C-City standoff ends in three arrests

ABILENE - The Texas Department of Public Safety, assisted by local law enforcement agencies, arrested three men early Tuesday morning, January 22, in Colorado City after a nearly 10-hour standoff. The men are accused of being involved in an incident Monday where shots were fired at a Texas Highway Patrol trooper during a high-speed pursuit.

"We are pleased this volatile situation ended without injury or loss of life," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "In addition to the fine work by department personnel, we would like to thank all of our law enforcement partners for their assistance in bringing this incident to a safe and successful conclusion."

Two suspects from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, were transported to the Mitchell County Jail and a 16-year-old boy from Edmondson, Oklahoma, was transported to the juvenile facility in Taylor County. Myron McDonald Jr., 22, is being held on charges of attempted capital murder, felon in possession of a firearm and evading arrest. Christopher Deshawn Johnson, 24, is being held on charges of attempted capital murder and felon in possession of a firearm. Charges are pending against the juvenile suspect.

The incident started early Monday morning when a DPS trooper pulled over a vehicle for driving 109 mph on I-20 in Mitchell County. As the trooper approached the SUV, the driver exited and fired three times at the trooper. The suspect re-entered the vehicle and fled eastbound at speeds exceeding 100 mph. Shots were fired several times at the trooper during the pursuit. Visual of the vehicle was lost briefly, and it was later found abandoned near I-20 on FM 1230 in Nolan County.

Later Monday, authorities received information that the suspects were at the 100 block of South Austin Street in Colorado City, and law enforcement surrounded the residence. Nearly 10 hours later, just after midnight Tuesday, DPS SWAT entered the building and took the men into custody without incident.

The Texas Rangers are investigating the incident and their findings will be presented to the Mitchell County District Attorney's Office.

Keeping track of the past

BALLINGER - The Runnels County Historical Commission presented its annual report last Tuesday morning, January 22, 2013, at the Runnels County Commissioners Court held at the County Courthouse, in Ballinger.

"We want to express out appreciation to Runnels County Judge Berry Hilliard and commissioners Bobby Moore, Ronald Presley, retiring commissioner, Thurman Self, commissioner Ricky Strube and incoming commissioner Sam Scott for their support and assistance," said Historical Commission Treasurer Anthony Lange.

During 2012 the commission had six meetings with a quorum at each meeting and also celebrated their Annual Christmas Party at the home of Bobbie Campbell in December. The commission participated in the Runnels County Sheriff's Toy Drive

buying and donating toys for the area children.

"We worked with the two cemetery associations to get Historic Texas Cemetery designations for the cemeteries of Crews for 2012, and Pumphrey for 2013." The dedication ceremonies for these two will be held in the near future.

This brings our total of Historic Texas Cemeteries to five: Walthall, Hoffman, Lutheran, Crews and Pumphrey.

The Historical Commission is also working with the Old Runnels Cemetery Association to secure a designation.

The commission is also working with a group in Winters to acquire an historical marker for the Chick-Inn Diner site near Winters. Status of the application soon is expected for the month of January, 2013.

The commission has researched records and found what was known as the Ballinger Cemetery.

The cemetery is no longer in existence. It was the first cemetery in Ballinger. The Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railroad gave 10 acres about 1886, but the land was not suitable for burials.

During 2012, the commission's historical marker histories were updated and published weekly in The Winters Enterprise and The Ballinger Ledger. The Commission voted to publish these in a book along with the Recorded Texas Historic Landmark Buildings' histories that were published in the papers in 2011.

A "Windshield Survey" is currently being held by members of the commission. They are documenting the businesses on each street, taking pictures and researching the history back as far as they can find information.

History Programs have been presented to the Ballinger Lions Club, the Winters Lions Club and the Winters Independent

School District.

The commission celebrated its 50th birthday on August 27-August 31, 2012. The week was designated as Runnels County Historical Commission Week by Judge Barry Hilliard and Commissioners Court.

