
There will be a curb service, orders to-go and dine-in. Chili will be served along with corn bread, a variety of desserts and iced tea.

SAN ANGELO - The Texas AgriLife Extension Service's ninth Concho Valley Cotton Conference is set for 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. March 22 in the San Angelo Convention

"This year's program will deal with a whole host of cotton-related topics important to our region," said Rick Minzenmayer, AgriLife Extension entomologist for Runnels and Tom Green counties.

"We'll be looking at everything from crop insurance changes to management of verticillium wilt," he said. "We'll also have some good

information on cotton root rot along with updates from several cotton industry representatives. So if you raise cotton, this conference should sure lead your 'must do' list.'

The event will include a trade show that will remain open throughout the day.

The Southern Rolling

Plains Cotton Growers Association will hold its annual meeting at the end of the conference beginning at 3:20 p.m. The meeting will include an election of officers and a look at the current cotton economic situation and outlook.

Other conference topics

will include: hedging and contracting cotton in 2011, deep nitrogen availability, consequences of using products off-label, importance of field maps of cotton root rot affected acres, using remote sensing imagery to monitor cotton root rot, groundbased technologies for cotton root rot control and 2010 evaluation of Flutriafol for control of cotton root rot.

The biennial conference is sponsored by AgriLife Extension's Runnels/Tom **Green Integrated Pest** Management Committee, the Tom Green and **Runnels County Crops** Committees, the Southern **Rolling Plains Cotton**





Byler dedication raising awareness

BALLINGER - The dedication ceremony held last week in Ballinger to praise Army Specialist Justin Byler, one of the city's sons fallen at war, triggered a reaction among area communities, claiming similar honors for their heroes.

The San Angelo Standard Times, an influential member of the E.W. Scripps newspapers, echoed the memorial in their editorial, recalling the dedication of the sixmile stretch of Highway

158, north of Ballinger. According to the newspaper's "Our Opinion"

editorial, Ballinger and Runnels County "should be commended for honoring Byler and for making a clear and permanent statement that his sacrifice will not be forgotten."

William Justin Byler, a Ballinger High School Class of 2000 graduate, was killed on October 31. 2005 during his second tour in Iraq. He was 23 years old.

The editorial lists a series of war casualties of people of San Angelo and Tom Green County, such as Elias Torres, a Marine lance corporal from Veribest, or Jason Poindexter, a Marine private from San Angelo,

both of whom were killed in Iraq in 2004, or for Army First Sergeant Lawrence D. Ezell, who lived in San Angelo and died in Baghdad in 2008. All of them have been mourned and honored, but none have a permanent memorial.

The dedication ceremony for Army Specialist William Justin Byler was held on Friday, February 25 led by the Texas Department of Transportation, sponsored by the City of Ballinger and Runnels County, and supported by the Ballinger High School and the whole community.


