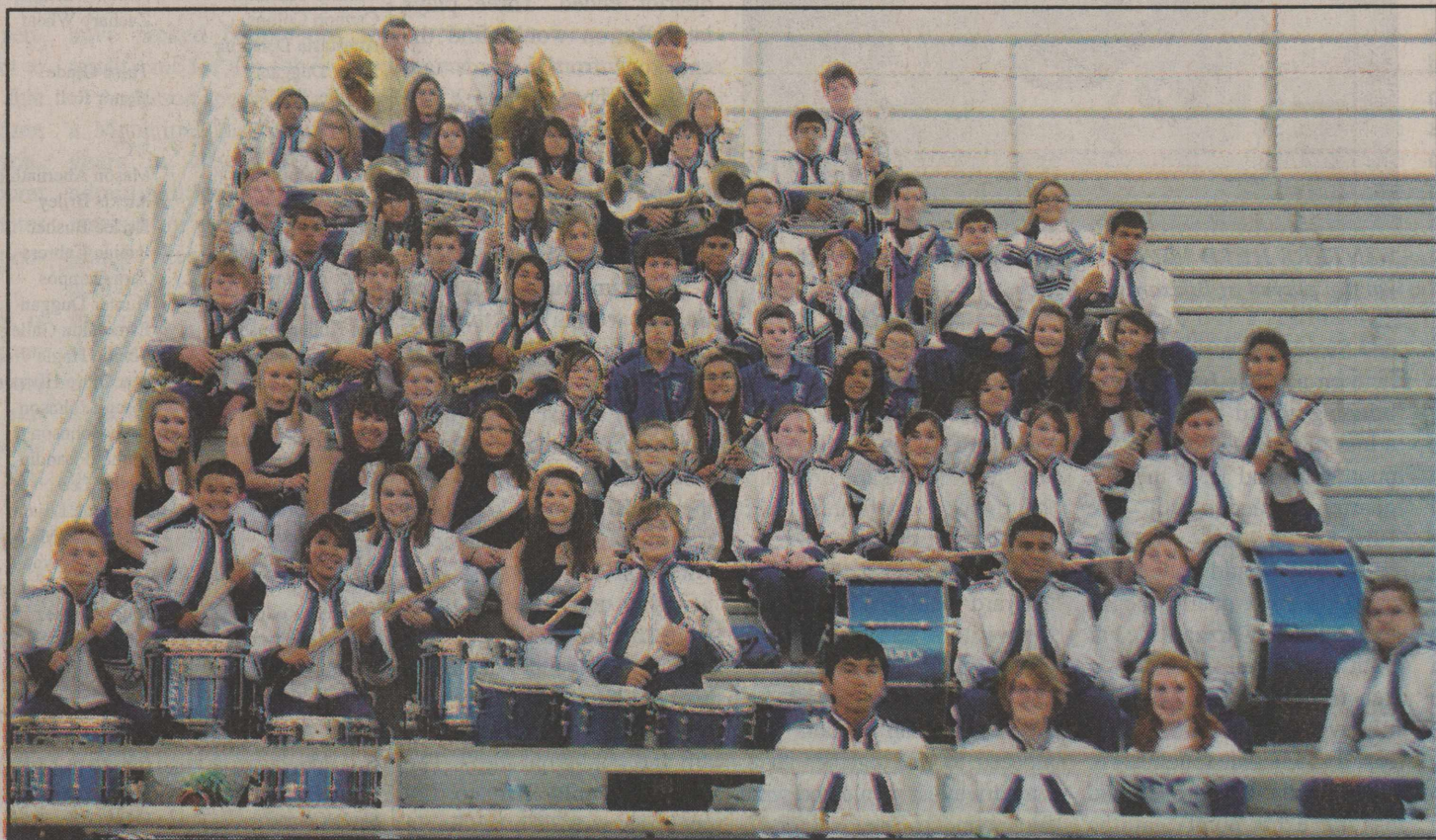

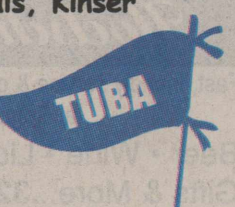

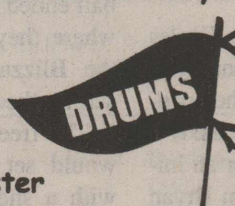

In addition to rate revisions, APT seeks to adopt a Rate Schedule CGS - Mid-Tex to be applicable solely to Atmos Energy Corp., Mid-Tex Division. This Rate Schedule will, consistent with the Commission's Final Order Nunc Pro Tunc in GUD No. 9869, include recovery of ad valorem taxes related to Mid-Tex's working gas in storage, as well as the return and related taxes on Mid-Tex's working gas in storage, the Accumulated Deferred Income Tax for UNICAP Section 263A and the WACOG to FIFO change related to the Mid-Tex working gas in storage. A second Rate Schedule CGS - Other is proposed for all other city gate customers that is identical to the proposed Rate Schedule CGS - Mid-Tex with the exception of the requested changes related to Mid-Tex's working gas in storage. Other proposed tariff changes include a new Rider REV, a new Rider WGIS, and minor wording changes in the other existing Riders applicable to service provided by APT.
