If you minority, the Texas Coalition for Safety Belts hopes you'll give your belt a try during 18-25.
Governor Bill Clements has issued a proclamation and many Texas towns will be conducting saftey belt awareness campaigns. The coalition whasis on the proper use of car seats for smal children and on belt use by high school and college

The week before Memor ial Day is always a good time to promote safety belt use,' president of Texas Safety Association and a spokesperson for the coalition. "'the holiday weekend marks the
