Candidates file for Republican primary

BALLINGER- The Republican Party has dragged all attention of the candidates interested in participating in the March 2012 Primary for offices in Runnels County.

With the filing deadline set for next Thursday, December 15, all positions open for election have candidates registered in the Republican Party only.

As of press time Runnels County Sheriff Bill Baird will be running for another term and already filed for the Republican Primary, Ken Slimp filed for the position of County Attorney, the position is currently held by Stuart Holden.

The Commissioners Court will be having two positions up for election, in Precinct 1 incumbent Robert Moore filed for reelection and in Precinct 3 Sam Scott filed for the Republican Primary. The position in Precinct 3 is currently held by incumbent James T. Self.

Precinct 1 Constable Wayne Poehls and Precinct 2 Constable Archi Jobe will also be running for reelection.

The Tax Assessor/Collector currently held by Robin Burgess is also open for election, but as of press time nobody had filed for the position.

The Democratic Party had not registered any candidates for the March Primary election in Runnels County.

BALLINGER- Runnels County volunteer fire departments were presented last Tuesday, December 13 with a \$1,000 check for each one of them from AEP Texas. The donation was presented on behalf of the company and the AEP Foundation.

Miles, Rowena, Wingate and Winters volunteer fire department representatives received the checks at the Commissioners Court held at the Runnels County Courthouse. Ballinger Fire Department had already received a \$1,000 donation from a AEP Texas subsidiary.

The donation is part of a \$40,000 contribution from AEP Texas and a \$60,000 contribution from the AEP Foundation to the Texas Wildfire Relief Fund announced during the Texas Midwest Communities Network meeting held on October 19 in Abilene.

AEP Texas has worked with the State Firemen's and Fire Marshals' Association Fire Programs Institute to determine the actual allocation amounts to be distributed to fire departments battling wildfires within the AEP

WHS track to get facelift: Closure expected

WINTERS- On Thursday, December 8, the Winters School Board convened at noon and selected EPIC Construction Company in Abilene to replace the existing track with a new one. After reviewing seven bid proposals and the company scoring process presented by Richard Rogers, president of Cadco Architecture and project consultant, the board unanimously awarded the contract to EPIC.

Besides being the lowest bidder on the track project, EPIC received high marks in meeting the project requirements and having excellent job references.

Over the course of the past two decades since the track was last refurbished, the track surface has developed several sizeable cracks that have progressively increased in number and size mostly due to the instability of the subsurface beneath the matted running surface.

AgriLife aims to teach farmers about iPhones

LUBBOCK- The Texas AgriLife Extension Service is conducting a new project to develop and teach agricultural applications for iPhones and iPads to farmers. Five hands-on workshops, all with the same curriculum, are scheduled from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. in January.

Dates and locations are: Jan. 9, Lamesa, Forrest Park Community Center, South 10th and Houston; Jan. 23, Lubbock, Texas AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 1102 East FM 1294; Jan. 27, Plainview, South Plains College, 1920, West 24th Street; Jan. 30, Amarillo, Texas AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 6500 Amarillo Boulevard; Jan. 31, Dumas, location to be announced.

"Our AgriLife Extension team will train producers to use these apps to more effectively manage risks in their business and improve their financial bottom-line," said Dr. Jackie Smith, AgriLife Extension economist at Lubbock.

"They'll learn to access market data to help evaluate relevant pricing strategies. They'll also improve their knowledge of costs and breakevens by using the Cost of Production app the team developed."

Smith said other apps will relate to crop insurance, marketing plans, optimum irrigation water allocation and various time-saving calculators and other tools.

Each workshop participant will have access to iPads with apps already installed, Smith said. They'll use case studies to improve their price and production risk management skills. Each workshop will be restricted to 30 participants.

Cattle raisers celebrate dust rule exceptions

FORT WORTH- Texas ranchers and landowners scored a win last week, after the U.S. House of Representatives voted in favor of the Farm Dust Regulation Prevention Act (H.R. 1633), introduced by Rep. Kristi Noem (R-S.D.). H.R. 1633 was introduced in response to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) attempt to regulate agriculture dust at naturally occurring levels.

H.R. 1633 exempts agriculture dust if state and local authorities have already implemented dust control measures. In areas where there are no state or local dust control measures, H.R. 1633 requires the EPA to prove substantial health effects and show how addressing those effects outweigh the economic costs of implementing more stringent regulations.

