Winters High School extended a special thank you to the organizations and individuals who made the scholarship opportunities available. The faculty, students, and parents thanked them for the continued support provided.

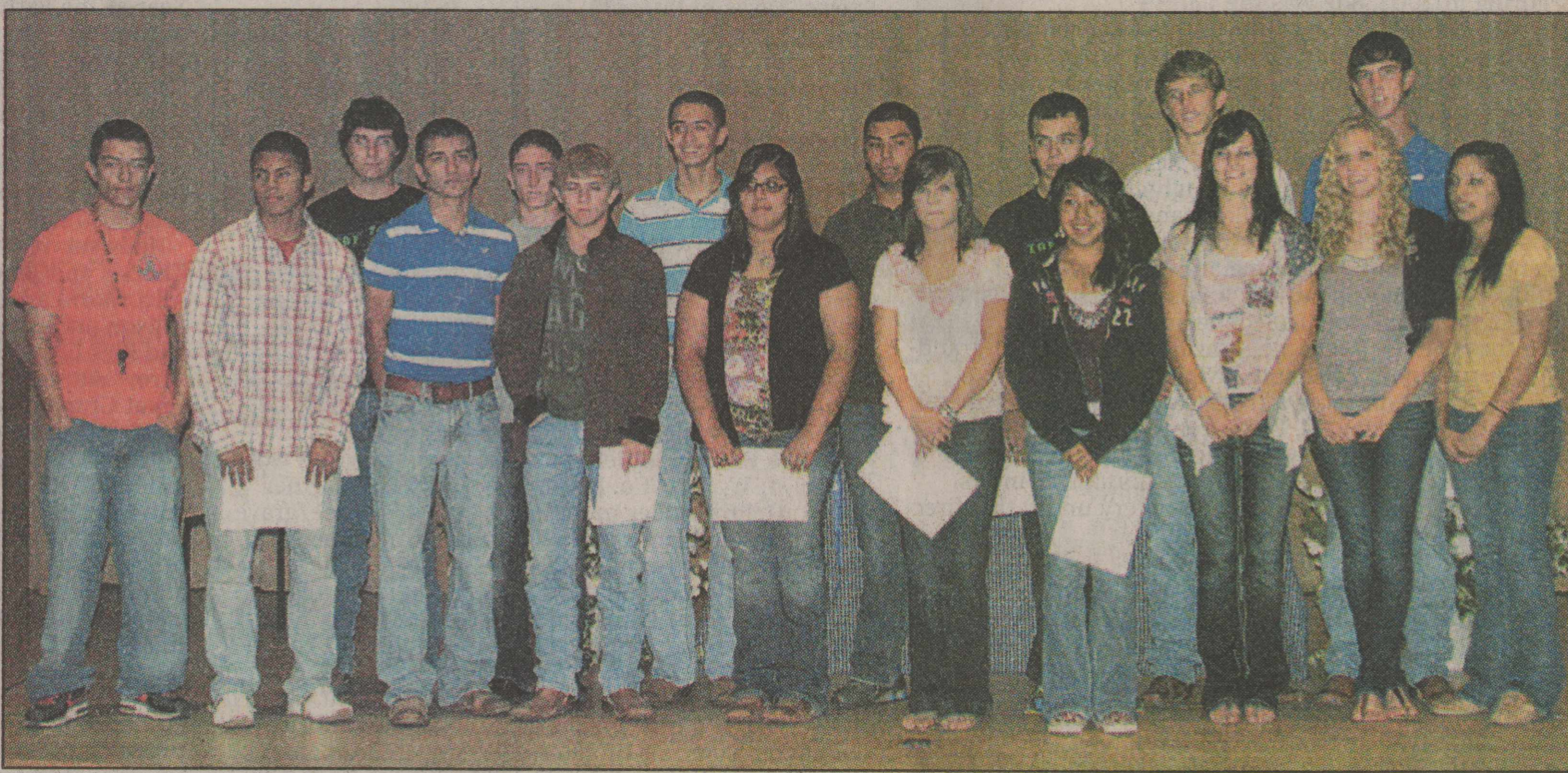

Hot pursuit in Winters

Hunter Dakota Kennedy, a 19-year-old resident of Rotan, was arrested last Thursday, May 18, after a pursuit that started in Ballinger, and ended up in County Road 162, in Taylor County passing through downtown Winters at nearly 100 mph.

The Winters Police Department received an alert about a car going northbound on Highway 83, and officer Randall Davis started a traffic stop when he spotted the vehicle in southern Main Street.

Kennedy fled the scene when officer Davis descended from his vehicle and the pursuit ended in Taylor County, with several law enforcement agencies mounting an operation after the suspect abandoned the wrecked vehicle.

Kennedy was charged with stealing a beer case in Ballinger, and a felony for evading the arrest. The suspect was taken to Runnels County Jail, in Ballinger.



