If that figure-estimated by the National Society for the Preven tion of Blindness-holds true for ant population segements through four Texans are being visited by sightlessness every day
Even as you read this, some man woman or child is standing on the brink of a life of permanent darkess, about to join the $300,000 \mathrm{Am}$ ericans who are already endurin
the bleak enormity of blindness. More than 14,000 of the 300,000 Americans currently blind are Texans, according to official estimates. What causes bindness? There are three major contributing facBlindness accidents, neglect. Blindness brought on through
neglect really is no worse than that caused by an accidente or disease But samehow it seems worse. It's so unnecessary.
If all children were given a thorough. eye examination prior to entering school for the first time, and
if all visual defects were corrected or placed under treatment at that time, and if all visual defects were corrected or placed under treat ment at that time, a major step in the prevention of blindness in child but
enough. A child grows quickly. His eyes, like every other body organ, are constantly changing. Some times the change is a defect.
At least half of all cases of ness occurring from year to year ness occurring from year to year
could be prevented through the use of the sight-saving knowledge at hand. For example, some 300, 000 industrial accidents occur each
year, 1500 of them resulting in year, 1500 of them resulting in
permanent blindness. The mere use of goggles would cut these figures to negligible proportions. As far as
ness is concerned, modern surgical methods now restore or - improve the leading cause of blindness in the United States.
When parents or teachers observe child holding reading matter clo er than the normal 14 matter clohis face, tillting his head while reading, or constantly blinking, all esponsible health authorities agree should be interpreted as a sigu f impending eye trouble.
Other conditions which may indicate eye trouble are crossed eyes,
frequent styes and headaches, redrequent styes and headaches, red
immed or encrusted eyelide, or perimmed or encrusted eyelide, or p.
istent watering of either eye.