"This legislation is a big win for Texas ranchers and landowners," said Joe Parker Jr., a rancher from Byers, Texas, and Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association (TSCRA) president. "Regulating agriculture dust without any scientific proof that it is harmful to human health would have had devastating economic impacts on the Texas cattle industry."

Although the EPA recently announced that it had no intentions of regulating agriculture dust, Parker says this legislation was necessary to keep the EPA accountable in the future. H.R. 1633 puts in law that there must be sound science to back up such harmful and overreaching regulation.

While particulate matter, or dust, is considered a pollutant under the Clean Air Act, the EPA considered regulating dust at a level twice as stringent as the current level — putting areas primarily located in rural parts of the country where dust naturally occurs on the hook for expensive and unnecessary federal regulation.

The potential revision went so far that the new standard could have been below naturally occurring levels of dust in some states, making it impossible to meet.

The legislation now heads to the U.S. Senate where it has already received bipartisan support from 26 Senators.

The Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association is a 134-year-old trade organization. As the largest and oldest livestock association in Texas, TSCRA represents more than 15,000 beef cattle producers, ranching families and businesses who manage approximately 4 million head of cattle on 75.9 million acres of range and pasture land, primarily in Texas and Oklahoma. TSCRA provides law enforcement and livestock inspection services, legislative and regulatory advocacy, industry news and information among other services.

Track: Unevenness to be corrected

The foundation or base beneath the track's surface contains a layer of cinder and has some unevenness in depth of caliche material — some thin places — which seem to be the main culprits of problem. Excessive shifting and shrinking of the subsoil, due to drought conditions over the past couple of years, have also contributed to the cracks and undulation of the surface.

As it stood before the board approved to upgrade the track, the district could not hold track meets due to the safety concern of runners catching a track or spiked shoe in one of the crevices. Now, the district will have an improved and safer running surface for our community members and students. In addition, our athletic department will be able to sponsor track meets sometime in the near future. EPIC plans to start construction immediately and will start with demolition of the current track surface and subgrade.

"The new track facility will benefit both our students and community members," stated Coach Hermesmyer. Consequently, the track will be closed to the public when renovations begin for four to five months. Under ideal construction conditions, the construction could be complete in a timelier manner.

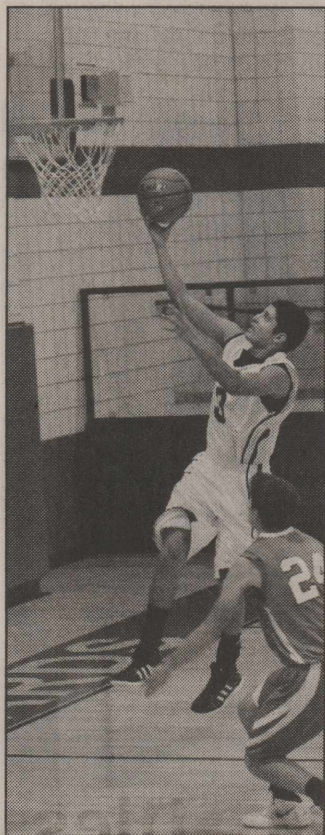

The vehicle was headed to Ballinger to deliver auto parts to local businesses. This wreck was being investigated by Texas Department of Public Safety in Coleman.

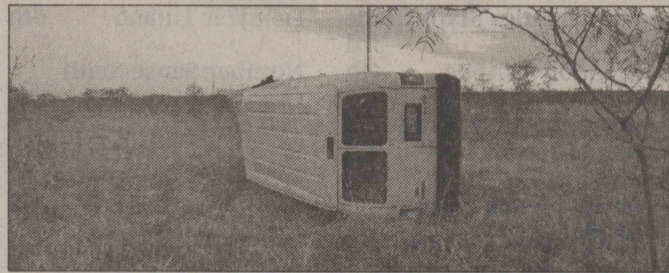

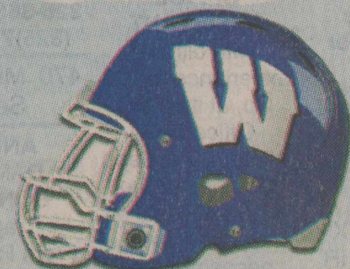
