Runnels SWCD to hold annual fish stocking program thru April 26

WINTERS- Runnels Soil and Water Conservation District is holding it's annual fish stocking or restocking of ponds this year.

The program will continue through April 26, 2013 with delivery of the fish on May 1, 2013 at the Natural Resources Conservation Service office at 2000 Hutchings Avenue in Ballinger. Available species are channel catfish, largemouth bass, bluegill sunfish, red ear perch, crappie, minnows (fathead or shiner), and sterile grass carp (available with TPWD permit).

Bags, air and water necessary to transport your fish to their destination will be furnished.

BALLINGER- Considering the lack of rain and windy conditions in Runnels County, the Commissioners \* Court voted to continue the burn ban currently in effect in Runnels County. Commissioners Court held a regular meeting last Tuesday, March 26, 2013 at the Commissioners Courtroom.

All outdoor burning is currently prohibited in the unincorporated areas of Runnels County. Burning is still allowed under certain conditions but it should be done with all necessary precautions and in compliance with the burn ban.

In the hour-and-a-half meeting commissioners also passed a motion made by Commissioner Robert Moore and seconded by Commissioner Sam Scott to approve the replacement of six county bridges by the Texas Department of Transportation.

Certified as an "Economically Disadvantaged County," Runnels County is required to fund 3 percent of the replacement cost of all six bridges. The bridges are located at County Road 272 over Valley Creek, County Road 301 over Valley Creek, County Road 114 over Pony Creek, County Road 128 over Mustang Creek, County Road 234 over Fuzzy Creek, and County Road 216 over Oak Creek.

Commissioners received and opened bids for emulsified asphalt to be used in the repair and maintenance of county roads and bridges. Those presenting bids were Heartland Asphalt from Hurst, Texas; Ergon Asphalt, of Austin, Texas; Cleveland Asphalt, of Shepherd, Texas, and Western Emulsions, of Lubbock, Texas.

Commissioners voted to accept the bid presented by

Ergon Asphalt.
On another agenda item, the Commissioners Court discussed and voted to challenge the appraised values placed on several county owned properties by the

Texas Association of Counties for insurance purposes. Commissioners are also discussing to go out for bids or proposals from different insurance companies in order to get a more competitive option than the one presented by TAC.

Commissioners approved a 5-year lease purchase agreement submitted by Precinct 2 Commissioner Ronald Presley, to acquire a Kubota tractor equipped with an A-boom attached shredder. The price of the unit (\$108,647.68) will be paid in five annual installments with an option to buy the tractor for \$1 at the end of the lease. The unit will be purchased to New Holland of Abilene, Texas.

Andi sacrificed much of her personal time to care for her aging parents and other family members when they needed help. She was always available to give encouragement and advice, and she inspired many of her family members to pursue a career in nursing.

Andi was a believer in Christ and was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church in Winters.

She was preceded in death by one son, Darold Joe Smith, and her parents.

conference to be held in Snyder

SNYDER- The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service will conduct the annual multi-county Lower Rolling Plains Agricultural Conference from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on April 3 at the Scurry Coliseum, 900 E. Coliseum Drive in Snyder.

"The conference updates our region's producers on many of the major issues they may face during the upcoming growing season," said Zach Wilcox, AgriLife Extension agent in Nolan County.

"The topics will range from cotton economics to guar and sesame production," he said. "As has become our tradition, AgriLife Extension agents in the participating counties have made every effort to pinpoint information our producers really need. And while much of the information is very important here, a lot of it can be applied

anywhere in the state." Topics during the morning's general session will include: cotton and grain economics, laws and regulations,

and the weather-cycle outlook. Following a catered lunch, the program will split into concurrent A and B sessions.

Session A presentations will be: Weed Management Strategies for 2013 and the Importance of Water Quality on Herbicide Efficacy; Deep Sampling of Nitrogen and Cotton Variety Trial Results; Guar and Sesame Production, and an Integrated Pest Management Update.