The Commission began 2012 with 16 appointees and during the year 6 more were added. At this time the commission has a total of 19 appointees certified with Open Meetings Training with three currently taking the training.

The Runnels County Historical Commission has six scheduled meetings in 2013. January 12, 2013 was the first meeting. Officers were elected to serve the next two-year term are: Chairperson, Ruth Cooper; Vice-Chairperson, Retired County Judge Marilyn Egan; Secretary, Alton O'Neal; Treasurer, Anthony Lange, and Reporter, Betty Thomason.

Runnels County Judge Barry Hilliard and county officials received a U.S. flag and a Texas flag donated by a company from San Angelo last Tuesday, January 22, 2013. The flags will be replacement flags to be flown at the courthouse when the current ones are no longer useful.

Civilian Conservation Corps exhibit to show at Bob Bullock Museum

AUSTIN- The Civilian Conservation Corps, once dubbed the "Tree Army" by president Franklin D. Roosevelt, will be on display as part of a special exhibition Feb. 1-June 30 on the third floor of the Bob Bullock State History Museum, located downtown.

The exhibit will display photographs, maps, postcards, original CCC-fabricated furniture and decorative arts, and even original enrollee booklets, camp newsletters and personal mementos from CCC camps that were located throughout parks in Texas. All items available for viewing date back to the 1930s and 1940s, and highlight the mission of this unique and historic federal government program.

"We're excited to see the spotlight put on the CCC at a high-profile destination like the Bullock Museum," said Joanne Avant, chief curator with Texas Parks and Wildlife. "The CCC has such an interesting story to tell, and, through their hard work almost 80 years ago is still a relevant part of the visitor experience at state parks all over Texas."

As part of F.D.R.'s New Deal package to address the nation's economic struggles from the Great Depression, the CCC helped build roads, lodges, bridges, trails, cabins, recreation halls, and many other infrastructure projects at hundreds of state, local and national parks across the U.S. Texas, currently operates 29 CCC-built state parks, which were constructed during the 1930s and early 1940s and formed the core of today's 95-unit-strong state park system.

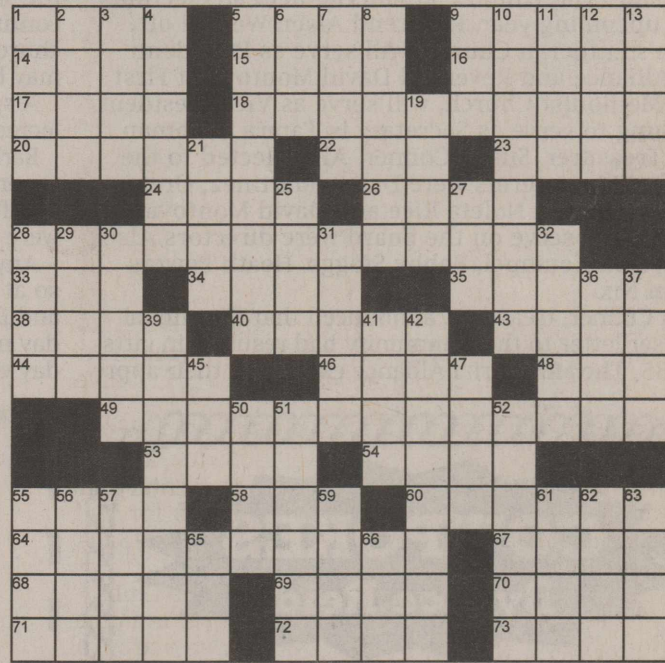

Weather Whys

Q: What exactly is a hard freeze?

A: Freezes are classified according to their severity explains Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University. "In general terms, a hard freeze occurs when the air temperature is 26 degrees or lower for at least four hours. It usually means that many types of plants and most seasonal vegetation will be destroyed."

Q: What are the other types of freezes?

