## Test-firing range now open in Runnels County

Specialized new facility in Winters is the only one in America and third of its kind worldwide

WINTERS- The grand opening of a test-firing range brought the Olympic spirit last week to the City of Winters. Eley, a British manufacturer of Olympic-grade ammunition and a local resident started a partnership with a highly specialized test-firing range. The new facility, located just south of town, is the only one in America and third in the world.

Dan Killough, owner of Killough Shooting Sports, hosted the grand opening of the shooting range, located at 5999 U.S. Highway 83. Some of the guests at the ceremony included the three-time Olympic medalist Matt Emmons, and Jamie Gray, gold medalist in London

Killough, who is also the largest distributor of Eley ammunition in the United States, said he and his wife Dawn had been looking into this project

"There is only three test-firing ranges like this in the world, one of them is in Birmingham, England, the other one in Germany, and this is the latest one," said Killough. "We have been working with Eley for several years in this project."

Killough became an Eley distributor some

five years ago, and before opening the test-firing range the factory had to make considerable investments to get the production up.

Andrew Lane, Eley's Executive Director, said that they are dedicated exclusively to the production of .22 caliber long rifle ammunition, with their main target being the Olympic and competition shooters.

"This is not the kind of ammunition that you find in any given store, it

competition," said Lane. In the new test range the shooter sets up his rifle or pistol under a controlled indoor environment. The gun is set up in a high precision bench to insure that every shot fired from the gun has no other variable than the ammunition. Then the shooter gets to try

different batches of ammunition and the groups are stored in a computer

"All batches of ammunition have slight differences such as the weight of the bullet, powder, crimping of the shell and what we do here is to make sure that we match the ammo with each specific barrel," said Lane.

The range, which is now open to the public by appointment only, can usually get a shooter in in two weeks.

Joining Ol ists Jamie Gray and Matt Emmons in the ceremony were husband-and-wife Olympians Sandra and Eric Uptagrafft as well as shooting legend Lones Wigger, a three-time Olympic medalist.

"I think it's great to have a test-range like this in the United States because it makes things

easier for us," said Emmons.

"It's easier for us to bring our guns to Texas than take them overseas, before we had to take them to England in order to perform the test we now have here," Gray

Since 2000, Eley has been supplying U.S. rifle and pistol teams with select batches of .22-caliber ammunition and testing services. Eley has sponsored Team USA since 2004.

with this ammunition,' said Olympian Eric Uptagrafft. "As a professional in shooting you always want to perform your best, they supply the ammunition for the team and even when you don't have to use it if you don't want to I personally shoot with it, we've had very good results".



## Weather Whys

Q: Can the weather affect how you feel?

A: For certain people, the answer is definitely yes, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University. "Many people have said they can tell a change in the weather is about to happen because their joints or muscles start to ache," says McRoberts. "This is likely due to a change in the barometric pressure, which often happens before a thunderstorm or in advance of a cold front. Damp weather is often associated with a low pressure system. A decrease in the air pressure decreases the tension in some large blood vessels, meaning they tend to expand. When this happens, it tends to lead to increased discomfort in joints and muscles. Also, we know that very rapid changes in temperature and humidity can make some people say they feel 'stiff and achy.' Many people who have arthritis say their joints are definitely affected by weather changes."

## EQIP now open for applications in Runnels Co

WINTERS ENTERPRISE

TEMPLE- Applications for funding opportunities with the **Environmental Quality Incentive** Program (EQIP) are currently being accepted at the NRCS offices located at 2000 Hutchins Ave. Ballinger, Texas, announced **USDA Natural Resources Con**servation Service (NRCS) District Conservationist Kathy Saunders

NRCS in Texas has received its initial allocation of EQIP funding in 2013 and will begin ranking and obligating EQIP contracts after February 15. All agriculture producers interested in submitting a contract application for 2013 should do so before this ranking deadline.

EQIP — one of the largest programs in the Farm Bill — is a voluntary conservation program that promotes environmental quality and assists producers to meet local, state and federal regulations.

"EQIP is a valuable tool to help Runnels County's agricultural producers implement conservation practices that provide environmental benefits to help sustain agricultural operations," Saunders said.

EQIP is a continuous sign-up program that allows landowners or operators to apply for financial and technical assistance for the application of specific conservation practices; but the deadline for the first 2013 funding is February 15, 2013. Contracts are offered periodically depending on budgetary allocations. Applications made after the deadline will be considered in the next funding cycle. Higher priority will be given to those applications that address national, state and local priorities and provide higher cost efficiency.

EQIP offers technical and financial help to install or implement structural, vegetative, and management practices that can benefit the soil, water, air, plants, livestock, and wildlife. Each county in the state is funded yearly to assist producers financially with these land

management practices. Last year, NRCS in Texas funded over 4,000 EQIP contracts with \$76 million to accomplish conservation practices such as irrigation efficiency, minimum tillage, brush management and more on 2.1 million acres across the entire

state. In addition to helping our environment, Farm Bill conservation program funds support rural communities. In Texas, it is estimated that each dollar of NRCS and private matching expenditures on NRCS conservation programs generates an additional \$2.54 in sales of goods and services.


The clinic and home health facilities were recently relocated to the former Selkirk office building, located on State Highway 153 one half of a mile west of the intersection with U.S. Highway 83.


The idea is an outgrowth of the committee that made application for a historical marker for the Chick Inn. The







#### Veteran's Corner

The Disabled American Veterans (DAV) has indicated through prior legislative bulletins, beginning in January 2013, the enforcement mechanisms contained in Public Law 112-25 will trigger automatic across-the-board cuts in federal departments and agencies resulting in \$1.2 trillion reduction in federal spending over the next ten years, unless Congress passes legislation to change the law. Based on the DAV's interpretation of Public Law 112-25 and prior budget laws, and after consultation with outside budget experts, they believe that VA health care and benefits programs will be exempt from any automatic budget cuts. For months, members of Congress, the General Accountability Office, and national veterans organizations, including DAV, have called on the Administration to render an opinion to confirm that mandatory, across-the-board sequestration of federal appropriations will not be applied to any accounts of the VA.