Session B presentations will include: Cow Herd Management; Overview of Research at the Rolling Plains Quail Research Ranch; Weed and Brush Control in Range and Pastures; Bermuda Grass Production and Sand Burr Control and Cattle Health Management.

The trails of life marked by obstacles of many kinds - rarely intersect with bunny trails of blue sky songs and joyous egg hunts.

They draw closer, however, when a youngster sees few limits and imbues others along the trail with a "yes we can" attitude. That's the essence of Haley Whatley, 18-year-old senior tennis star at Birdville High School in North Richland Hills, Texas.

For 13 years, she's been the driving force to provide new stuffed animals for Cook Children's Medical Center in Fort Worth. They've collected some 29,000 animals each one buoying spirits and providing blessed assurance that the young patients are not alone....

Her dream began at age four, when her heart was touched by a TV appeal from St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee. She had numerous questions for her parents, Gary and Elizabeth Whatley, and upon their move to the Metroplex a year later, a tour of Cook Children's Medical Center further amazed.

Haley was particularly taken by the "prayer bear room" provided by pastoral care efforts of churches and businesses.

Her mind was spinning, this soon-to-be kindergartener at Fort Worth Christian School. She was puzzled that the room

had no bunnies — animals she viewed in tandem with Easter, her favorite holiday....

Learning that patients received bears year-around — even at Easter she asked if she

could bring stuffed rabbits for the next Easter.

Her mom gulped, knowing that her five-year-old's mind was not completely wrapped around the enormity of her promise. After all, there were 186 beds, each with a patient, some with wavering hope.

The program was "gotten on with." Friends at church and school responded, signs were posted and collection boxes set up. They missed their goal by miles. Instead of 186 stuffed animals, 1,400 — mostly bunnies were donated! The annual project was born....

## Weather Whys

Q: What's the coldest it's ever been in Texas? A: Texas is no stranger to below zero temperatures

says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M University. "There have been numerous times in the last 100 years when parts of the state have been below zero," he explains. "But one day stands out among all others. On Feb. 8, 1933, the temperature was -23 degrees in Seminole to set the state's all-time low. It should be noted that the elevation of Seminole is over 3,200 feet, which is no doubt one reason the temperature that day was a

Q: What about surrounding states? A: In Arkansas, the all-time low temperature is -29 degrees (1905), while in Oklahoma the record low is -27 (1930). "In Louisiana, the all-time low is -16 degrees (1899), and in New Mexico, it gets a lot colder than most people think," McRoberts adds. "In 1950 in the town of Gavilan, the temperature reached -50 degrees."

**WINTERS- Runnels County** was now 22-years-of-age and a legal entity with a county seat. The town of Runnels City was growing and advertisements described it as a place where people from near and far were pouring in. The advertisements described the grassland and plentiful game along with beautiful scenery.

The Honorable Commissioners' Court of Runnels County met on the 10th day of May, 1880. Present were the Honorable Sylvester Adams, County Judge presiding. Also present were Commissioners Wm. Guest, Precinct 1, W.G. Preston, Precinct 2, J.D. Yarbro, Precinct 3, P.S. Turner, Precinct 4, J.W. Formwalt, Sheriff and W.N. Copeland, County Clerk. This was a regular term and the following orders were set out. By order of the court, a Poll Tax would be levied at 1 dollar for male persons between the age of 21 and 60-years-of-age. By order of the court, a county tax for the general county fund was fixed at half the amount of the State Tax which would be one-fourth of 1 percent. By order, a special tax was fixed for public buildings at onefourth of 1 percent. By order, the court levied the County Occupation Tax not otherwise

provided for by law.