A: A light freeze occurs when the temperature gets between 29 to 32 degrees, and this kind of freeze can kill tender plants but not harm others, McRoberts adds. "A moderate freeze occurs at 25 to 28 degrees and this can destroy most types of vegetation, especially fruit plants. All freezes are tough on plants, but a hard freeze is the worst. It is often called a 'killing freeze' because it kills most of the plants affected."

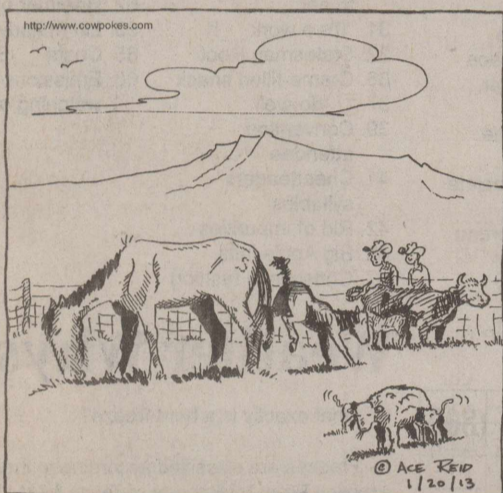

TASB, TASA release teacher salary survey

AUSTIN- Budgets for teacher pay raises are slightly up for 2012-13 according to the Salaries and Wages in Texas Public Schools Report recently released by the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) and Texas Association of School Administrators (TASA). Less than 20 percent of districts froze teacher salaries this year,

compared to nearly half of participating districts last year.

While more Texas teachers received a raise this year, the average teacher salary remained relatively flat. Teachers earn an average salary of \$49,139, a change of about 1.6 percent over the average salary of \$48,375 in 2011-12.

District concerns about school funding shortfalls

have been reflected in teacher pay raises for the past three years. The average pay raise for 2012-13 was 2.3 percent, up slightly from last year's average of 2 percent, which was the smallest raise in more than 10 years. In the past three years, pay raises averaged 2.2 percent, a significant drop from the nearly 4 percent average between 2000-01 and 2009-10.

Historical Commission presents the history of Norton

WINTERS- On Saturday, January 12, 2013 the Runnels County Historical Commission met at Casa Cabana Restaurant, in Winters, Texas. Anthony Lange presented an interesting and informative program on the history of Norton.

In his report, Anthony said George Washington Norton of Kentucky was visiting H. D. Pearce of Runnels City when he first laid eyes on the land between Valley and Oak Creek. Mr. Norton liked the vision before him and later purchased a large tract of land there.

The community of Norton was formed along with the first post office in 1894, but Mr. Norton passed away before he saw the streets laid out in the town bearing his name. The settlers came and in 1901 the first store opened followed by other businesses, a school, homes and later a cotton gin.

Anthony also mentioned that Mr. Norton, born in Russellville, Kentucky in 1814, was listed on the census as a merchant and his worth was estimated at \$150,000 in 1860. That calculates to over \$4 million in today's market.


George Washington Norton died in 1889. His will is included in the deed records in the Runnels County Courthouse where he requests a monument of not more than \$5,000 be erected at his Cave Hill Cemetery plot in Louisville, Kentucky upon his death. Norton's monument at Cave Hill is a magnificent structure and well-worth a visit to see.

In all, 20 members were present at the RCHC meeting and one visitor, Allan Evans, of Norton. New officers for the 2013-2015 tenure were elected which included Ruth Cooper, Chairman; Marilyn Egan, Vice-President; Alton O'Neal, Secretary; Anthony Lange, Treasurer, and Betty Thomason, Reporter.

The article given by Anthony Lange on Norton is from the story "The History of Norton, The Town and the Man" by Anthony Lange and appeared in the Edwards Plateau Historical Association Publication, The Historian.


Next meeting will be March 9, 2013 at Casa Cabana. Harold Jobs from Burnett County will present a program about "The Barbed Wire Wars Between Runnels and Surrounding Counties."

All meetings are open to the public.