City schedules special meeting

WINTERS - The Winters City Council held a regular meeting last Monday, May 23, 2011. Among agenda items Aldermen appointed Jim Lincycomb as the new Mayor Pro-tem. Sage Diller, with EHT, presented a status report for the Wastewater Lift Station Project funded by TWDB and TCDP grant, the station is 90 percent complete and should be done by June 6.

Diller also presented a requirement made by the Texas Water Development Board for an archaeological survey at the Wastewater Lift Station Project site.

TWDB required the archaeological survey on regards of an arrowhead found at the project site. The survey cost will range between \$2,700 if no further discoveries are made and up to \$5,000 if there is a new archaeological finding.

EHT's representative presented a report on the water line replacement project funded by USDA Rural Development, the contract is about 30 percent done and the installation of the new meters will begin on August 19 or 20.

The Winters City Council approved a petition made by Robert Searls to increase the Allied Waste rate 6.2 percent. Aldermen approved budget amendments regarding the new/used telephone system, City Manager Alan Hollander. Budget amendments on Friday, a resolution to transfer

funds 3000 and out of Judge Moore funding total 6000

City Manager Alan Hollander was appointed as representative for Home Program and a resolution was passed to establish the Police Department fiduciary responsibilities on the Winters City Council. According to this resolution the Winters' Mayor and City Council will oversight the Police Department budget.

The council scheduled June 20 the first day for the budget workshop

pertaining the next fiscal year.

A called meeting was scheduled for Friday, May 27, with two agenda items included, at the meeting the City Council will discuss regarding a partial pay request for Rural Development Water Distribution System Project, and regarding a budget amendment for the phone system.

An executive session is also scheduled to discuss matters concerning Chief of Police employment contract.

Commissioners Court ban 'bottle rockets'

WINTERS - Runnels County Commissioners Court held a regular meeting last Tuesday, May 24, with several items for discussion and action. Items discussed included a presentation by Will Patterson, of DTS Satellite Phone, regarding satellite telephone for use during emergencies.

Commissioners approved a motion to pursue a contract to provide the Runnels County Sheriff's Office with satellite phones to use in case of an emergency.

These phones would allow law enforcement officers to maintain communication with their peers regardless of the wind, dust storms and geographical location.

Runnels County Clerk Elesa Ocker presented an estimate of the election cost for Precinct 2 during

the next 10 years, Runnels County Commissioners evaluated the possibility of postponing the re-districting of the county.

According to results presented in a previous Commissioners Court by an Austin law firm, re-districting in Runnels County would be necessary only in this Precinct. The estimated re-districting cost ranges from \$10,000 to \$15,000.

Runnels County Commissioners agreed to look for several options with the law firm.

Commissioners Court appointed and approved the Salary Grievance Committee for 2011, they also analyzed the possibility of a new cell phone policy for county employees, given that some of the employees use their own cell phones to conduct official business, no action was taken on this item at this

Runnels, Coleman counties will have communications drill

WINTERS - Law enforcement agencies of Runnels and Coleman counties will have a joint exercise this Thursday, May 26, with a communication drill involving a prison break, an outbreak and hostages taken in an area school starting a 8 a.m.

This is a limited functional communications exercise with simulations intended to be used for travel time, deployments and disease incubation time in order to achieve the desired response and communication actions or the exercise.

Law enforcement agencies such as Ballinger and Winters Police Departments, Runnels County Sheriff's Office, area hospitals, first responders, Fire departments and some schools will be participating in the exercise.

State and federal agencies will be coordinating the actions, and the drill will be carried out only as a simulated exercise.

"It is important for the people to know that this is only a drill, because some of the neighbors in Runnels County will be listening to this exercise in their scanners and we don't want them to be scared, it will be only a simulated exercise," said Runnels County Judge Barry Hilliard.

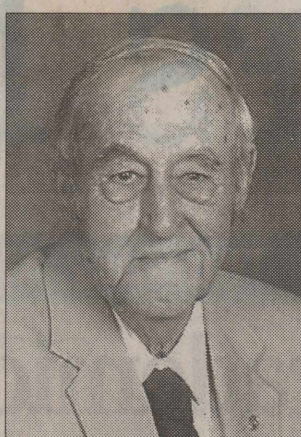

He also volunteered as a mentor for New Horizons Children's Ranch where he loved to take the kids to parades and pull their float. He will be remembered for his hamburger trailer that he volunteered and cooked for many events including the Early Athletic Association and the Little League. He was awarded the Supporter of the Year at the Early Athletic Banquet. He was a member of the Early First United Methodist Church and had been attending Emanuel Chapel United Methodist Church in Brownwood where his son, Benny is pastor.