By order of the court, the County Treasurer be authorized to pay to W. N. Copeland upon warrant issued, \$12.05, per freight paid out to him for Freight on Books, Coggins Park and Hightower and Stationary he had bought. Court adjourned until Tuesday May 11,

1880 until 9 o'clock a.m. The Honorable Court met according to appointment May 11th, 1880. Present as of yesterday with the exception, Commissioner Guest, Precinct 1. By first order of the day, the authorization for County Judge upon the sale of the lots in Runnels City, that titles be made in the name of Runnels County, Texas. It was further ordered the County Judge retain out of the proceeds, 10 percent as compensation for services with the county paying expenses in making and acknowledging deeds. The court ordered S. N. Taylor, the County Attorney authorized to go to the City of Austin, Texas and procure the library to which the county is entitled to by an act of the legislature of 1848, Feb. 1850, May 1846, also 14 revised statutes of 1879. The order also included instructions to S.N. Taylor to the State Comptroller or Treasurer in the City of Austin for \$20 for the money to be placed to the credit of Runnels County to defray his expenses. An order also to Mr. S.W. Bourne, the County Treasurer to give Mr. S.N. Taylor an order to the State Comptroller or Treasurer of the State in the City of Austin for the amount placed to the credit of Runnels County in the City of Austin less the \$20 for Mr. S.N. Taylor for expenses in a check on some national bank. An order to Mr. S.N. Taylor for the Assessor's abstracts in the amount of \$66.10 to be remitted in the City of Austin for Geo. D. Barnard of St. Louis, Mo. An order gave the Honorable Sylvester Adams a leave

of absence for 20 days.

The court employed Mr. Wm. Jackson to sink a well on the public square in the town of Runnels City, Runnels County, Texas at the rate of \$1.50 per foot in dirt. Mr. Jackson would bear all expenses digging and walling and for blasting rock, \$2.50 per foot with the county furnishing powder and fuse. Other business, the County Attorney gave notice to Mr. A.G. Wills that the district surveyor of Bexar District would not recognize the transcript he had sold to Runnels County as being legal.

The Clerk of Runnels County gave notice to Mr. H.C. Wylie, Sheriff John W. Formwalt and Jno. Turner the instructions to view and mark out a road from Runnels City, the County Seat in the direction of Fort Concho to the County Line in a practical route and report to the next term of the Court. The County Clerk gave notice to Messrs. G. W. Preston, Jno. Barfoot and Samual Brown to view and mark out from the County Seat of Runnels County in the direction of Buffalo Gap to the Runnels County line. It would be laid out in the most direct and practical route and report at the next term of the court. The County Clerk gave notice to Messrs. Geo. Clayton, H.D. Pearce and Z.C. Taylor to view and mark out a road from the County Seat of Runnels City in the direction of Coleman City to the county line of Runnels County. They needed to lay it out in the most direct and practical route and report

to the next term of the court. The Clerk gave notice to Messers. J.S. Cotton, A.J. Prater Jan. 13, March 17, 1883.

and James Carpenter to view and mark out a road from Runnels City, the county seat in the direction of Paint Rock. It would be laid out in the most direct and practical route to the county line and report to the next term of the court.

An order was given that the county surveyor procure or have procured from Travis and Bexar District all files and notes from December 4, 1879 and present his accounts to the court. The order was handed down to pay the County Surveyor for his services of laying out the county seat, a total of \$40. Also ordered, that the commissioners be paid for their services.

There being no other business, the court adjourned until Monday June 9, 9 a.m. A. D. 1880. Signed County Judge Sylvester Adams, W. M. Copeland, County Clerk Court, Runnels County, Texas.

Runnels City was changing from the primitive wild west ern town to a little commercial town. The obvious became known — such a busy little town — needed a jail, or at least a calaboose, although the newspaper editor noted "there were no bad residents in the county seat".

Laura Bowden known as "the booth lady" has been instrumental in obtaining grants from the San Angelo Area Foundation and the Spirit of Eden Foundation to pay for removations an McCulloch II along with Blackwell has put in many hours of volunteer labor installing new electrical service.

"This wouldn't be possible without everyone working together and the support of the community and City", said McCulloch. The City of Eden Public Works crew, backed by the Mayor and City Council, took on the arduous task of clearing out the first building, cleaning up the grounds, installing the wall bracing as well as building the new stage area.