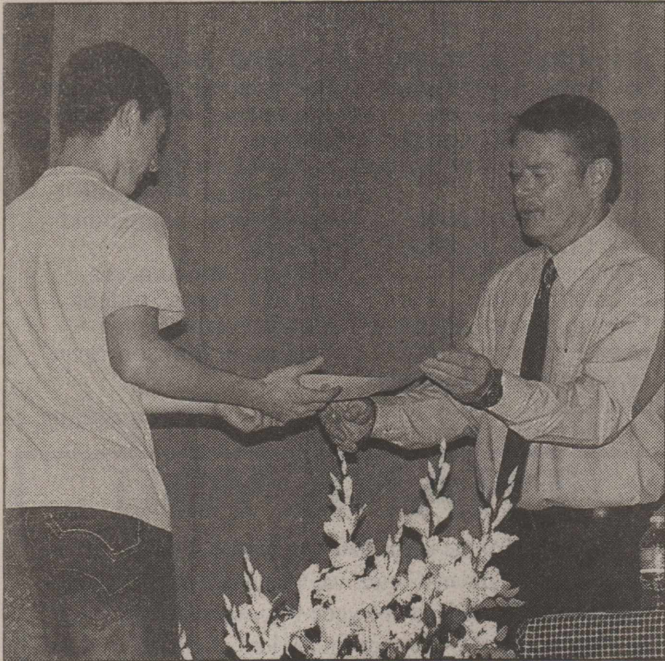

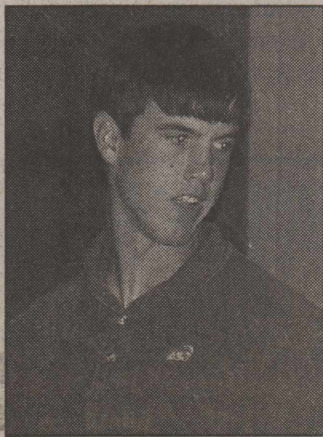

rocket and rockets with fins fireworks; the motion was voted in favor by commissioners Self, Robert Moore and Richard Strube. Commissioner Ronald Presley asked to ban fireworks completely and Judge Barry Hilliard wanted to wait until the next Commissioners Court to check on the weather conditions.

BALLINGER - The Old Cumberland Presbyterian Church was located at Old Runnels, Texas, the first County Seat of Runnels County a few miles north of Ballinger, Texas. Records show that in 1887 to 1893, the church had an enrollment of about 23 members. The Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railway Company conveyed to the Trustees by a Special Warranty Deed to the Old Cumberland Presbyterian Church, a site in Ballinger, Texas November 7, 1899. The original deed was lost and no record in the Deed Records of Runnels County, Texas was ever shown.

The building at Old Runnels was moved on the running gears of two wagons to Ballinger upon receipt of the lot. It was placed just south of the present church edifice on Eighth Street.

An entry into the Deed Records for Runnels County for the purpose of perfecting a title to property to the Trustees of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church of Ballinger, Texas by the President E. P. Ripley and the attestation of its Secretary of the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railway Company November 5, 1909. The document was signed by E. P. Ripley, President, of the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railway Company. The document was filed for record on the 28th day of December, 1909, Cook County, in the State of Illinois.

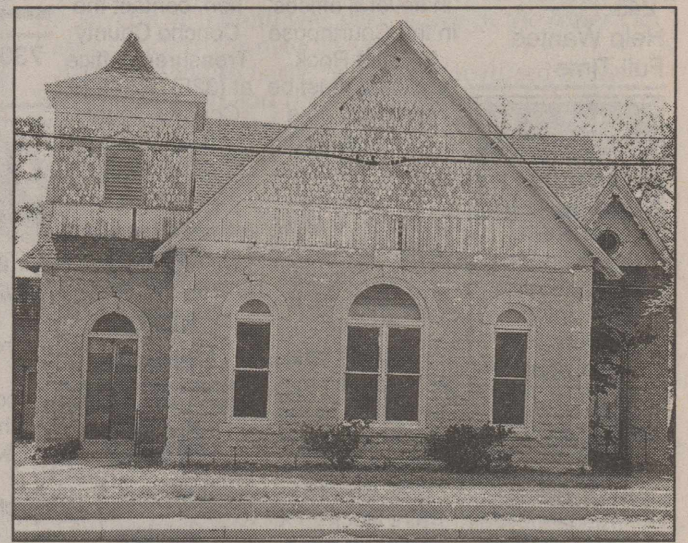

First United Presbyterian Church

This congregation was an organized church before it asked for membership in the Brownwood Presbytery, but there are no records of the date. The earliest Presbytery records show that this Presbytery received a memorial from the Runnels Congregation and was admitted under the care of the Brownwood Presbytery on November 26, 1881. The original church was supplanted by a modern plant on Eighth Street with an attractive manse just to the north of the church building in 1900, and dedicated in 1904. The style was typical of that day-native stone with wooden gables and a bell tower. Records show that the Old Cumberland Church Membership voted in 1906 to return to the Presbyterian Church USA. It is one of the

oldest of the existing church buildings in Runnels County. November 4, 1951, the church observed its 70th anniversary. Some years later, the congregation dissolved, the structure sold, and ownership changed several different times. It is now privately owned.

The Recorded Texas Historical Landmark Medallion was dedicated May 16, 1963 with ceremony. The Landmark Medallion is no longer with the building.
